# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Thursday, May 08, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Slight risk (level 2 of 5) today in SW/STX with damaging winds and large hail the main threats.
- Flash Flooding: Slight risk (level 2 of 4) over STX today with a marginal risk (level 1 of 4) over SE LA tomorrow and Saturday.
- River Flooding: Minor/moderate river flooding in LA,AR and N/ETX will be lasting over the next few weeks.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Minor to moderate river flooding across LA, N/E TX and AR will impact croplands and secondary roads.




Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for flash flooding in STX.

Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms in SW/STX with large hail and damaging winds the main threats.




#### Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






