


Isolated Pockets of Heavy Rain

A cluster of severe thunderstorms may move into portions of northern Oklahoma on Wednesday evening into overnight. Damaging wind gusts will be the main severe weather risk.

The severe weather threat is low, but a strong storm or two with gusty winds may occur as well as locally heavy rain, similar to Tuesday. Highs will be in the upper 80s to mid 90s.




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
