



Valid Noon to 9 PM Sunday 5/4




Far southwest New Mexico





Large hail and damaging winds are the primary hazards expected with any storms that go severe, but cannot rule out the possibility of a tornado. Be sure to have multiple ways to receive weather warnings to protect yourself.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


