





Weather Forecast

Isolated storms are possible again this evening and tonight across the Caprock. A few strong or severe storms with gusty winds and hail are possible. We could see a few rounds of severe thunderstorms on Saturday. Storms could form into a line of storms Saturday morning and sweep across north/central Oklahoma this morning before exiting early afternoon. Then, another round of severe thunderstorms could develop along an outflow boundary this evening and into early Sunday morning.

Localized Heavy Rainfall Possible Again Today

(i **Key Messages**

→ Brief heavy rainfall and minor localized flooding possible this afternoon and evening

Amounts

→ Up to an inch with isolated higher amounts possible

What Should You Do

→ Don't drive across flooded roads

The potential for localized heavy rainfall and minor flooding will exist again today across the region, as scattered showers and thunderstorms increase during the afternoon and evening.

Flood Watch

Valid until 7:00PM Saturday



The risk for flash flooding will remain through the afternoon as scattered thundershowers lay down additional precipitation over areas with well saturated soils from antecedent rainfall


If traveling on area roads, remain aware of the risk for flooding.


Please do not try the flooded roads. It will not work out in a way you would appreciate.




Another round of showers and thunderstorms is expected on Saturday. Some of these storms will be capable of producing heavy downpours, strong winds, and frequent lightning.

Today's Severe Weather Outlook

Highest Local Risk: Marginal (Risk Level 1 out of 5)



There remains uncertainty on whether storms develop late this afternoon and through tonight. However, if severe thunderstorms do develop and track into West Central Texas, large hail and wind gusts 50-60 mph will be possible.



Temperatures will continue to slowly rise through the weekend. Heat Advisories are in effect for much of south-central New Mexico, along with El Paso and the Lower Valley. Advisories may need to be extended beyond Monday later.








Burn Ban




