FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Monday, August 11, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Flash Flooding: Slight risk (level 2 of 4) over OK and the TX Panhandle today. Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) over NM, far WTX, SE LA, OK, N/NWTX on Tuesday; SW NM, AR and LA on Wednesday; SW NM, AR and N LA on Thursday; NM and far WTX on Friday.
 - Burn Scar: Major risk (level 3 of 4) today and tomorrow over NM, moderate risk (level 2 of 4) on Wednesday, minor (level 1 of 4) on Thursday.
- Severe Storms: Marginal risk (level | of 5) today over E NM,TX Panhandle,W OK today.
- Heat: Hazardous heat expands across LA,TX and OK late week and over the weekend.
- <u>Tropical</u>: Monitoring a wave (AL 97) near the Cabo Verde Islands that has a high chance (90%) of becoming a tropical depression in the tropical Atlantic over the next 48 hours days. System will be moving west/northwest at 15-20 mph. No tropical impacts to FEMA 6 over the next 7 days





Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall









Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities












Flood watch through tomorrow over southern burn scar areas of NM.










Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities










