FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Monday, June 02, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Storms:</u> Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for W OK,TX/OK Panhandles today; Slight risk tomorrow for OK, N/CTX. Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) in E NM on Wednesday. Back to a Slight risk for W OK, TX/OK Panhandles Thursday.
- <u>Flash Flooding</u>: Continuing to monitor burn scars in N/C New Mexico for burn scar flash flooding for the next few days. Across the Southern Plains, several rounds of heavy rainfall may lead to flash flooding Tuesday through Sunday.
- Heat: Temperatures will feel like 110-115 degrees in STX this weekend, and likely next Monday.

• Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues this week. Rainfall in the Southern Plains later this week may lead to river rises in OK, AR, and TX.

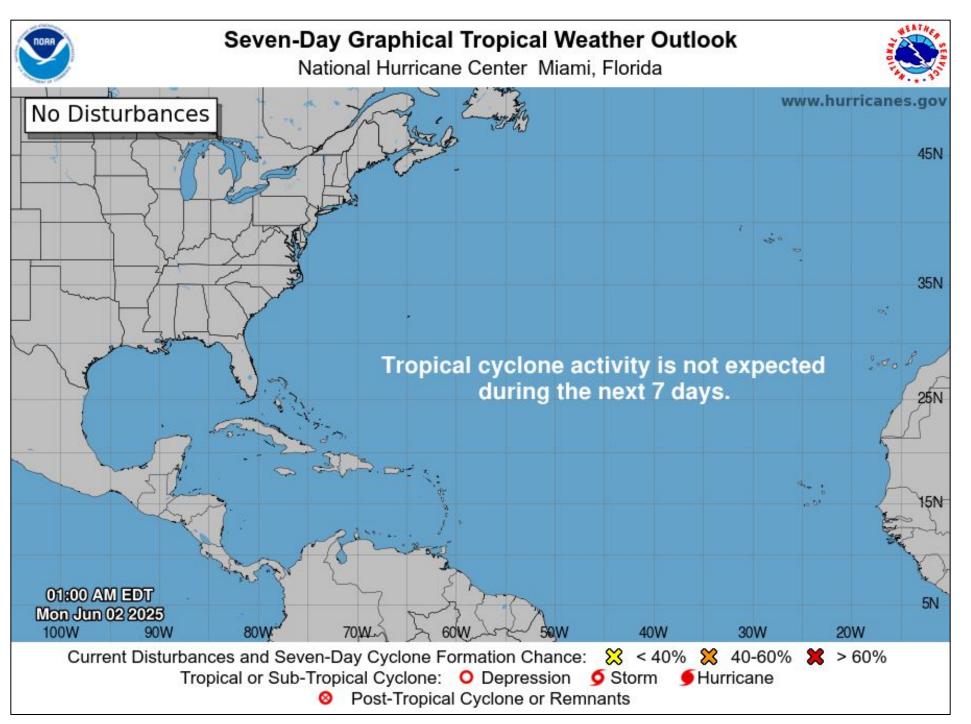

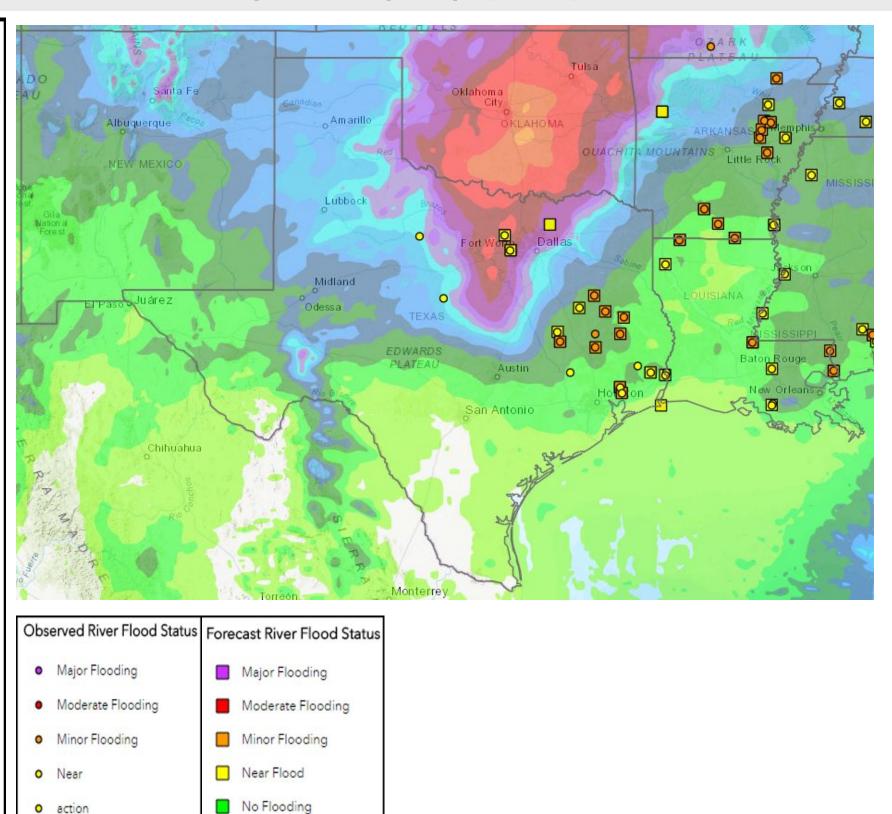

Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues this week. Rainfall in the Southern Plains later this week may lead to river rises in OK, AR, and TX.

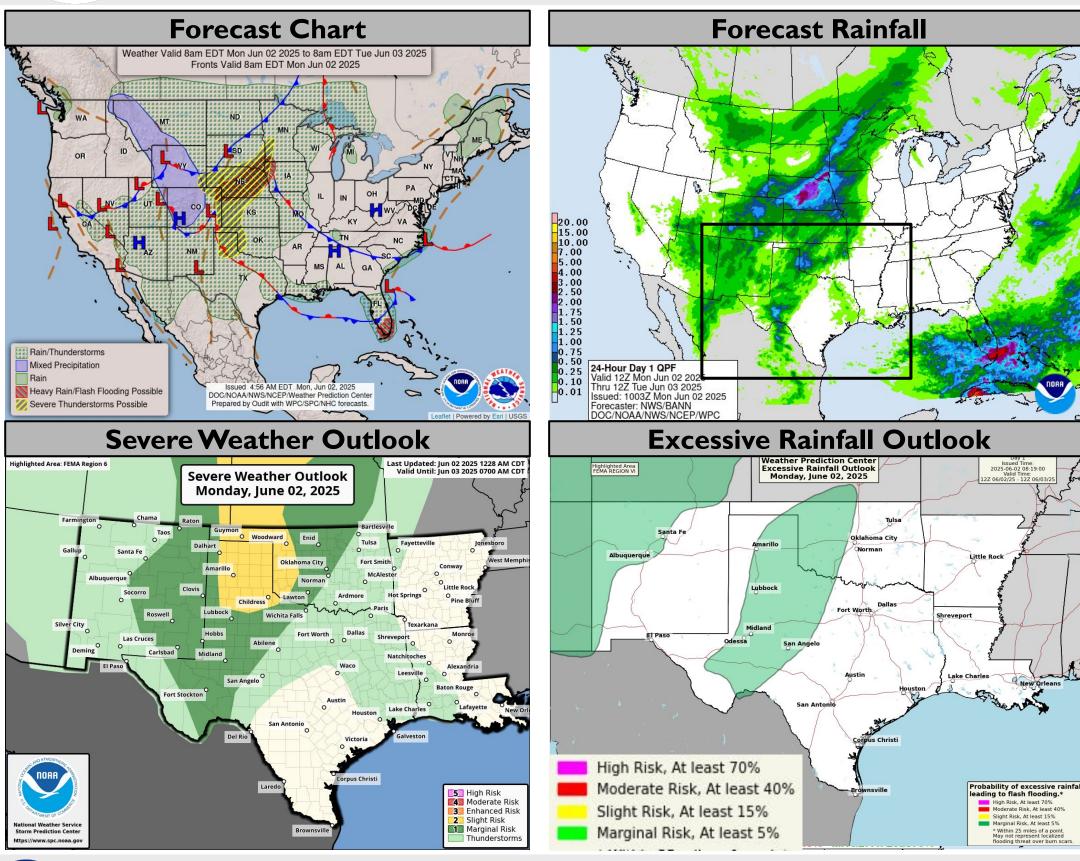

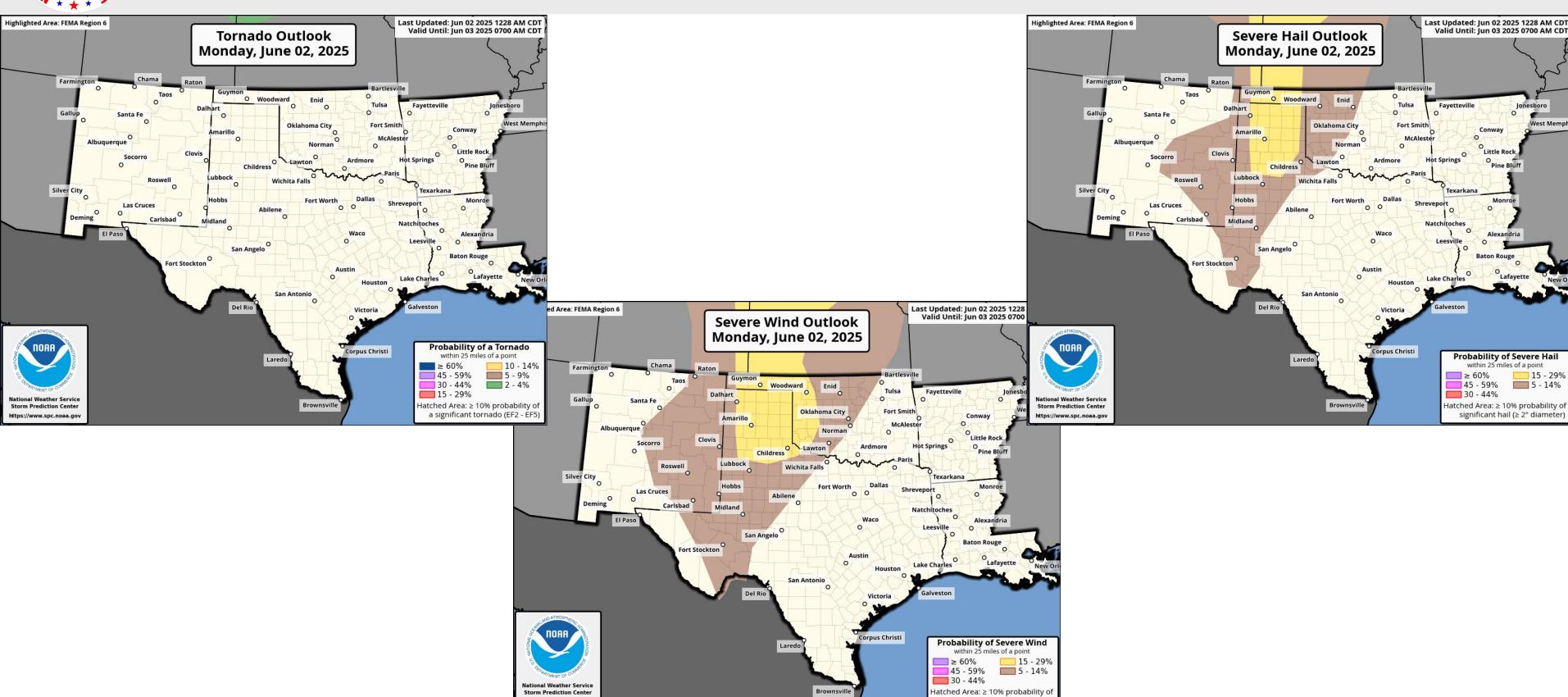

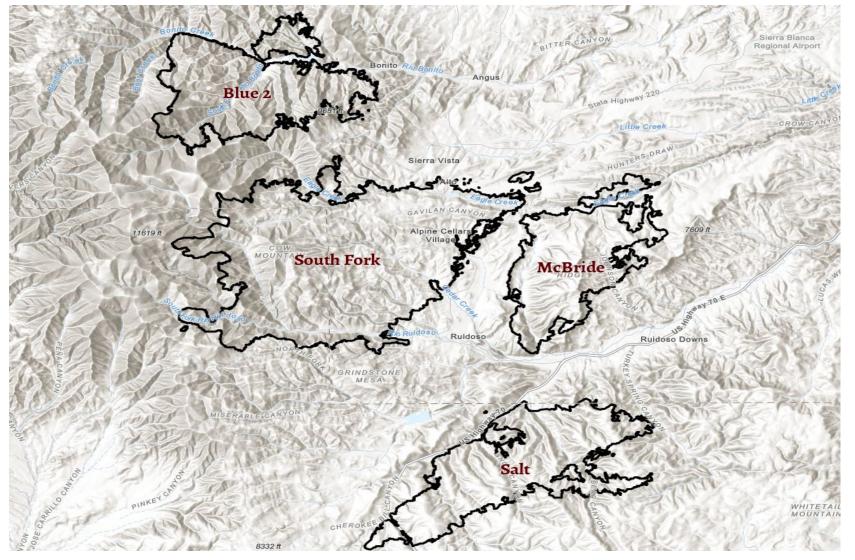

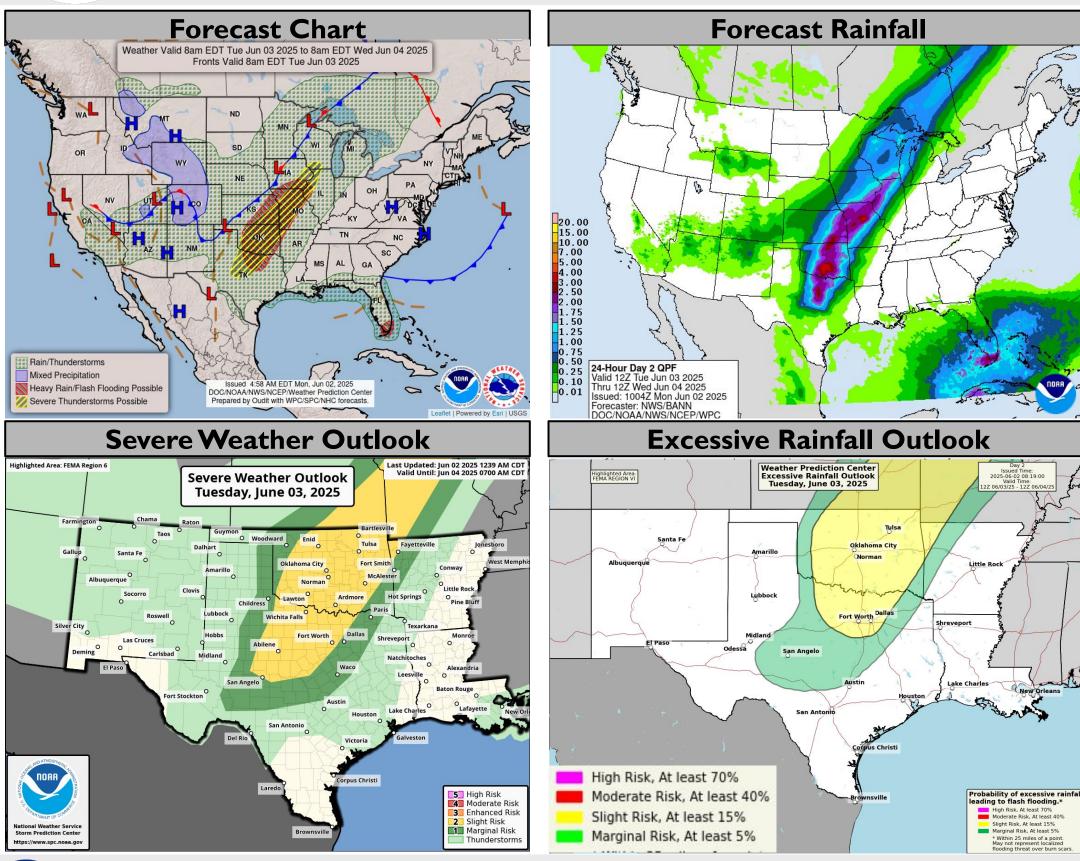

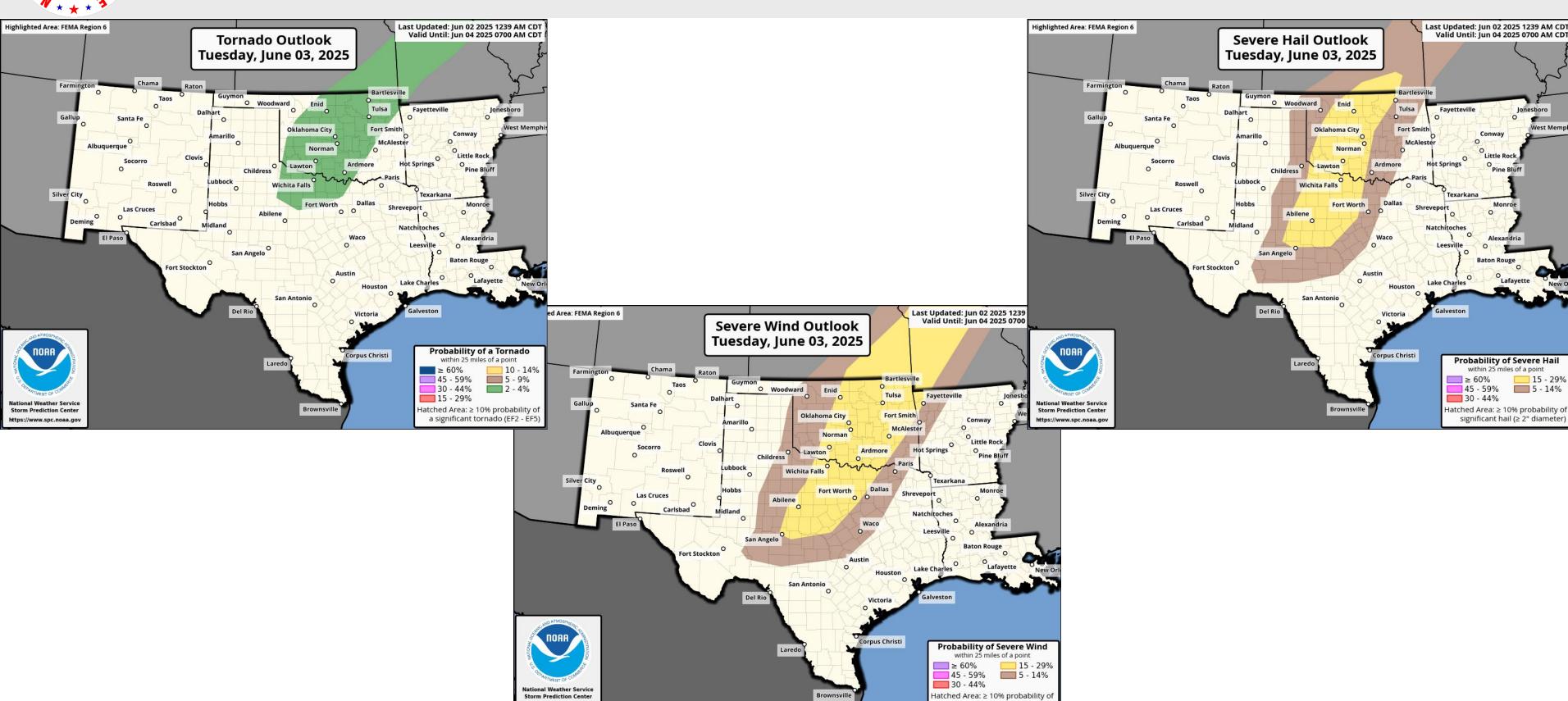

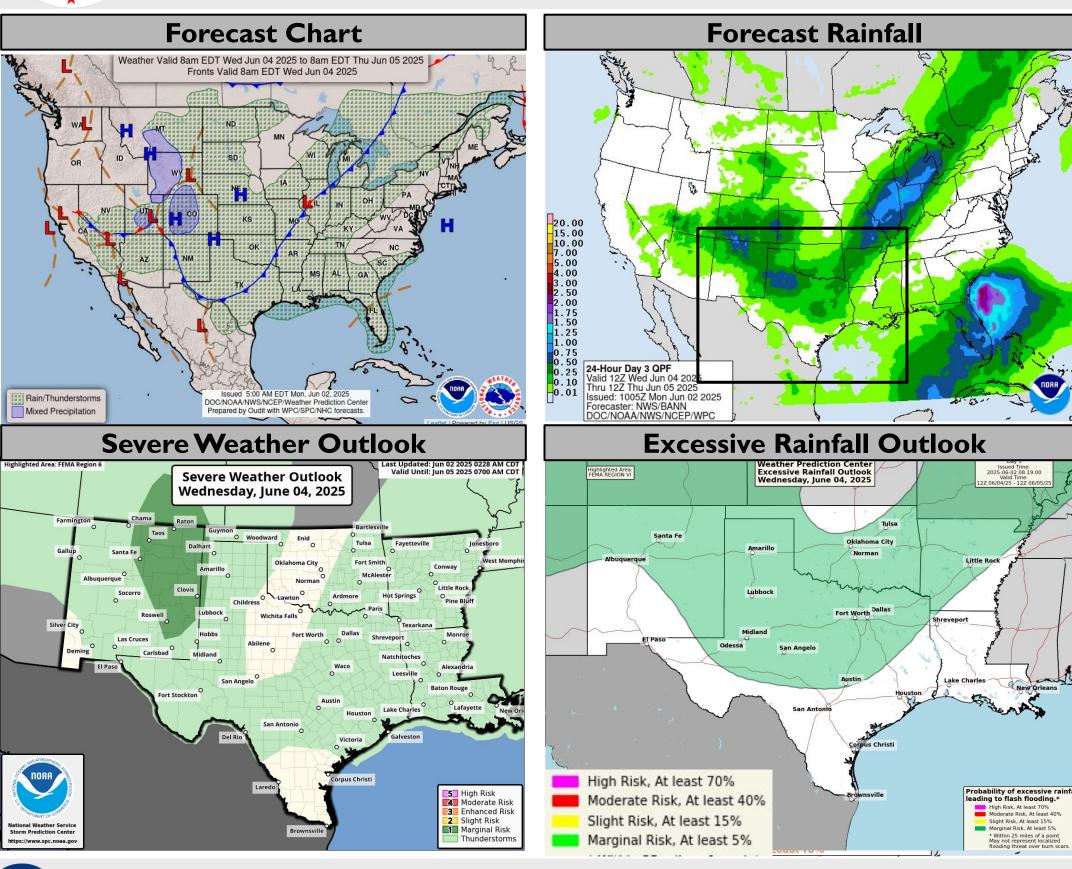
Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities

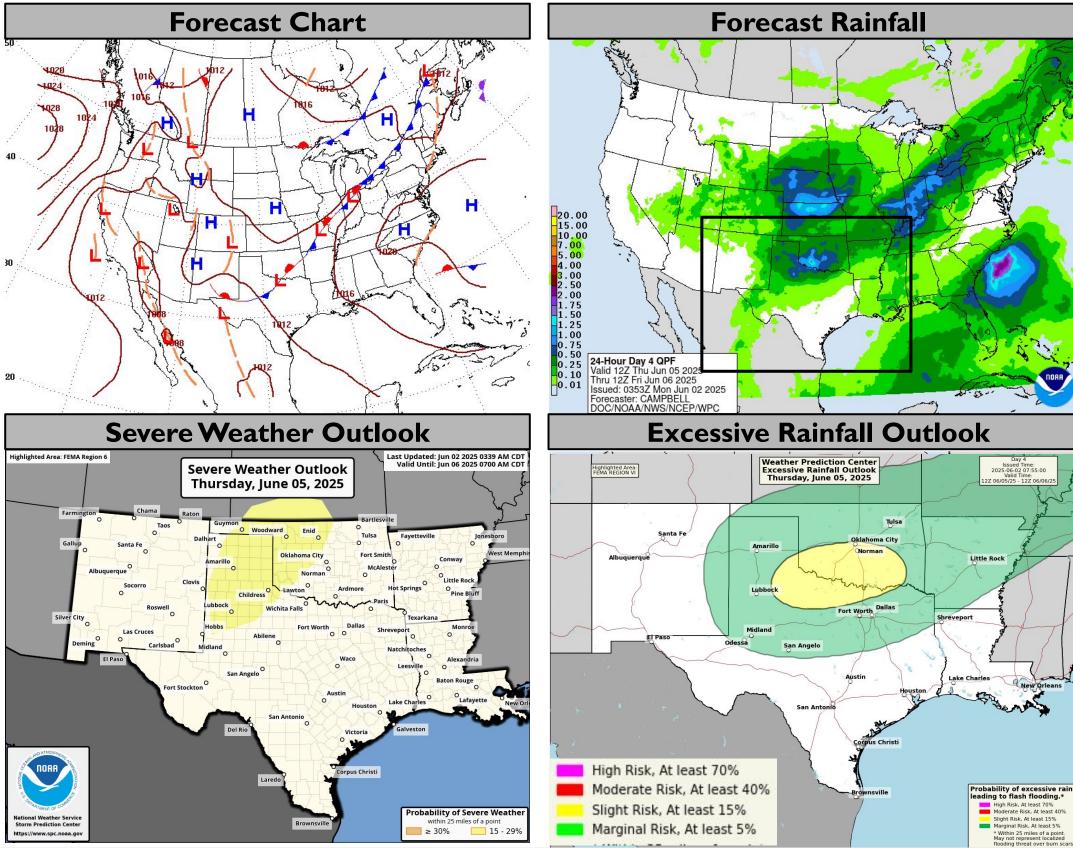

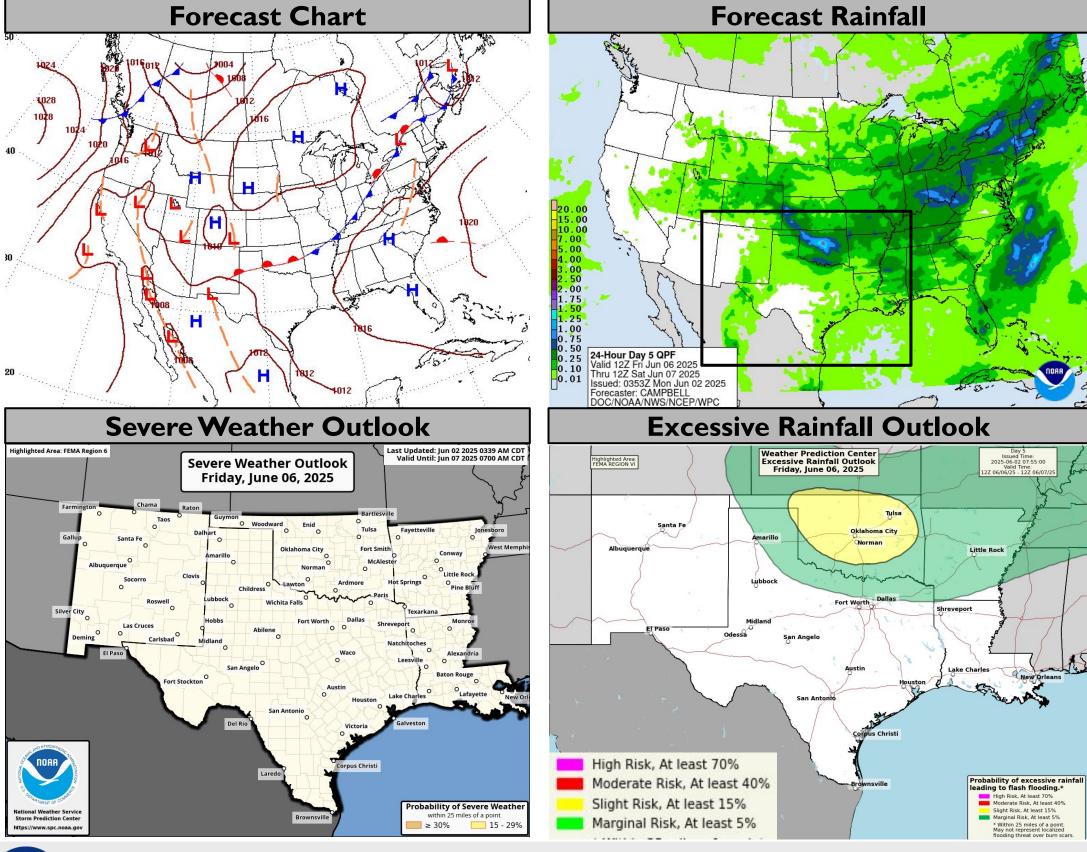

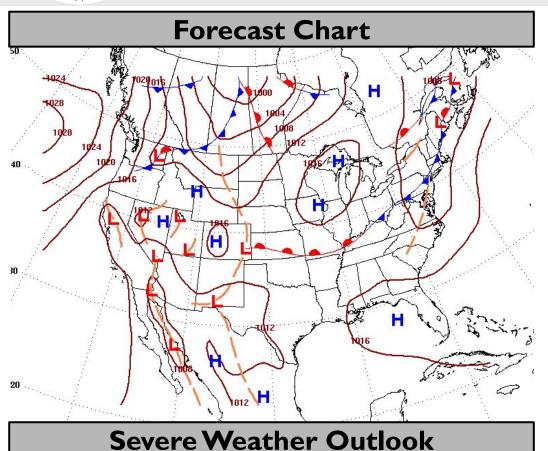

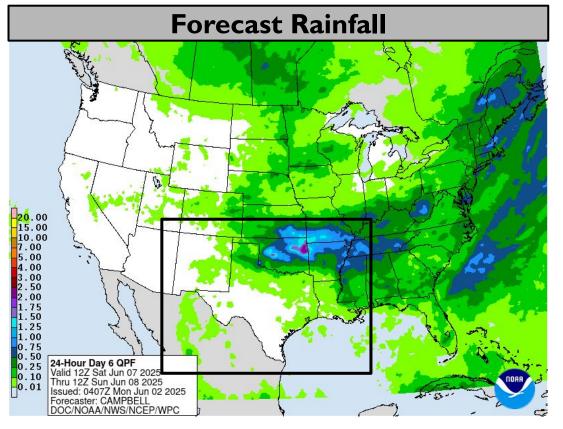

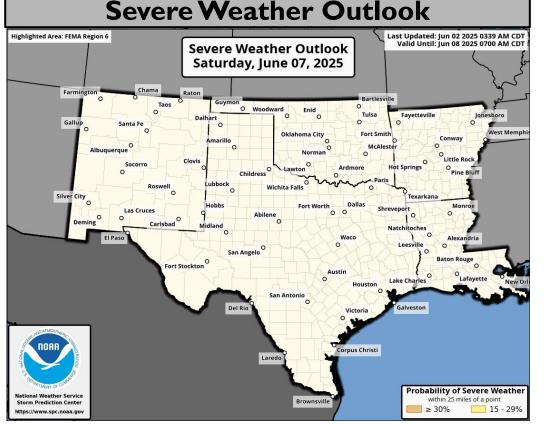

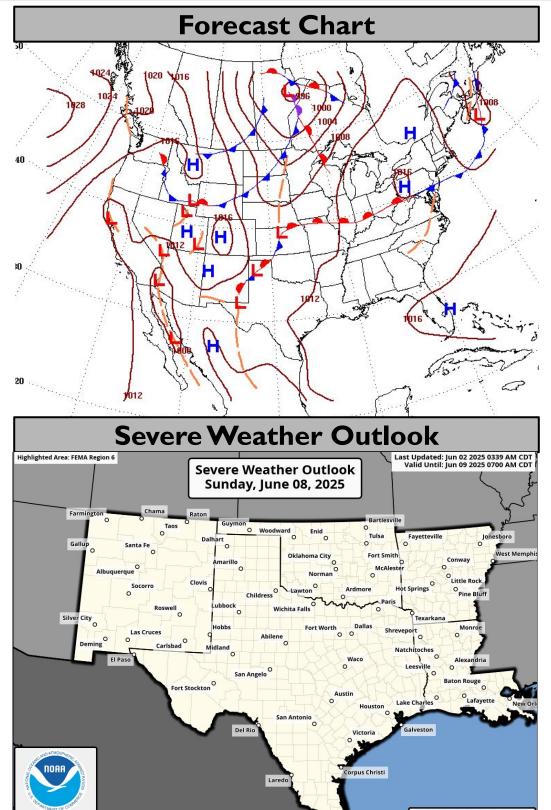

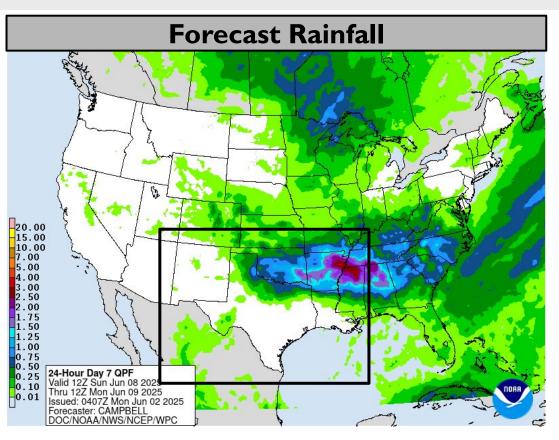

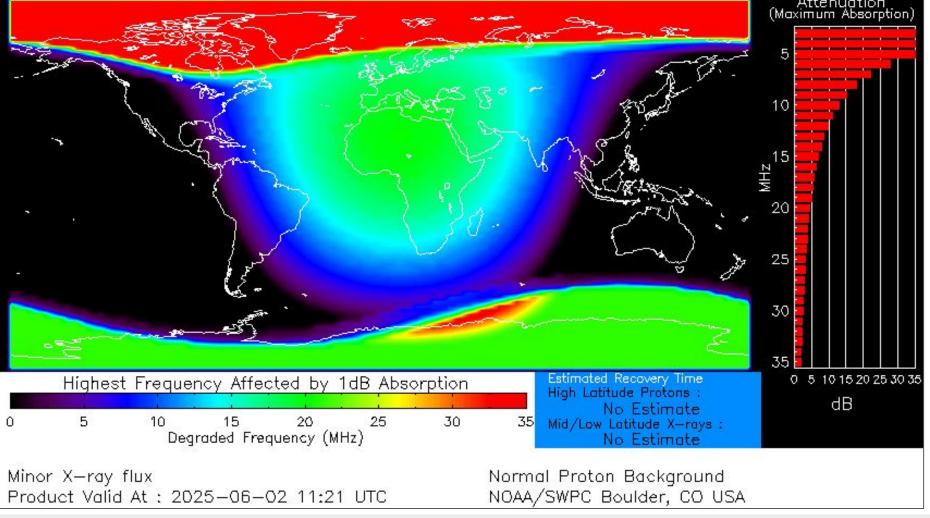
