

## Severe Weather Outlook Monday, May 19, 2025






Level 2 of 5: SE OK, SW AR, NE TX, N LA

Late Afternoon and Evening, dissipating after Midnight

Highest Risk for Severe Storms near and northwest of I-30.

Potential Hazards:

- A brief tornado cannot be ruled out
- Damaging wind gusts of 60+ MPH
- Large hail of quarter size or larger



Widespread severe weather is forecast, especially across central and eastern Oklahoma, on Monday afternoon and evening. Very large hail, significant damaging wind gusts and tornadoes are all possible.

There will be a threat for strong to severe thunderstorms late this afternoon but especially during the evening hours across at least the northwest half of the Four State Region.

Probability of severe weather within 25 mi of a point up to 14% or between 5 and 15 times greater than a non-risk weather day.

## Severe Threat Continues This Afternoon

The threat for severe weather will continue today, especially east of I-35 and north of I-20 late this afternoon and evening.

### Morning Showers and Storms:

- Between 6am and Noon
- Small hail and gusty winds possible
- Coverage: 20-40%

### Afternoon Severe Threat:

- Mainly between 3pm and 11pm
- Hail, damaging winds, and a few tornadoes
- Coverage: 40-60%

There is a Marginal Risk (1 of 5) for severe weather on Tuesday (May 20th) evening. This far out details remain sparse but we will continue to update the forecast as we get closer to the event.

Additional severe storms are expected this afternoon and evening, especially across portions of North Texas. Isolated rain showers and a few storms are possible during the morning and early afternoon, but this activity would be unlikely to become severe. The main window of concern for severe weather is roughly from 3pm to 11pm, and the main risk area is roughly from the DFW Metroplex north and east. All modes of severe weather including large hail, damaging winds, and a few tornadoes are possible into the late evening hours.

**i** Thunderstorms development will remain highly dependent on where the dryline sets up and advances today. Once storms do develop, they will generally move E to NE, increasing the overall risk of seeing strong to severe thunderstorms across our northern and eastern counties.

Another round of strong to severe thunderstorms are possible later this afternoon through tonight. Storms that do become severe may be capable of producing large hail, damaging winds, frequent lightning, and an isolated tornado.


