





- If heavy rain from thunderstorms develop, we could see some localized flooding after our recent few days of rain with saturated grounds

Severe weather is **not** anticipated with this activity.


Afternoon high temperatures will be generally in the mid to upper 70s. Lows near 60°.









Keetch-Byram Drought Index


