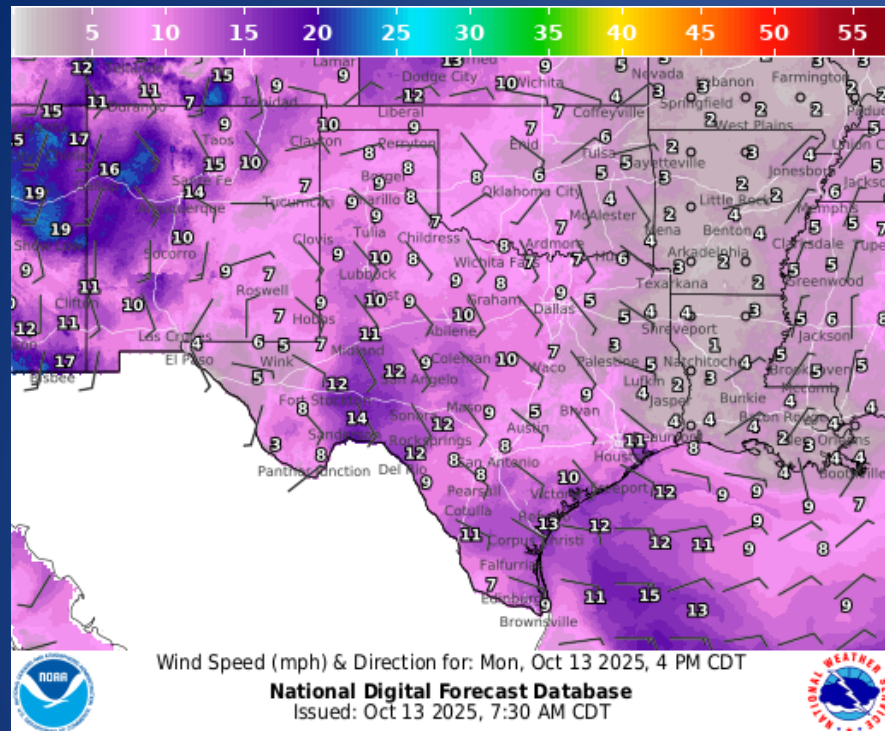

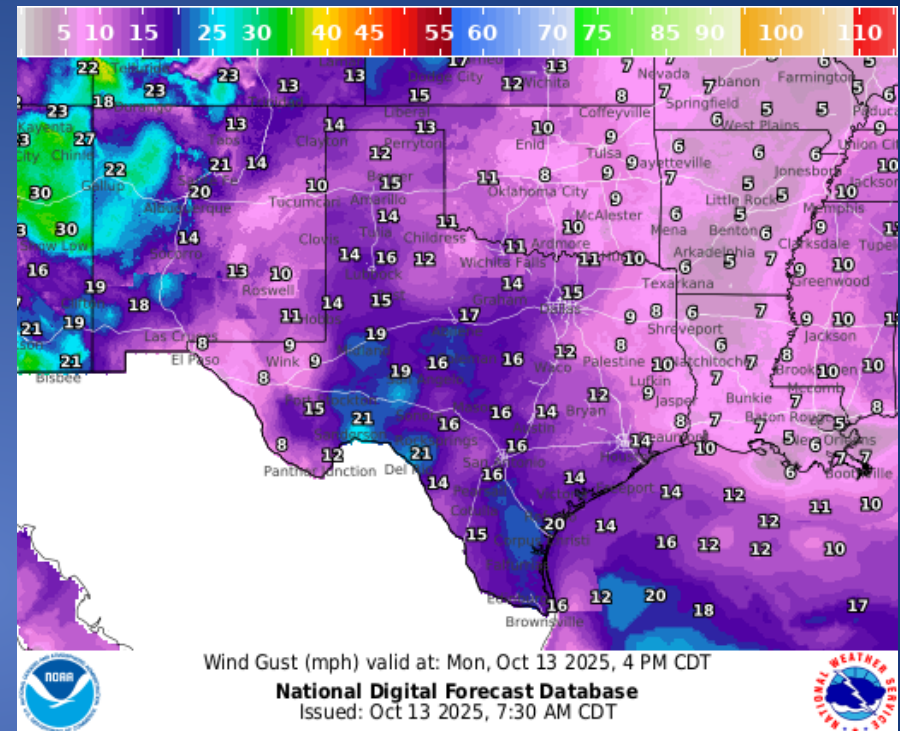

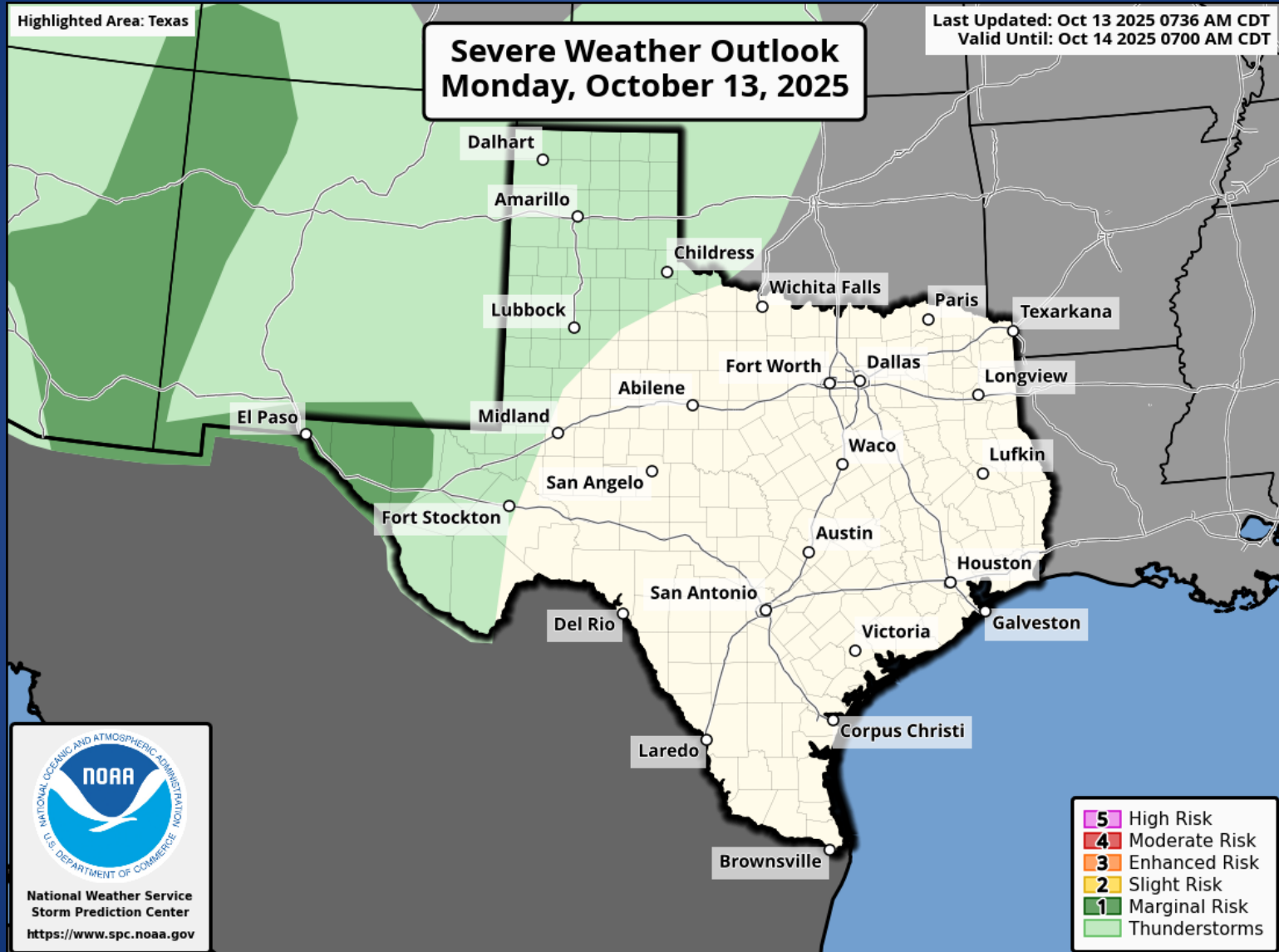

- Beach Erosion & Coastal Inundation Possible

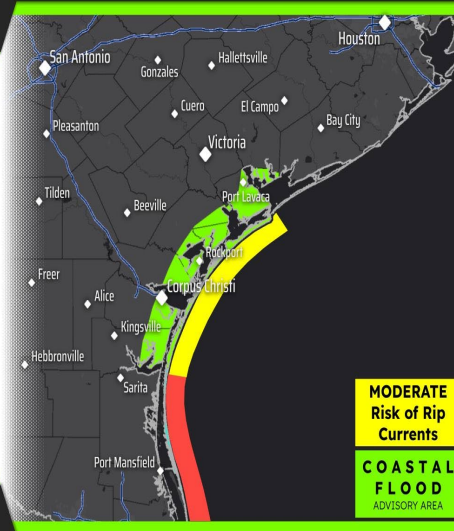

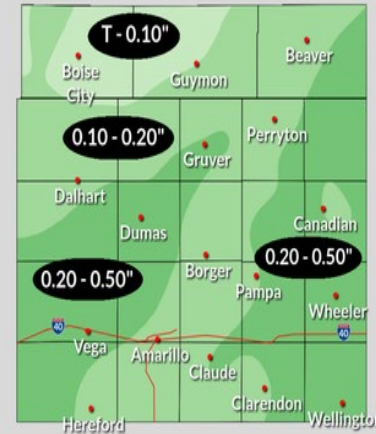

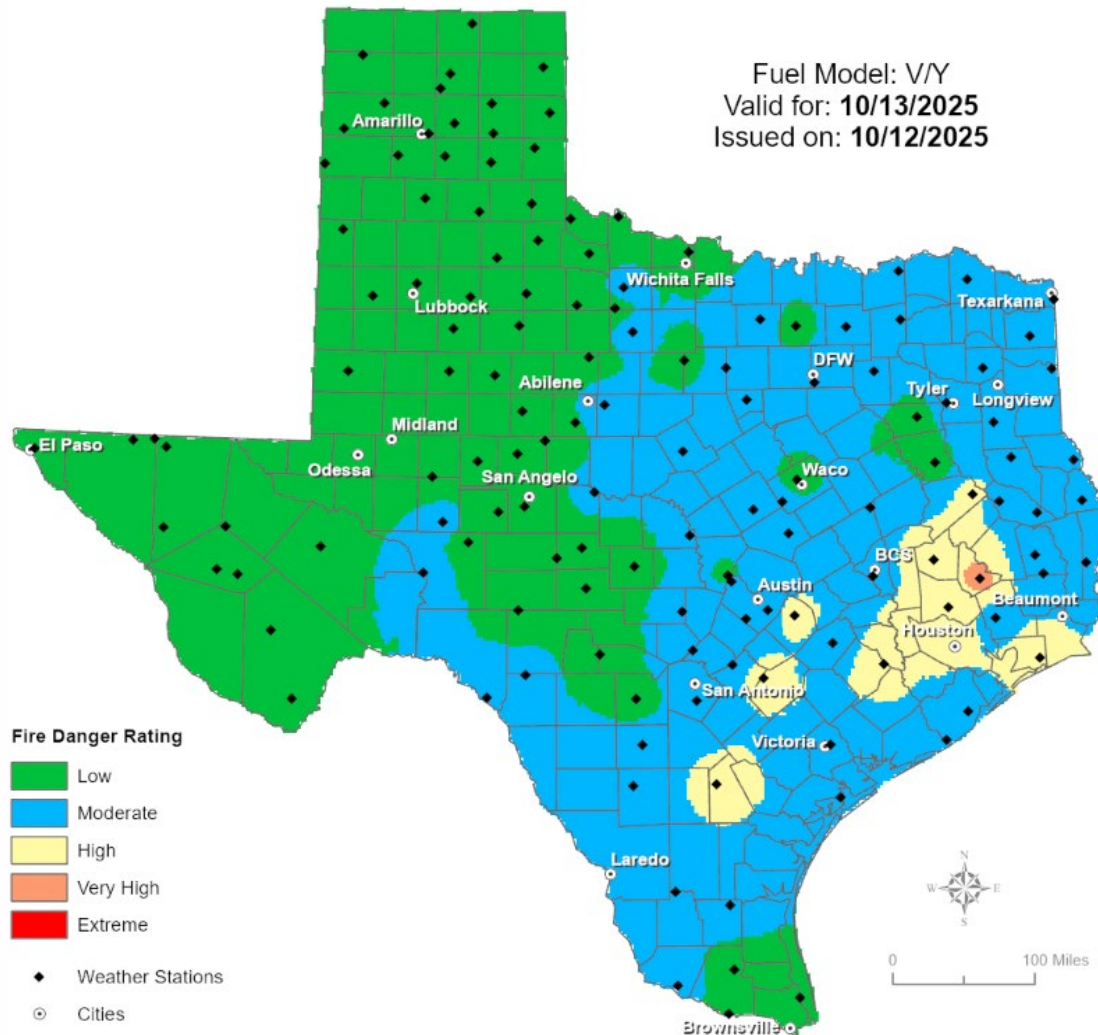

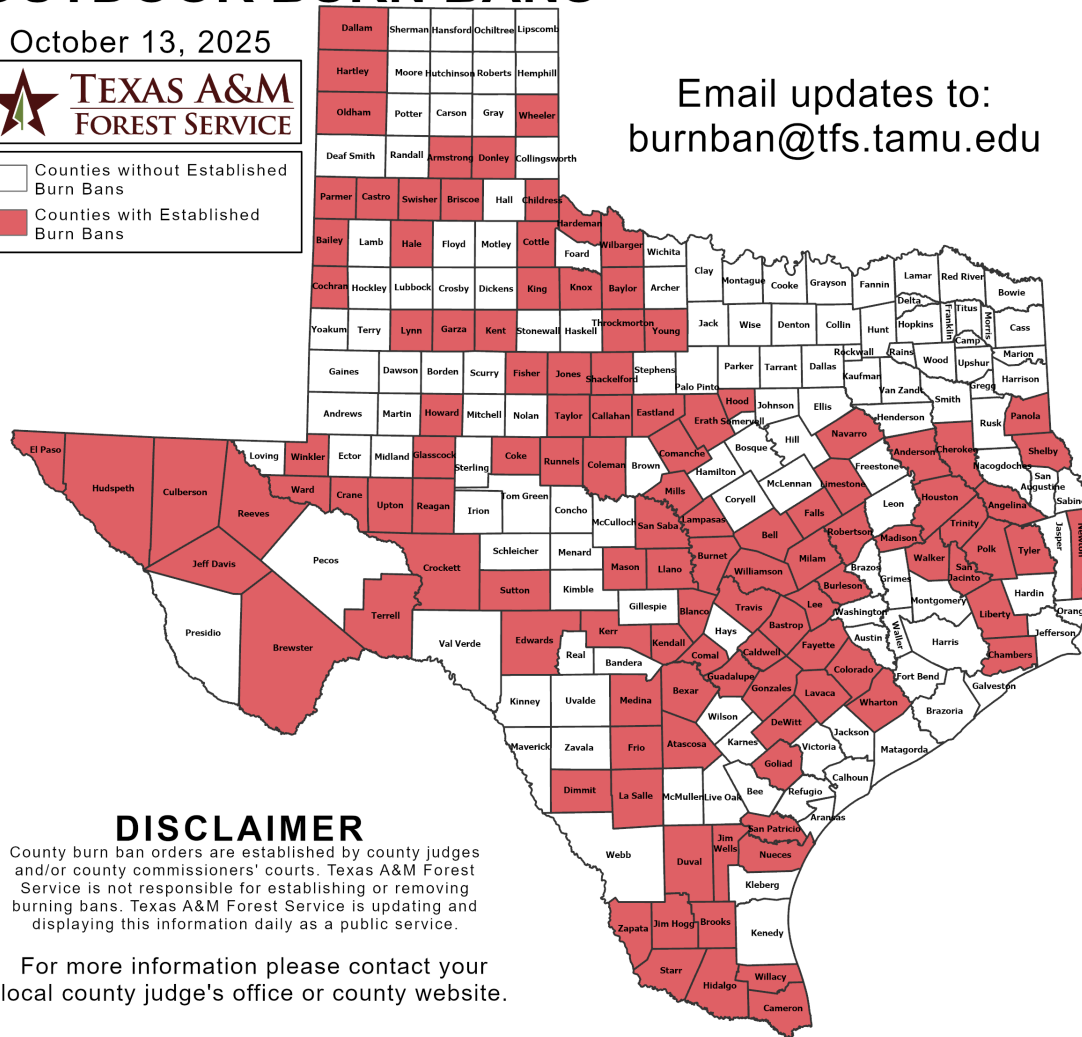

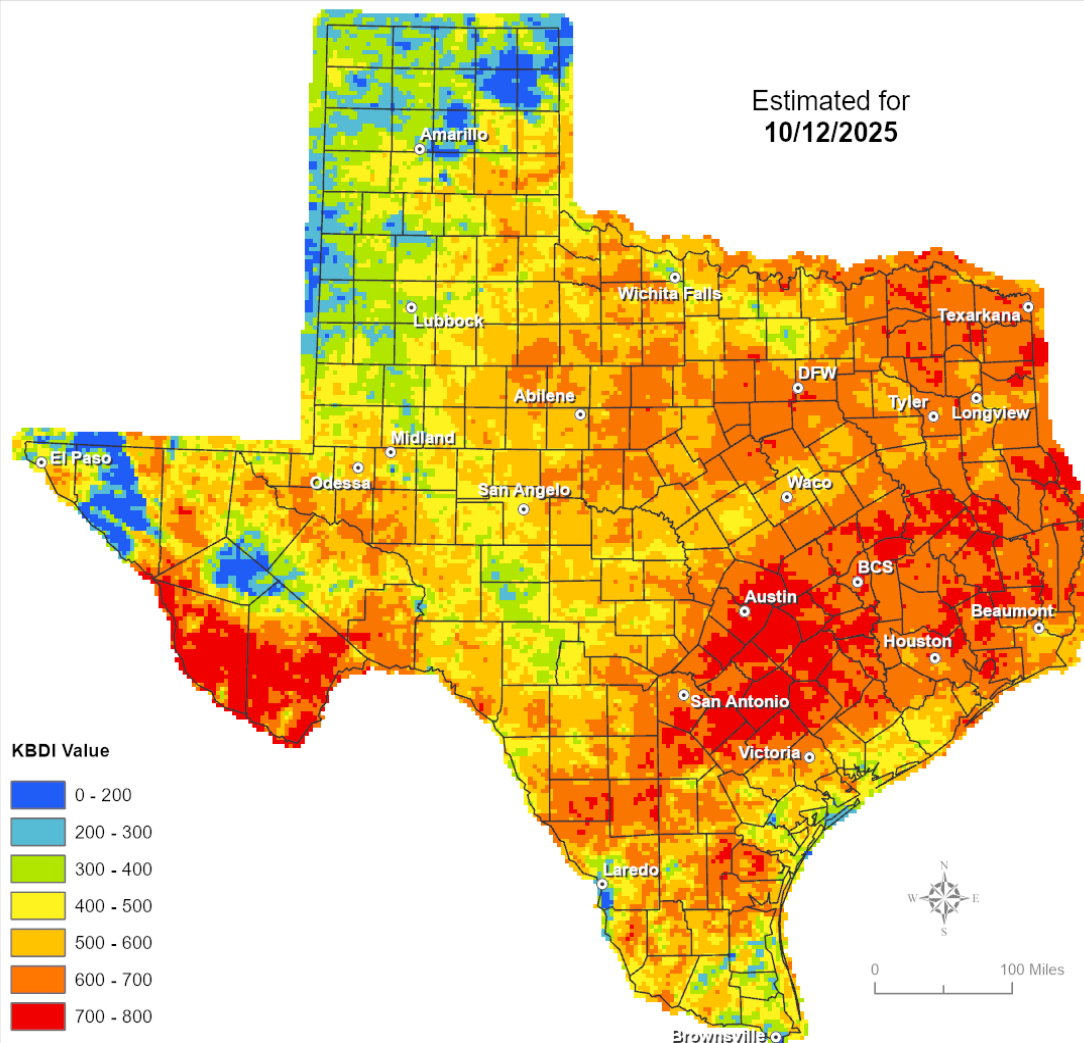

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

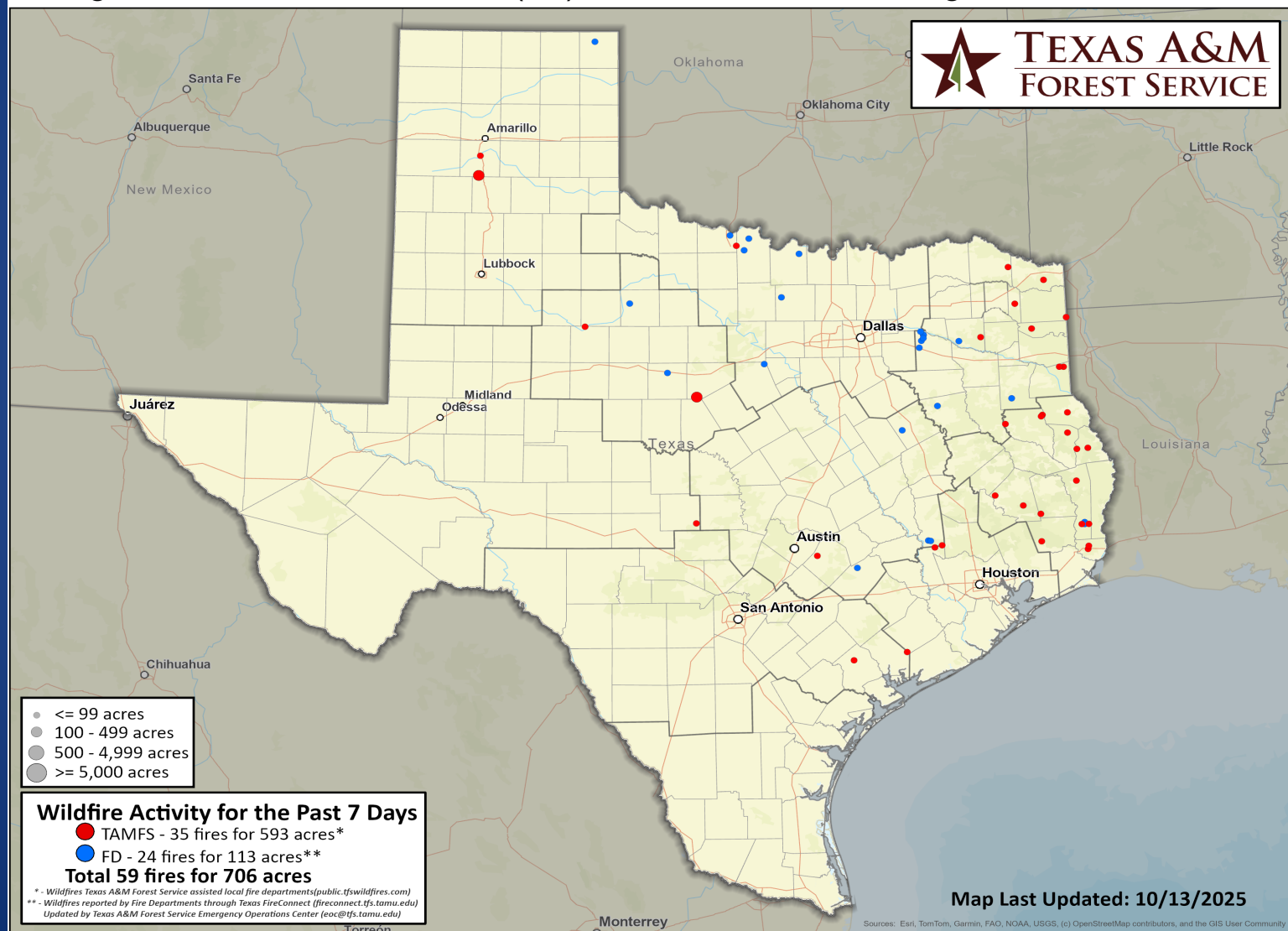
