STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On August 12, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to request that Uvalde County be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following last month's flooding across Texas.

On July 30, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> 10 additional Texas counties have been added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following recent flooding across the state. Those counties include Edwards, Guadalupe, Kimble, Lampasas, McCulloch, Menard, Real, Reeves, Schleicher, and Sutton.

On July 24, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> TDEM to request Real County be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following the recent catastrophic flooding that impacted communities across the state.

On July 23, Governor Abbott <u>updated</u> his disaster declaration following recent catastrophic flooding across Texas to include Edwards, Kinney, Real, and Schleicher counties, bringing the total to 30 counties. Additionally, the Governor directed TDEM to <u>request</u> that additional counties be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration.

On July 22, Governor Abbott <u>thanked</u> his fellow governors across the country for providing critical emergency response and recovery resources to Texas following a request for support after devastating flooding across the state.

On July 19, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> that the federal government has updated President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration to include Hamilton and Travis counties in response to the recent flooding across Texas.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- Protect life and property.
- Support rapid & effective response.
- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 6 (Includes DDs 17, 18, and 24)

DD 18 – New Braunfels (Includes Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson Counties):

On July 6, DDEOC 18 activated to Level III.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM): Communications Coordination Group (CCG):

As of July 19, T-Mobile has provided a Command Trailer to support operations at the Unified Command Center. The Mobile Connectivity Center (MCC) provided by AT&T will remain at the Hunt Store located at 1634 TX-39, from 10:00AM to 3:00PM.

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

The American Red Cross (ARC) is managing the remaining shelter locations. Concurrently, statewide operations are focused on addressing survivors' unmet needs, assisting with transition planning, and supporting long-term housing strategies.

Long-term recovery operations are underway, with Long-Term Recovery Groups (LTRGs) being established to support local communities. Ongoing efforts are concentrated on facilitating a seamless transition of Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD)-led community response activities into sustainable, community-based recovery initiatives beyond the initial response phase.

The ISTF Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL) team remains actively engaged in community response efforts, including volunteer and donations management, residential debris cleanup, and survivor services. Support is being provided across multiple sites such as Family Assistance Centers (FACs), Multi-Agency Resource Centers (MARC), Volunteer Reception Centers (VRCs), and Disaster Recovery Centers (DRC). Coordination continues to be a priority to align efforts, close service gaps, and advance long-term recovery goals.

Mass Care:

VOAD is supporting efforts at the reunification centers (Team Rubicon, Global Empowerment Mission, Convoy of Hope, ITDRC).

A Volunteer Reception Center is located at 855 Hays St., Kerrville, TX

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife):

As of August 8, County Extension Agents have assumed DRC operations in Kerrville, Hunt, San Saba, Georgetown, Leander/Round Mountain, Burnet, Brady, Seguin, and Menard. 514 entries from the State of Texas Assessment Tool portal have been received from landowners with agricultural damage to fencing, crops, livestock, and equipment and 181 of those are requesting assistance from AgriLife.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1): On August 5, seven of eight SWR boat squads, TX-TF2, and HSART rescue swimmers demobilized.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

As of August 12, 33 personnel are deployed consisting of one TAMFS Saw Module and two TIFMAS Strike Teams. Additionally, TAMFS has one LNO at the SOC, and TIFMAS has one LNO assisting in Kerr County.

Department of Information Resources (DIR):

DIR is continuing to monitor the situation using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. No cyber threats related to this weather event have been identified. The Texas.gov homepage banner has been updated to include flood recovery resources and a link to the Kerr County Flood Relief Fund.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC):

One LNO remains assigned to the SOC and will support 24-hour operations if needed.

Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC): None Reported

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has authorized 20 temporary debris management sites.

Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA):

The free, confidential Agri-Stress Helpline offers 24/7 support via call or text for those experiencing stress or loss. So far, it has helped over 285 Texans in 114 counties. Call or text 1-833-897-2474 for assistance.

TDA's Hay Hotline is open for those wishing to donate hay. Donors can register at https://texasagriculture.gov/Home/Production-Agriculture/Hay-Hotline and will be contacted if requests are received.

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

Over 300 DPS personnel are actively working in coordination with local, state, and federal partners in search and recovery efforts, assisting at evacuation shelters, reunification centers, and providing security.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

As of August 12, a total of 1,859 vaccines has been administered to first responders including 929 Tdap and 930 Hepatitis A. On August 4, a Wildland Paramedic Unit (WPU) was added to support SAR operations with two paramedics, a truck and trailer, and ATV.

Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):

Search and recovery operations continued with ESF-9 assets and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Support in Kerr County. The total patient contacts for this activation are 23,379 encounters, 474 treated, 194 transported.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

As of July 29, TxDOT had five locations on state-maintained roads closed due to flood damage. TxDOT liaisons are meeting daily with TDEM, TCEQ, and local authorities to coordinate debris management.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):

As of July 25, one Other Needs Assistance (ONA) member has been deployed to each of the Disaster Recovery Centers (DRC) located in Burnet, Georgetown, Hunt, Kerrville, Leander, San Angelo, and San Saba.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

As of August 12, TMD has activated 72 personnel, four vehicles, and one aircraft in support of our state partners. Replacement in place operations continue. There is an SOC Support Team in Austin, a Search and Extraction (SAE) MRP, Fatality Search and Recovery (FSRT) MRP, and a General Support Unit have been deployed to provide support for SAR operations.

Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA):

TDHCA is actively supporting the community action agency partners at the local level and coordinating resources with HUD.

The following partners are collaborating with local officials to identify and assist impacted households with immediate food/gas/hotel needs.

- Tom Green County: Concho Valley Community Action Agency
- Kerr County: Community Council of South-Central Texas

- Guadalupe County: Community Council of South-Central Texas
- San Saba County: Hill Country Community Action Association

Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPWD):

Texas Game Warden Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) pilots are supporting the recovery and debris removal missions in the Kerr County area and will continue to support response operations as needed.

American Red Cross (ARC):

As of August 13, the ARC-managed shelter in Tom Green County is closed. ARC will cease operations for this event on August 13.

Southern Baptists of Texas Convention Disaster Relief (SBTC):

As of August 13, SBTC laundry unit supporting Texas Task Force 1 at Tapatio Hill Country Resort, Boerne. SBTC has provided 19,990 volunteer hours, and 1,731 ministry contacts.
