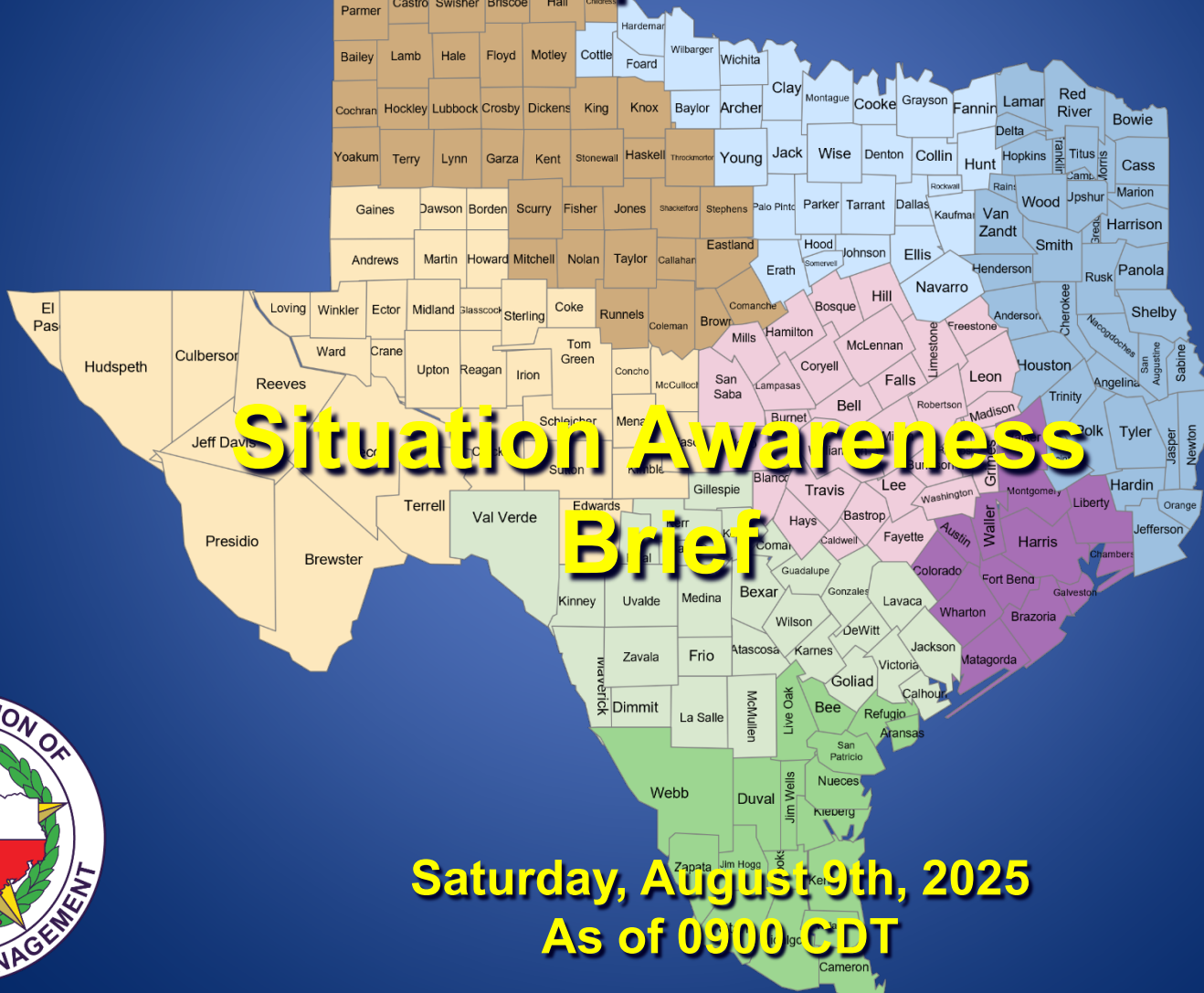

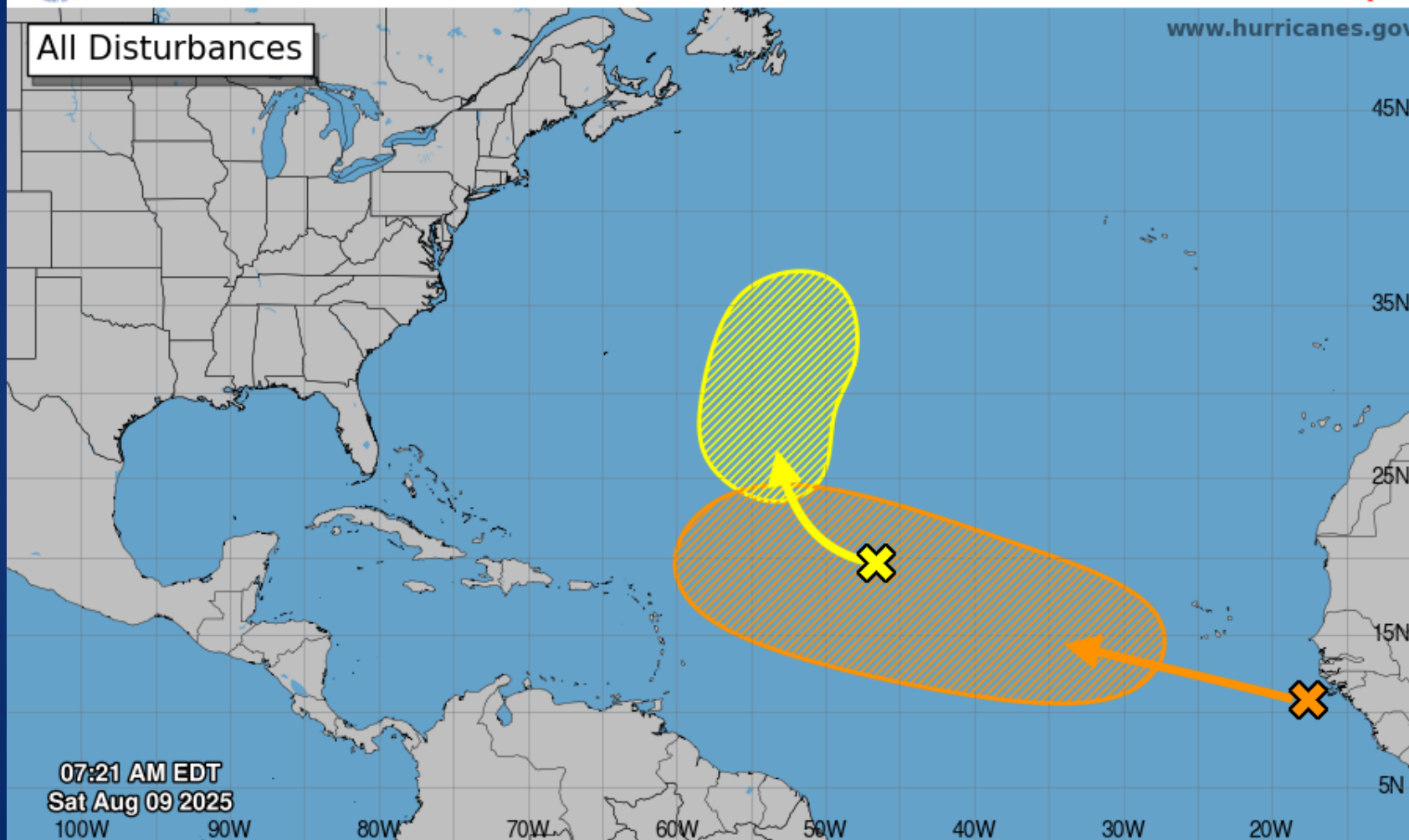
## Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

Isolated thunderstorms will be possible late Saturday afternoon through the evening hours. Storms will be primarily capable of producing wind gusts to 60 mph.

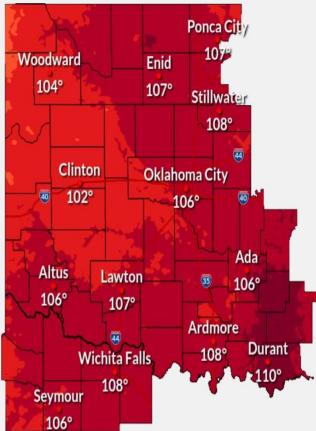

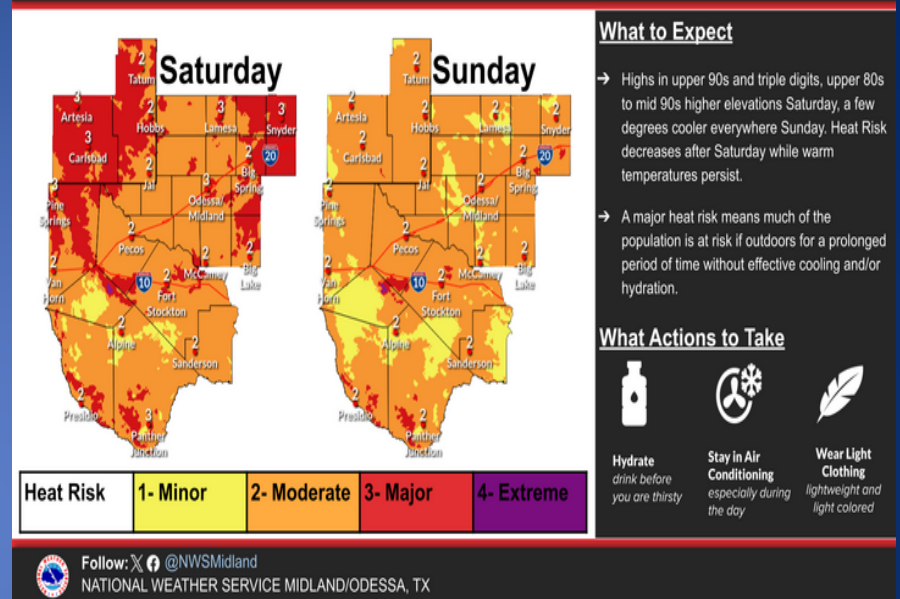

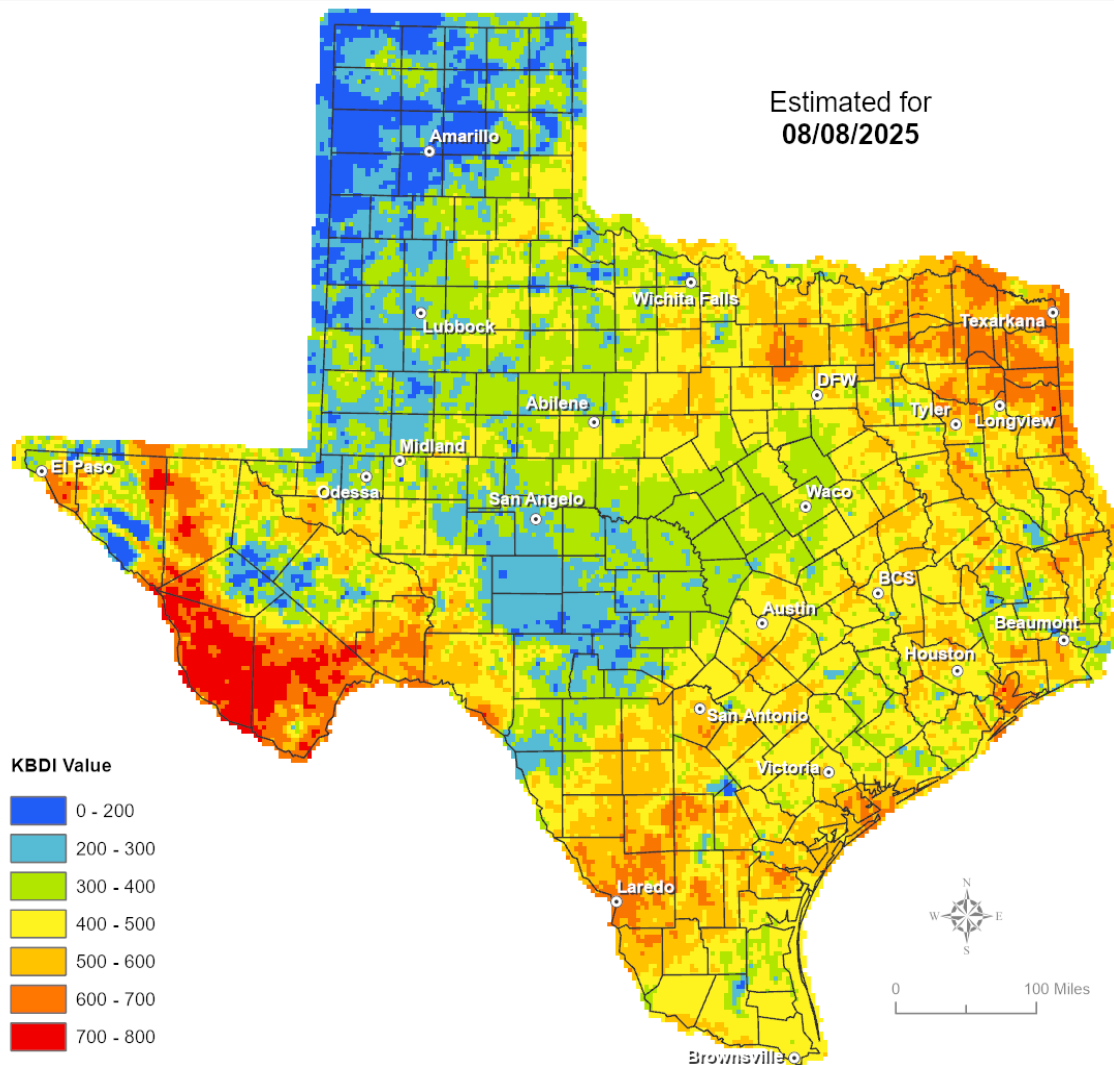


# Keetch-Byram Drought Index

## Keetch-Byram Drought Index

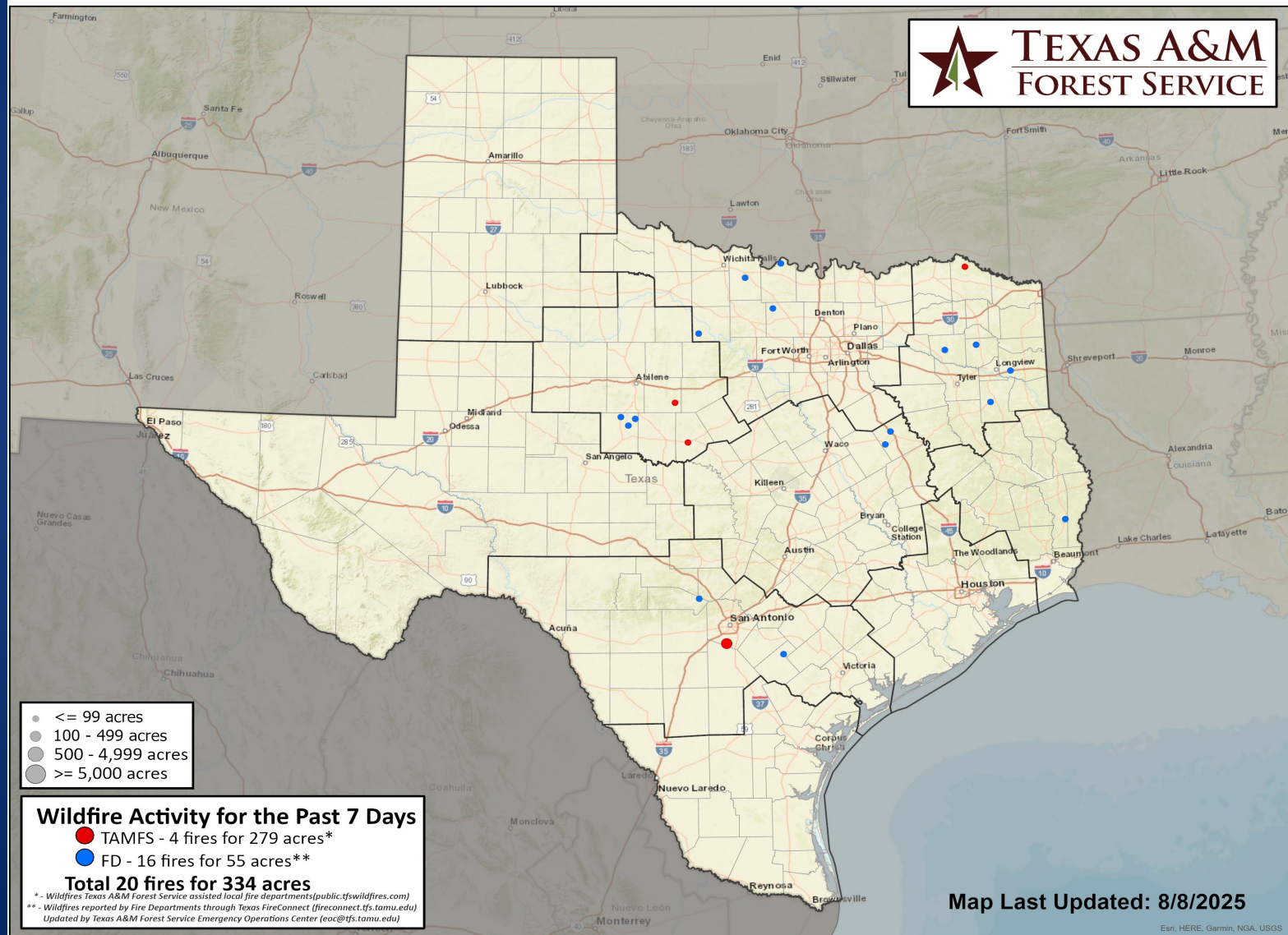
(4 km x 4 km resolution)

# Fire Activity (\*Last 24 Hours)

Report of 371 (No Change) fires and 85,777 (No Change) acres have been burned this year. There are 63 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list contains 153 (+9) counties with an average over 400.
