There is a Marginal Flood risk today and tomorrow across west central Texas. Heavy showers and thunderstorms could lead increased flooding to concerns.



The risk of heavy rain and flash flooding will continue today and tomorrow. Below average high temperatures and humid, upslope southeast winds will persist before a warming and drying trend sets in at the end of the week. 


Showers and thunderstorms are expected to persist offand-on throughout the day today. It'll also be rather cool with highs in the upper 70s to the mid 80s.






