Today will start of warmer than normal with high humidity. A cold front will arrive into the northernmost counties by around 9 AM and slowly work south across the region. Showers and thunderstorms will be expected near and behind the front, but rain chances in the midday hours are expected to be lower than for the northern counties. Later in the day when the front moves south of San Antonio, rain chances could increase again with southern counties seeing good chances of rain to continue into the nighttime hours. Only sporadic rainfall amounts of 1/4 to 1/2 inches are expected in the more populated areas of Austin, San Antonio, and Del Rio, but some isolated amounts over an inch will be possible north and east of a line from Fredericskburg to Austin to Cuero.



The approach of a weak cold front will produce a Marginal Risk of severe weather across most of Deep South Texas and a portion of the Rio Grande Valley later today through tonight.



Marginal Risk of Severe Thunderstorms, mainly tonight into Thursday with Damaging Wind being the main threat. Large Hail and an isolated Tornado can not be ruled out.

Marginal Risk of Excessive Rainfall tonight through Thursday with Localized Flooding Possible. Rainfall totals of 1-2 inches are expected with higher amounts of 3-4 inches possible.

The chance of showers and thunderstorms will increase this afternoon with a medium to high (55-85%) chance by tonight through Thursday as a cold front moves through South Texas. Heavy rainfall with totals of 1-2 inches expected and isolated 3-4 inches possible. Areas that receive higher amounts could lead to localized flooding, especially urban areas and low lying areas. Some of the storms may become strong to severe with damaging wind being the main threat. Large hail and isolated tornados are also possible.

A few strong storms may occur capable of producing small hail, frequent lightning, and gusty winds. Rainfall totals will generally range from 0.5 to 1.5 inches, though a few locations in the southeast could see 3+ inch totals.





Showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop Wednesday as a cold front moves slowly across southeast Texas. Highest rainfall totals of 1-2 inches with locally higher amounts of 3-5 inches are expected mainly along and south of I-10. Minor flooding of urban and low lying areas will be possible. A few storms could become strong to severe with isolated damaging wind gusts being the main threat.



Showers and thunderstorms that form on Wednesday and Wednesday night will have the potential to produce high rainfall rates in a short period of time. This will bring about a Marginal Risk (level 1 out of 4) or between a 5 and 14 percent chance of seeing flash flooding.

Chance for Heavy Rainfall tonight into Wednesday



A few rounds of showers and thunderstorms, some with heavy rainfall, are expected to affect parts of west

central Texas through Wednesday evening. This could

cause localized flash flooding south of I-20.










Burn Ban


