


### **IMPACTS**

Moisture remains in place across the Borderland, and a Pacific low pressure system is moving in from the west. This combination will increase shower and storm chances over western areas through the evening and overnight. By morning, all areas have potential for scattered shower and thunderstorms. Rain should end west to east across the region through the afternoon and early evening hours Monday.



Severe thunderstorms will be possible across much of the area this afternoon through late evening. The primary hazards will be wind gusts up to 75 mph and hail up to the size of golf balls.

### Today's Severe Thunderstorm Outlook

Highest Local Risk: Marginal (Risk Level 1 out of 5)



Strong to Severe thunderstorms are possible for western portions of west central Texas this afternoon and evening.



There is a slight risk of severe thunderstorms over western Oklahoma and adjacent north Texas this afternoon and into early Tuesday morning. A marginal risk of extends to parts of north- central, west-central, southwest Oklahoma and western north Texas. Severe storm potential begins in the evening and continues until after midnight. Large hail and damaging winds are the primary threats.








## **Burn Ban**




