### **Hazardous Weather**



A cold front will bring scattered showers and storms into the region later this afternoon moving southeast through the evening and overnight through early Wednesday morning. A few strong to severe storms are possible, especially across North Texas. The main hazards will be damaging winds, hail, and locally heavy rain.



Strong winds are expected across Guadalupe Pass and Carlsbad Caverns National Park tonight through early Wednesday evening. Take caution if driving through these areas or plan an alternate route!

5 PM this afternoon through7 AM Wednesday morning




