STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On August 20, Governor Greg Abbott announced that the federal government has updated President Donald J. Trump's Major Disaster Declaration to include Uvalde County in response to a request from Texas following the recent flooding across the state.

On August 20, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> the Governor's Small Business Disaster Recovery Fair in Kerrville on Thursday, August 28, where he will deliver keynote remarks. As Texas continues to help communities recover and rebuild following the devastating flooding in July, the Governor's Small Business Disaster Recovery Fair will bring together state and federal agency partners and resource providers to share information, resources, and assistance for small businesses impacted by the historic floods.

On August 12, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to request that Uvalde County be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following last month's flooding across Texas.

On July 30, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> 10 additional Texas counties have been added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following recent flooding across the state. Those counties include Edwards, Guadalupe, Kimble, Lampasas, McCulloch, Menard, Real, Reeves, Schleicher, and Sutton.

On July 24, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> TDEM to request Real County be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following the recent catastrophic flooding

that impacted communities across the state.

On July 23, Governor Abbott <u>updated</u> his disaster declaration following recent catastrophic flooding across Texas to include Edwards, Kinney, Real, and Schleicher counties, bringing the total to 30 counties. Additionally, the Governor directed TDEM to <u>request</u> that additional counties be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration.

On July 22, Governor Abbott <u>thanked</u> his fellow governors across the country for providing critical emergency response and recovery resources to Texas following a request for support after devastating flooding across the state.

On July 19, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> that the federal government has updated President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration to include Hamilton and Travis counties in response to the recent flooding across Texas.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- Protect life and property.
- Support rapid & effective response.
- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

The ISTF continues to assist jurisdictions across the state through ongoing coordination and resource alignment. Demobilization efforts have begun. To date, over 60 ISTF members have been deployed, providing support in Kerr, Burnet, Williamson, Travis, San Saba, San Angelo, and Tom Green counties. ISTF members have provided support across multiple areas, including Finance, EOC support, Planning, VAL support, Documentation, Recovery, Donation Management, and overall ISTF coordination.

Mass Care:

Long-term recovery operations are underway, with Long-Term Recovery Groups (LTRG) being established to support local communities. Ongoing efforts are concentrated on facilitating a seamless transition of Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD)-led community response activities into sustainable, community-based recovery initiatives beyond the initial response phase.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife): To date, there are 522 entries from the State of Texas Assessment Tool portal from landowners with agricultural damages to fencing, crops, livestock, and equipment. Of those, 185 are requesting assistance from AgriLife. There are four Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) personnel who are activated.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Public Works Response Team (PWRT): A team of four PWRT members continues assisting TX-TF 1 in the drone mission over the Guadalupe River. One member is active as Air Operations Group

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1): On August 5, seven of eight SWR boat squads, TX-TF2, and HSART rescue swimmers demobilized. TX-TF1 and TX-TF2 personnel continue to assist in debris removal and search and rescue missions in the Guadalupe River Basin.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

As of August 14, 16 personnel are deployed consisting of one TIFMAS Strike Team and one Drone team assisting TX-TF1 in Kerr County.

Department of Information Resources (DIR):

The Texas.gov homepage banner has been updated to include flood recovery resources and a link to the Kerr County Flood Relief Fund.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC):

One LNO remains assigned to the SOC and will support 24-hour operations if needed.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has authorized 22 temporary debris management sites.

Supervisor, and three other members remain as drone pilots.

Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA):

The free, confidential Agri-Stress Helpline offers 24/7 support via call or text for those experiencing stress or loss. So far, it has helped over 285 Texans in 114 counties. Call or text 1-833-897-2474 for assistance.

TDA's Hay Hotline is open for those wishing to donate hay. Donors can register at https://texasagriculture.gov/Home/Production-Agriculture/Hay-Hotline and will be contacted if requests are received.

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

Over 300 DPS personnel worked in coordination with local, state, and federal partners in search and recovery efforts, assisting at evacuation shelters, reunification centers, and providing security.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

As of August 20, DSHS Command has approved extension of all active EMTF assets through September 13. No change to vaccine administration. An additional UTV with two paramedics and an Ambulance Strike Team Leader were activated to support ground operations. As of August 14, a total of 1,859 vaccines has been administered to first responders including 929 Tdap and 930 Hepatitis A. On August 4, a Wildland

Paramedic Unit (WPU) was added to support SAR operations with two paramedics, a truck and trailer, and UTV.

Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):

Search and recovery operations continued with ESF-9 assets and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) support in Kerr County. The total patient contacts for this activation are 29,648 encounters, 494 treated, 195 transported.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

As of August 13, TxDOT debris contractors have hauled 77,044 cubic yards of debris. TxDOT debris contracts are hauling debris in Burnet, Llano, and Mason counties, and will begin operations in other impacted areas as soon as all permitting requirements are approved.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

As of August 20, TMD has activated four personnel and one aircraft in support of our state partners.

Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA):

The following partners are collaborating with local officials to identify and assist impacted households with immediate food/gas/hotel needs.

- Tom Green County: Concho Valley Community Action Agency
- Kerr County: Community Council of South-Central Texas
- Guadalupe County: Community Council of South-Central Texas
- San Saba County: Hill Country Community Action Association

Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPWD):

Texas Game Warden Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) pilots are supporting the recovery and debris removal missions in the Kerr County area.

Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)

Southern Baptists of Texas Convention Disaster Relief (SBTC):

As of August 17, an SBTC laundry unit is supporting Texas Task Force 1 at Tapatio Hill Country Resort, Boerne. To date, SBTC has provided 20,120 volunteer hours, and 1,805 ministry contacts.
