# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Wednesday, June 04, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Storms:</u> Slight risk (level 2 of 5) in E NM,TX Panhandle today. Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for OK, northern TX,AR Thursday through Saturday.
- Flash Flooding: High concern (level 4 of 5) for flooding in burn scars in N New Mexico today. Marginal to Slight risk (levels I-2 of 4) today through Monday for N NM, OK, northern TX, AR, LA.
- Heat: Temperatures will feel like 110-115 degrees in STX this weekend into early next week.
- Tropical: 0% chance of tropical development off SE coast, no FEMA 6 impacts expected.
- Minor river flooding in OK, AR, ETX, and LA. Rainfall in the Southern Plains may lead to minor and isolated moderate river rises in OK, AR, and TX.









#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities








