Rain Chances - Today



→ Timing and Coverage

- 12 3 PM: Isolated storms, beginning over Gila Wilderness, Sacramento Mountains
- 4 7 PM: Scattered storms across southern New Mexico and far west Texas, including El Paso and the I-10 corridor
- \cdot 8 11 PM: Decreasing storm coverage, lingering rain showers before midnight

→ Hazards

- Brief downpours and localized flooding, especially for urban areas, mountain canyons, and arroyos
- · Cloud-to-ground lightning
- · Gusty outflow winds up to 50 mph

→ Actions and Preparedness

- · Monitor local news and weather gov for latest forecasts
- Have a way to receive alerts and warnings by cell phone, TV, or NOAA weather radio



Hazardous Weather





- → Isolated to scattered showers and storms to develop during the afternoon with the greatest chances along and south of I-10.










