

Heavy rainfall rates of 1"+/hr from rain & thunderstorms at times may produce additional flash flooding threat, especially on already saturated surfaces





With leftover rain showers this morning, we will have a new round of rain and thunderstorms this afternoon and evening, favoring the western Panhandles, with higher chances in NM. 24 hour rainfall totals this morning at our observations sites ending early this morning have some areas in the 1-2"+ range, with some areas of radar estimates in the NW Panhandles of 3-5"+. Any additional rainfall today could result in flooding in areas with saturated soils. Please use caution if traveling in these areas.



A Heat Advisory has been issued for Today across much of our Four-State area as heat indices will max out between 105-109 degrees. Take precautions to protect yourself from prolonged heat and sun exposure by hydrating and taking frequent breaks in the shade or indoors.




There will be a decent chance for showers and thunderstorms, mainly during the afternoon, today. Here are the forecasted and reasonably highest rainfall totals.




Similar temperatures are expected on Monday with increased afternoon showers and thunderstorms possible.



Expect another day of seasonal temperatures with highs ranging from near 90 to near 100 degrees. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms can be expected, mainly for areas east of the Interstate 35 corridor. Winds will be mainly south to southeast at 10 to 15 mph with gusts near 25 mph.



Heavy rainfall and flash flooding will continue out west.



A Flood Watch is in effect through Wednesday evening. There is a good chance that we will see heavy rains of 1 to 3 inches over the next several days, which could lead to flash flooding, especially locations in and near recent burn scars.


