Low storm chances will return across portions of North Texas through tomorrow afternoon.




The exact strength of the cap will make storm development uncertain.





Thursday's Severe Thunderstorm Outlook

Highest Local Risk: **Marginal** (Risk Level 1 out of 5)



Scattered thunderstorms will likely develop along the dryline, which will be located over the Permian Basin, on Thursday afternoon. Storms will move eastward through the evening and could form into a line during the evening.







Keetch-Byram Drought Index


