There is a Level 1 to 2 out of 5 risk for isolated to scattered severe storms this afternoon and evening. The greatest risk is across the I-10 Corridor including and east of San Antonio. Stay weather aware today!



There is a marginal risk (level 1 of 5) across all of Deep South Texas late this evening into early Thursday morning. Isolated severe thunderstorms may develop with primary threats of damaging wind gusts and hail. Locally heavy rainfall may also result in isolated flash flooding, especially across low-lying or poor drainage areas.

#### **KEY MESSAGES**

- → A pattern shift brings increased rain chances Today-Friday as disturbances move in
- → Bulk of this rainfall expected Wednesday and Thursday

- → Heavy rain may lead to localized ponding or flooding of low-lying areas and roadways
- → Homes in poorly-drained areas may flood





Multiple rounds of heavy rain are expected through Friday, with the heaviest rain likely occurring near and south of I-20. Rainfall totals of 2 to 4 inches will be common, with a few spots seeing 5 to 7 inches. Remember to never drive into water of unknown depth. Turn around, don't drown!

Another round of showers and thunderstorms is expected across southeast Texas today. Multiple rounds of storms will be capable of producing heavy rainfall, resulting in flooding. In addition, storms may become strong to severe with damaging winds, hail and an isolated tornado or two possible. Remain weather aware today. Make sure you have multiple ways to receive the alerts. Always know where the nearest shelter is located.



#### **Today's Severe Weather Outlook**

Highest Local Risk: Marginal (Risk Level 1 out of 5)



Showers and thunderstorms will continue today across West Central Texas. Most of these storms will stay below severe levels, but a few may briefly produce some quarter size hail or wind gusts to 60 mph. Frequent lightning and locally heavy rainfall will also be possible.




