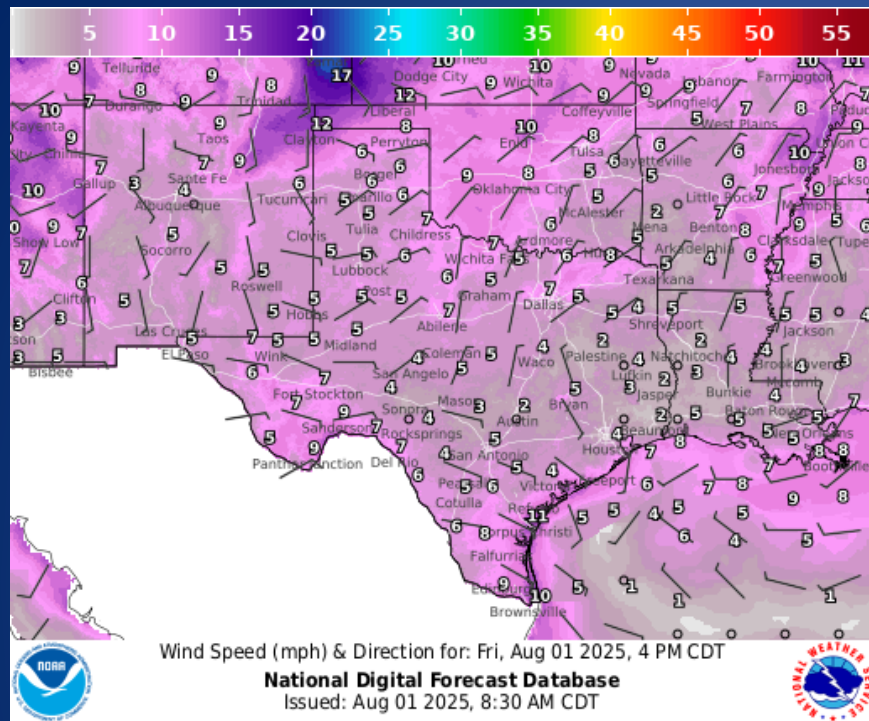

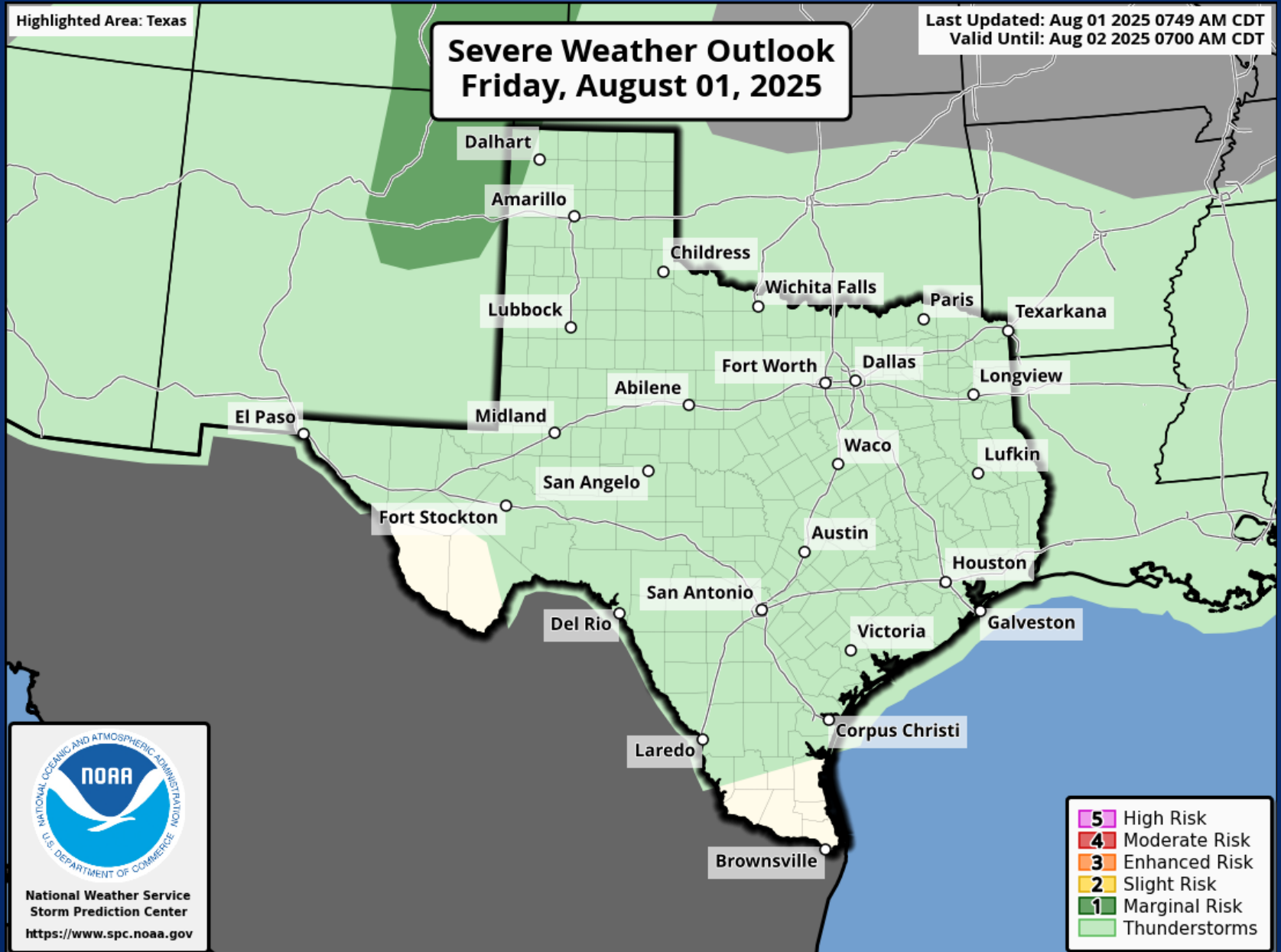


Wind Speeds



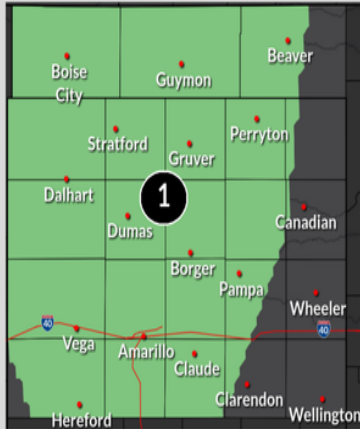

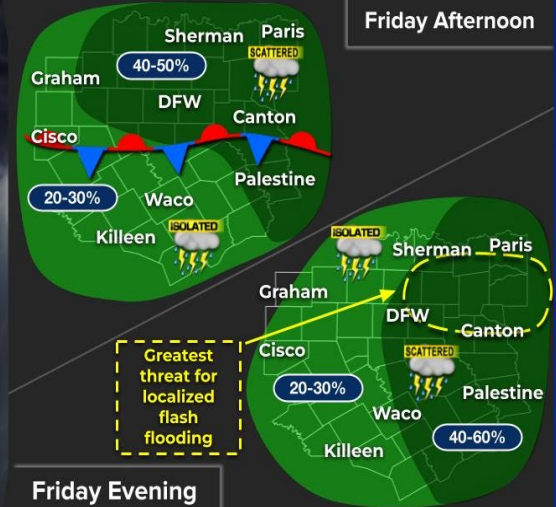
A stalled front will allow for on and off showers and storms today. Some storms could become strong with downburst winds and localized flash flooding.

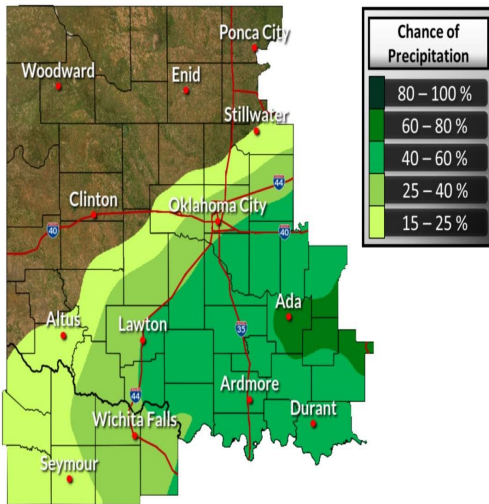

Some of which could become strong with gusty downburst winds, localized flooding, and frequent lightning all possible. Areas north of I-20 and east of I-35 have the greatest potential for that localized flooding threat late this afternoon and tonight. Make sure to stay weather aware today, especially if you have outdoor plans or are on area lakes.

Key Messages

- Storms will be ongoing at daybreak across parts of central Oklahoma. These storms will move slowly southeastward during the day today.
- Storms will produce cloud-to-ground lightning strikes and heavy rainfall. A few areas could see flooding of roadways and small streams.

- This afternoon through the evening/overnight



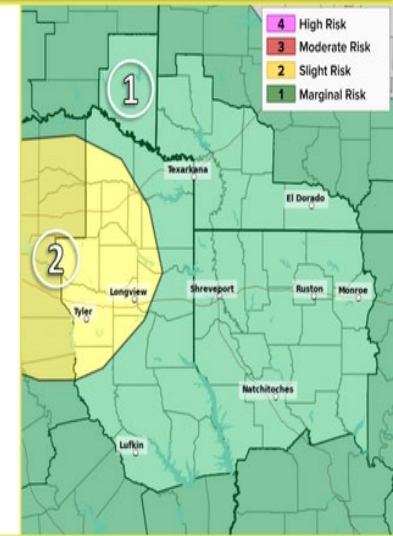
Amounts

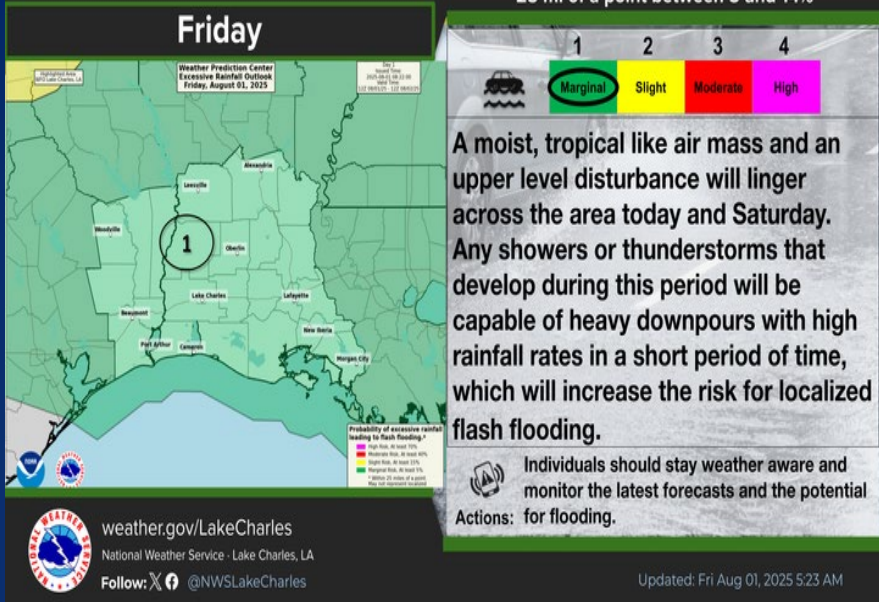

The threat of heavy rainfall is possible late Friday into Friday night and early Saturday morning, especially across parts of Northeast Texas where a Slight Risk (2 out of 4) has been highlighted. The remainder of the region is included in a Marginal Risk (1 out of 4).

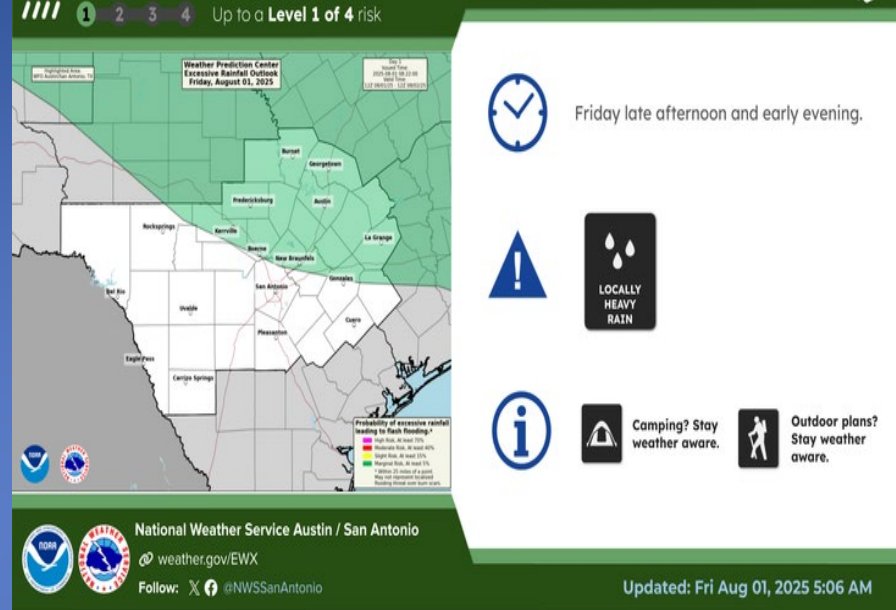
Hazardous Weather

Excessive Rainfall Outlook



Showers and thunderstorms that develop will have the potential to produce torrential downpours with high rainfall rates in a short period of time. This will increase the localized risk for flash flooding. There is a Marginal Risk (level 1 out of 5) Potential for flash flooding or between a 5 and 14 percent chance.

Locally Heavy Rain Possible Friday

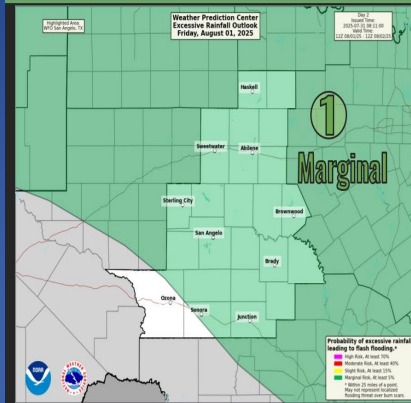


Locally heavy rain is possible late this afternoon and early evening from the Hill Country to the northern Coastal Plains. Minor flooding is possible.

Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Flash flooding could cause hazardous driving conditions



There is a Marginal Risk (5-15% chance) of excessive rainfall leading to flash flooding.



Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are forecast to develop this afternoon into the evening hours. Widespread rain is not expected, but localized areas could see heavy rain leading to flooding of creeks, streams, rivers & streets.

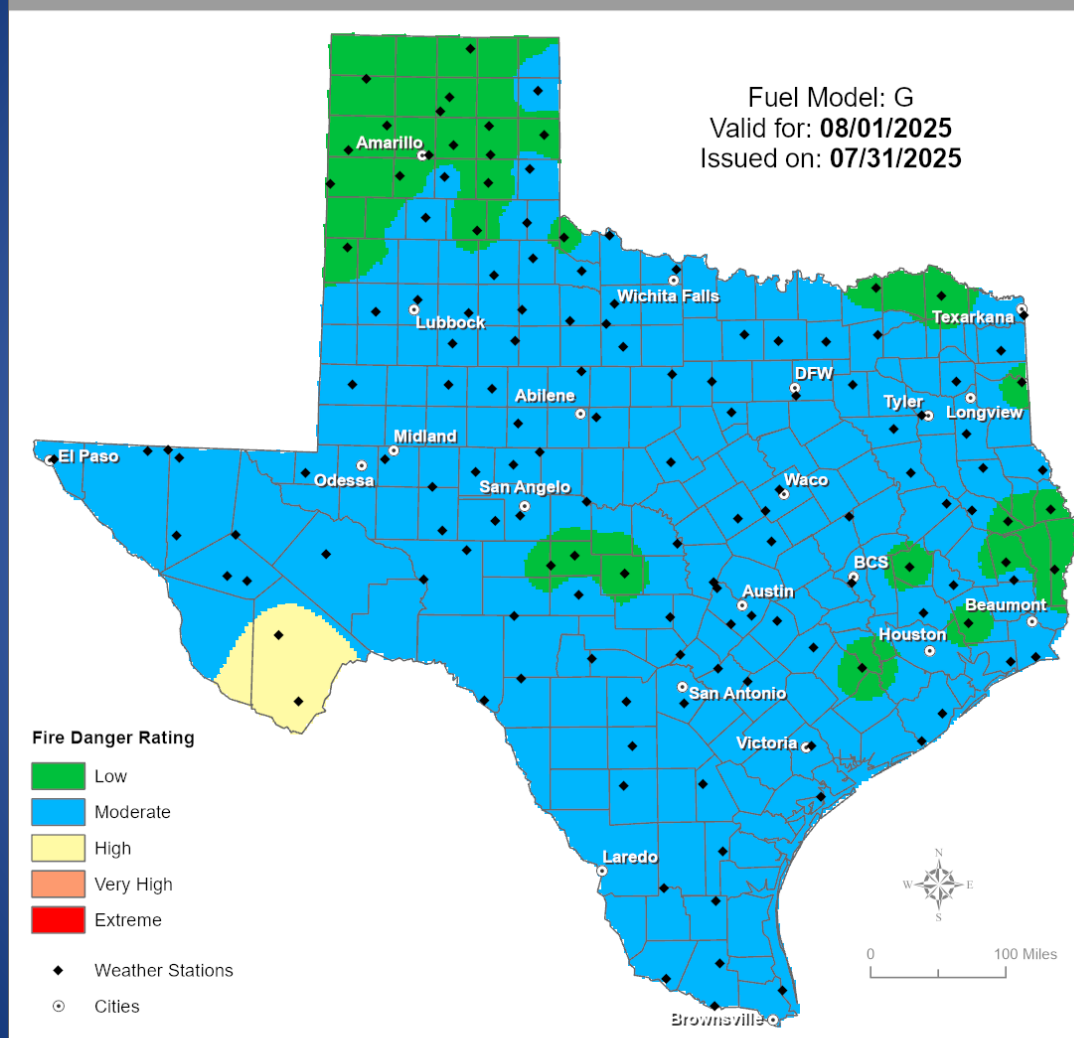

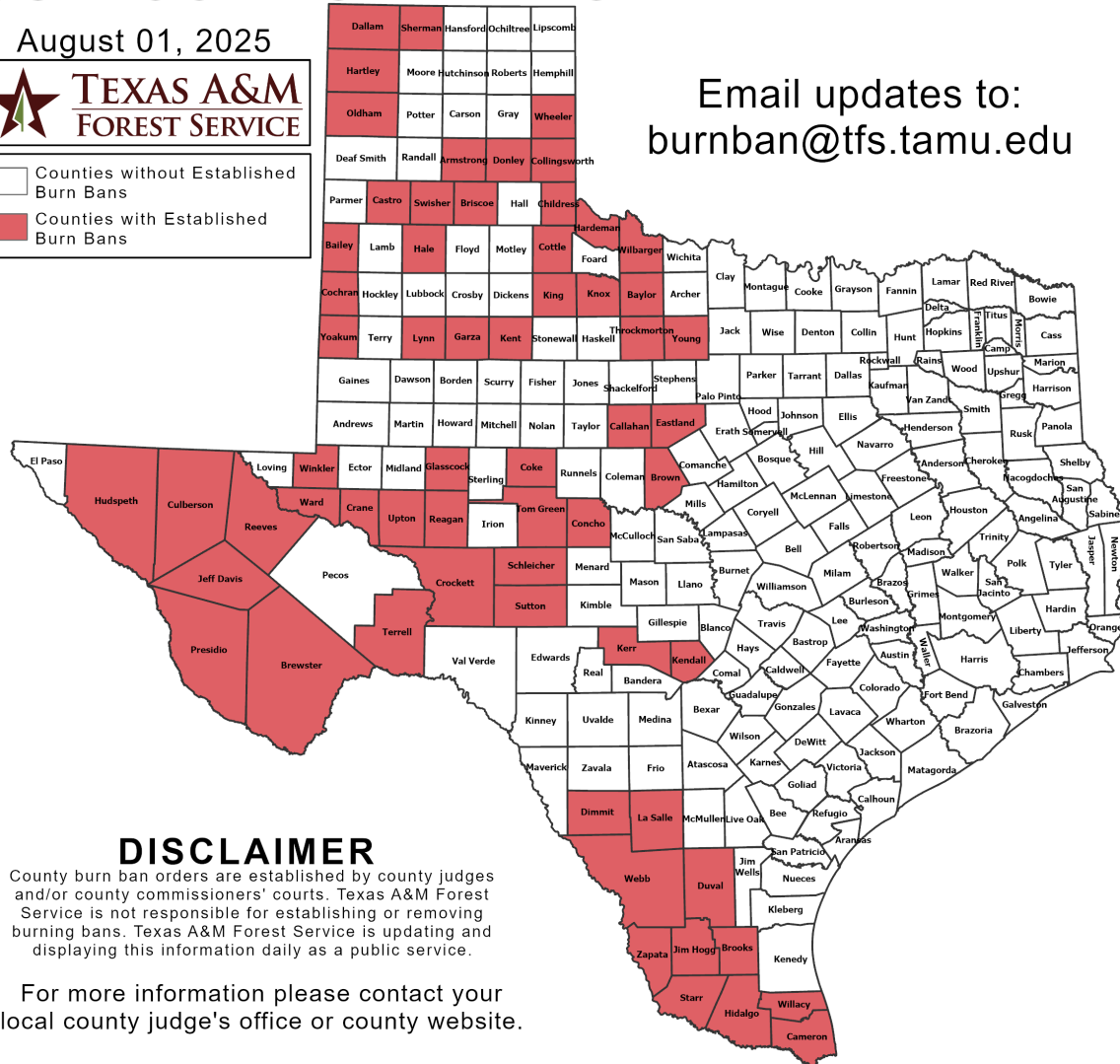

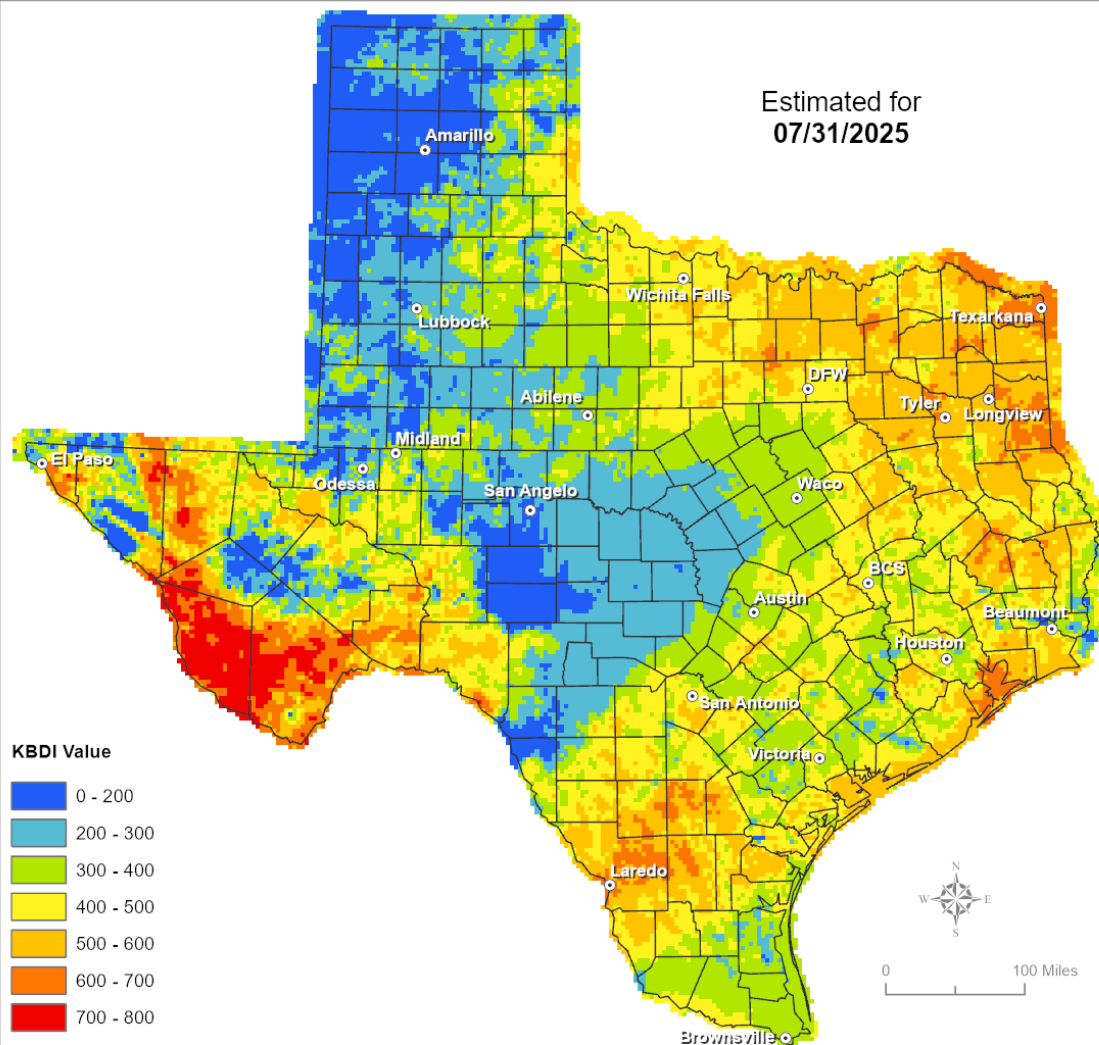

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

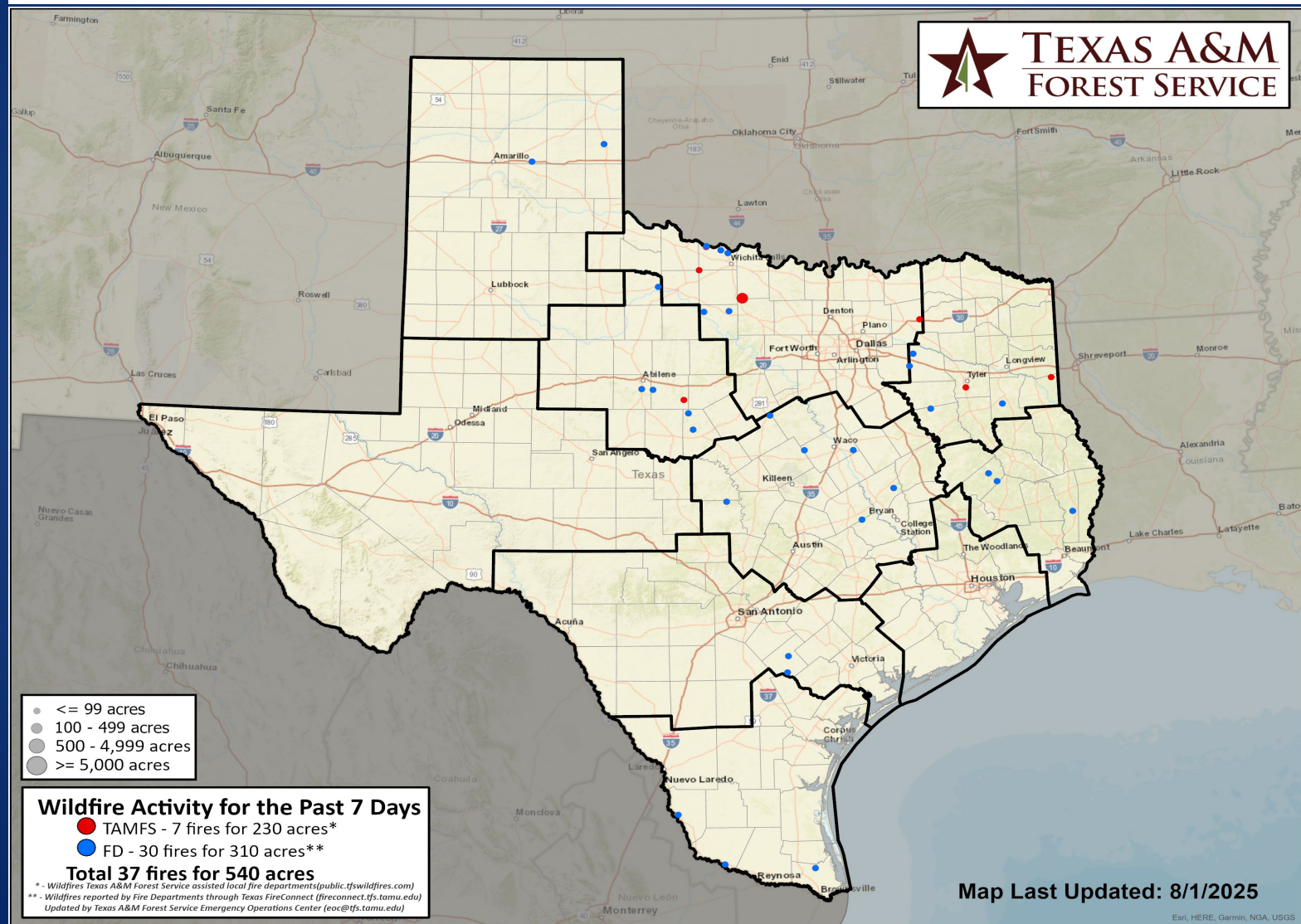
