




The severe storm potential will continue tonight across the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles. Severe storms that form or move into the area could be capable of producing all hazards including: large hail, damaging winds, and a few tornadoes. Storm activity will be limited during the daylight hours, but will be on the increase again tonight.




Overnight storm complexes will push farther south into North and Central Texas starting Saturday night. Some storms may be strong to severe with primarily a damaging wind and hail threat. Remember to stay weather aware, especially if you have outdoor plans this weekend.




Severe thunderstorms are possible today across the Caprock and portions of the Rolling Plains. Hazards expected with any severe storms are severe winds gusts up to 90 mph, very large hail up to softball size, localized flooding, and tornadoes.



An Enhanced Risk (Level 3 of 5) for severe weather is expected today. The highest risk is focused over Southeast New Mexico and the Northern Permian Basin. The main threats are very large hail and damaging winds. A tornado or two is also possible. Stay weather aware!



Severe storms are possible again Friday evening into the overnight hours with damaging wind gusts and hail being the main concern.



Severe storms are likely again from Midland north to Lubbock by mid afternoon. A few of these storms may move east into the the extreme western Concho Valley or the western and northwestern Big Country during the evening hours. Large hail and damaging winds will be the main threats.






