
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook












Unsettled Weather Today Into The Labor Day Holiday



Key Messages

- Scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms are expected once again today as a boundary meanders offshore through Labor Day
- As the front remains near the coast Labor Day, rain chances will be more favorable over SETX and southern LA. Any cells that do develop, however, will have the same opportunity for heavy rainfall / high rain rates
- Some locally heavy downpours with high rainfall amounts in a short period of time may occur today into Labor Day, bringing a potential for localized nuisance-type flooding
- Decreased rain chances areawide can be expected by Wednesday. This transitioning pattern will result in offshore winds through the end of the work week

There is a potential for heavy downpours which may lead to instances of flash flooding thru Monday (Labor Day).

A slow-moving frontal boundary from the north will collide with a surge of deep Gulf moisture to produce scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms today and Labor Day. There is the potential for a few strong thunderstorms to produce gusty outflows and torrential rainfall and lightning. Remember when thunder roars, go indoors!









Keetch-Byram Drought Index


