

Sunday's Severe Thunderstorm Outlook SEVERE

Highest Local Risk: **Enhanced** (Risk Level 3 out of 5)

1 MARGINAL Storms limited in duration, coverage, &/or intensity

2 SLIGHT Short-lived &/or isolated intense storms possible

3 ENHANCED Persistent &/or widespread. Multiple intense storms

4 MODERATE Long-lived, widespread, and intense storms

5 HIGH Long-lived, widespread, and very intense storms

Strong to severe storms are expected to develop this evening to our west/northwest before moving into our area. Highest chances for storms tonight will be in the Big Country.




Warm Conditions remain, with Afternoon Rain Chances




