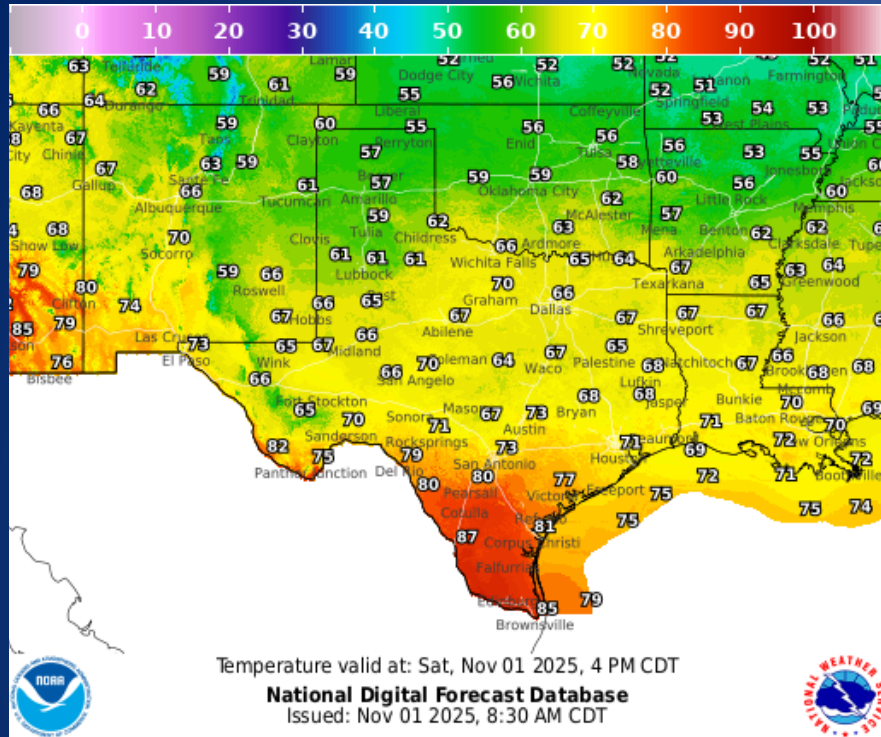

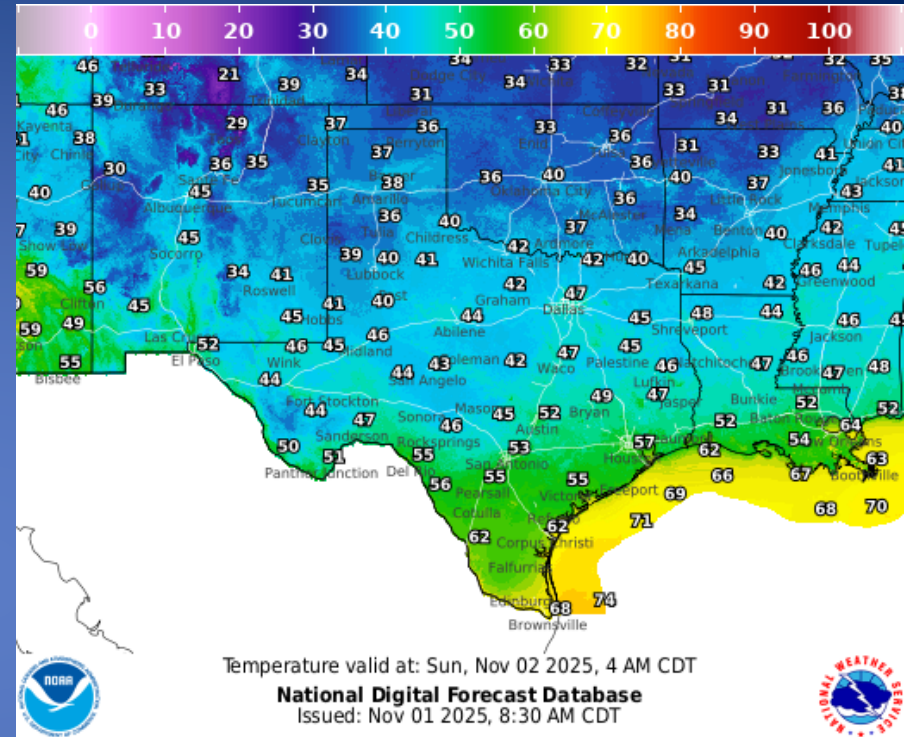

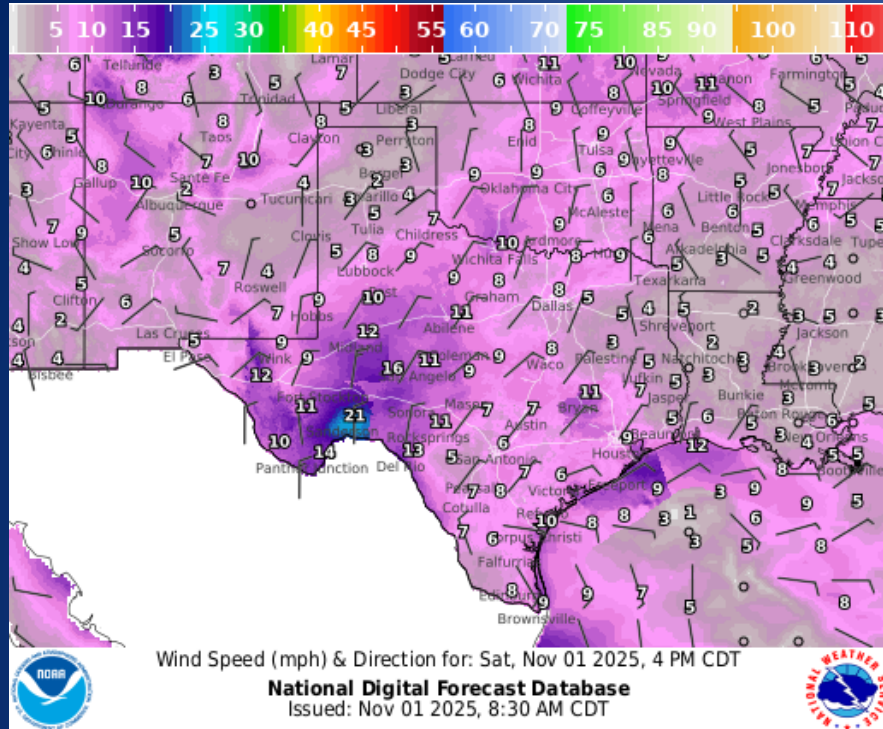

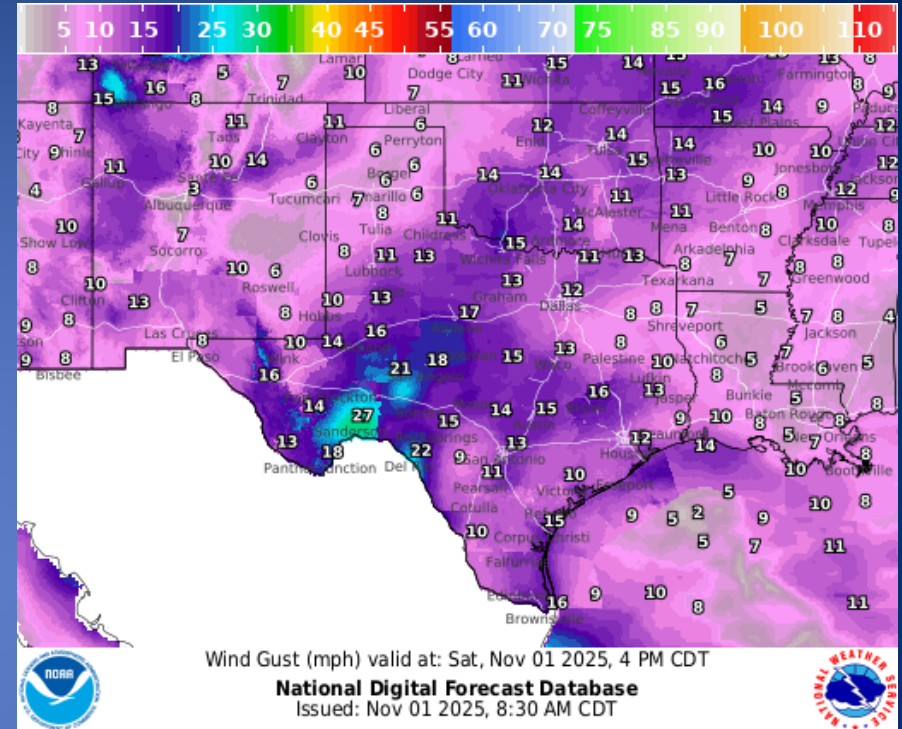

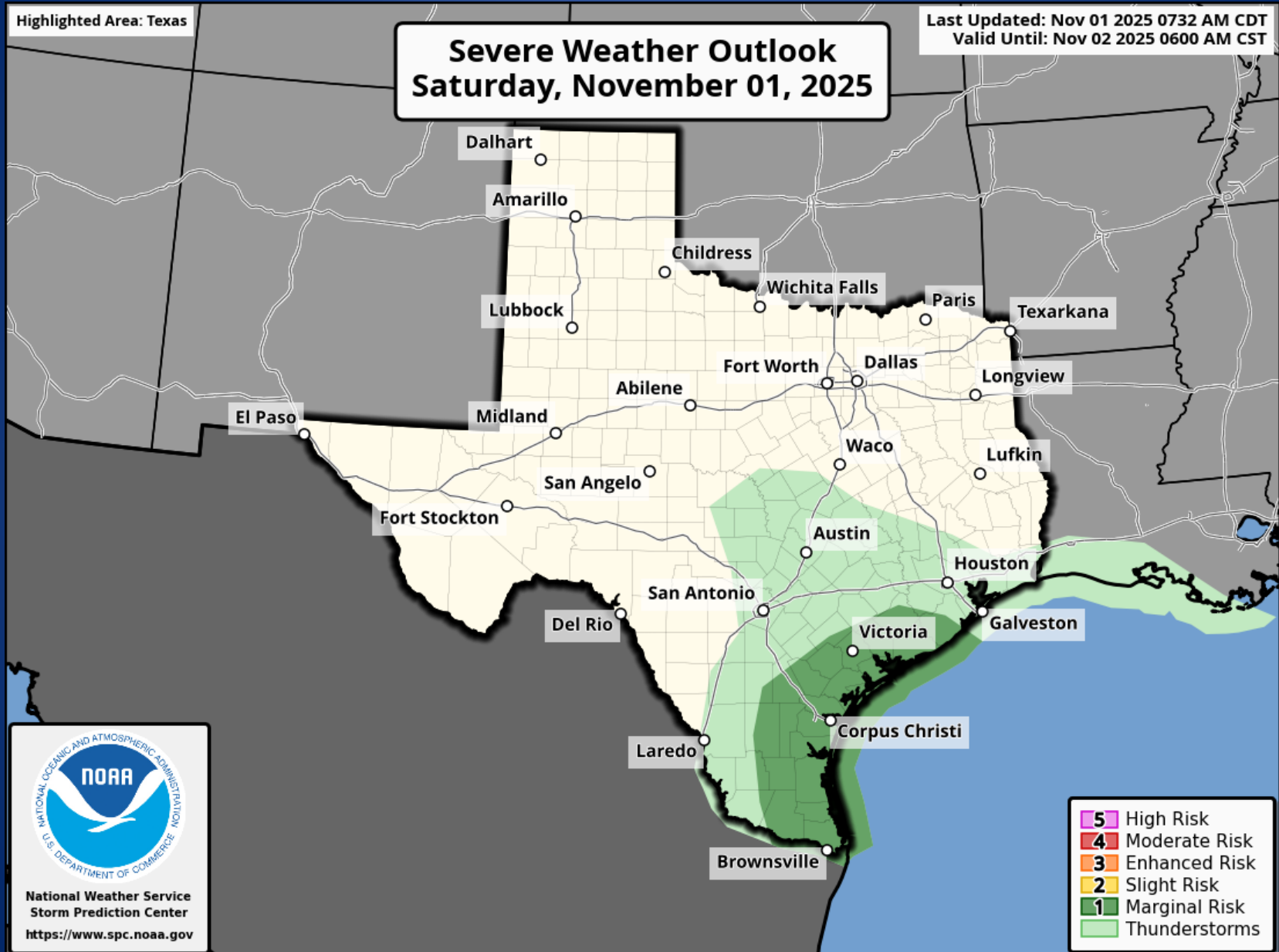

Key Messages

- Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms are expected to develop near and south of I-10 on this afternoon into the early evening as a cold front pushes through Southeast Texas.
- An isolated strong thunderstorm or two will be possible.
- **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5)** of severe weather for locations generally south of Palacios.

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A weather graphic from NWS Houston/Galveston showing a Marginal Risk (Level 1 of 5) for isolated strong storms on Saturday afternoon/early evening. The risk is concentrated generally south of Palacios, indicated by the dark green color on the map. Key messages state that scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms are expected to develop south of I-10 as a cold front moves through Southeast Texas. Potential impacts include hail and gusty winds. The graphic advises remaining weather-aware and checking the forecast for updates. An isolated strong to severe storm or two will be possible, especially along the coast. Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) of severe weather for locations generally along and south of I-10.

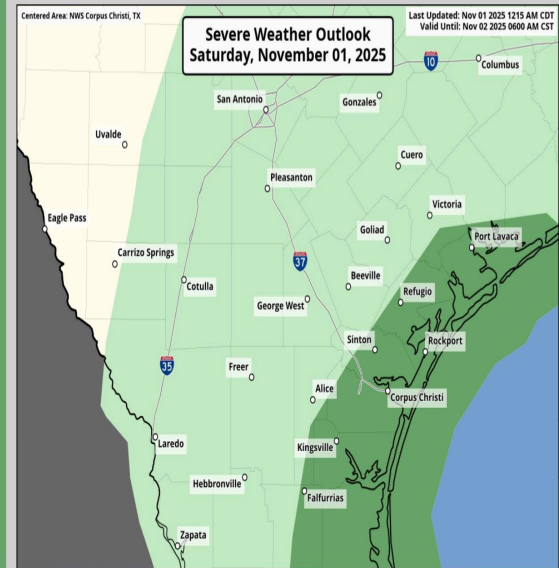

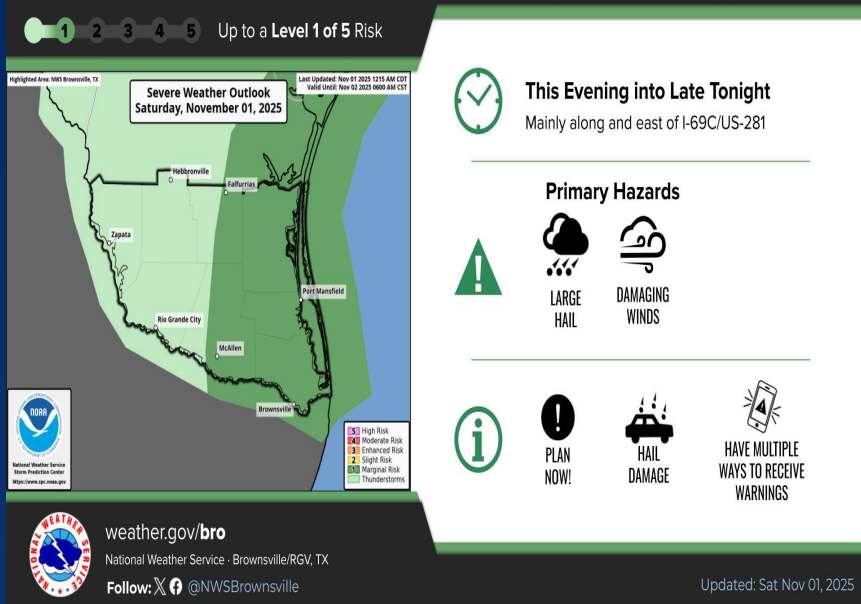

A system moving through Texas will bring scattered showers and thunderstorms to the Coastal Bend late this afternoon through around midnight, mainly near the coast and over the Gulf waters. A few storms could become strong to severe, producing isolated damaging winds or hail. The Storm Prediction Center has placed coastal areas under a Marginal Risk (Level 1 of 5) for severe weather.

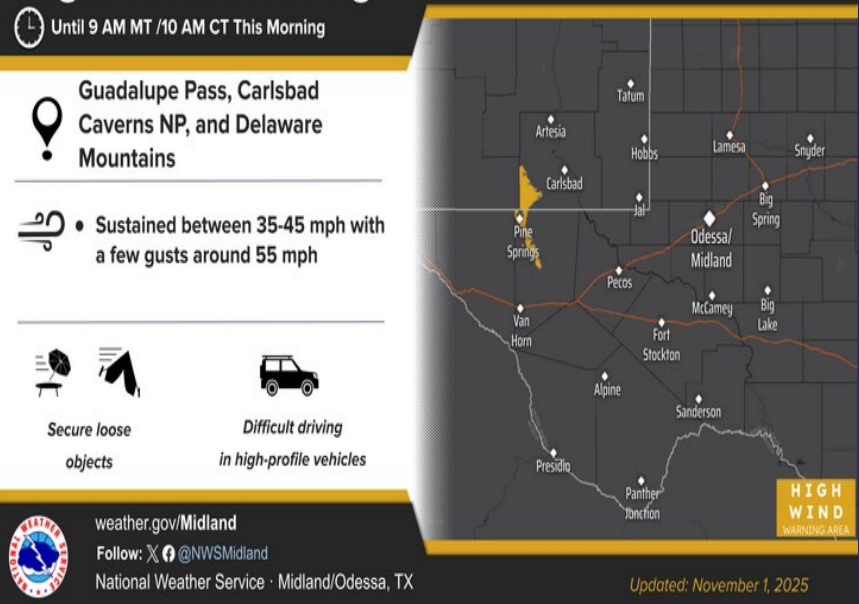
Hazardous Weather

Isolated Severe Storms This Evening into Tonight



Isolated severe thunderstorms are possible along and east of I-69C/US-281 this evening into tonight. Large hail and damaging winds are the primary threat in addition to frequent lightning and brief periods of heavy rain.

High Wind Warning



A High Wind Warning is in effect for the Guadalupe Mountains of Eddy County NM and the Guadalupe and Delaware Mountains of TX, including Carlsbad Caverns National Park and Guadalupe Pass until 10 AM CDT or 9 AM MDT. Northerly winds sustained between 35-45 mph with gusts around 55 mph can be expected early this morning behind a cold front. Travel may be difficult, especially for high profile vehicles.

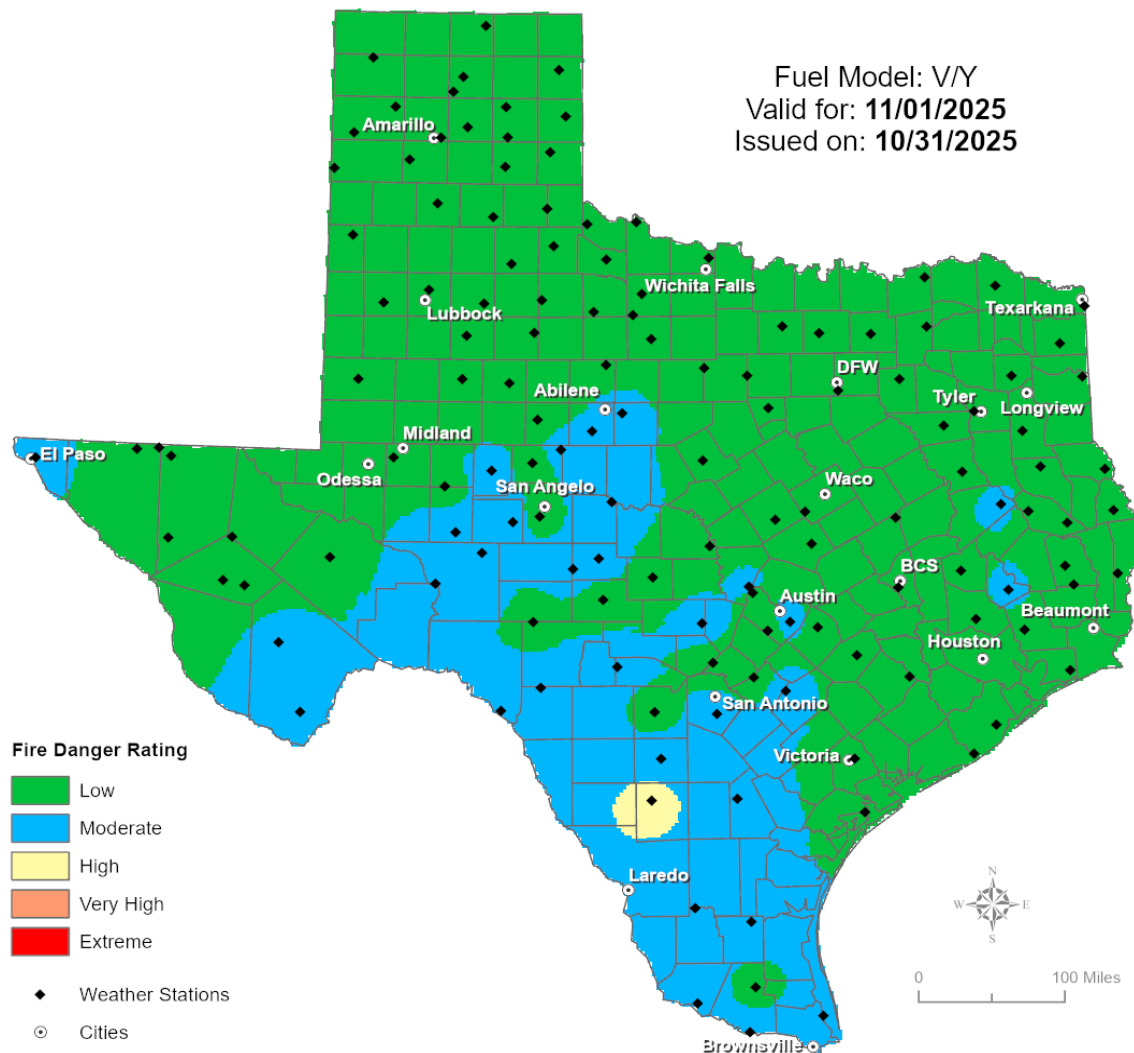

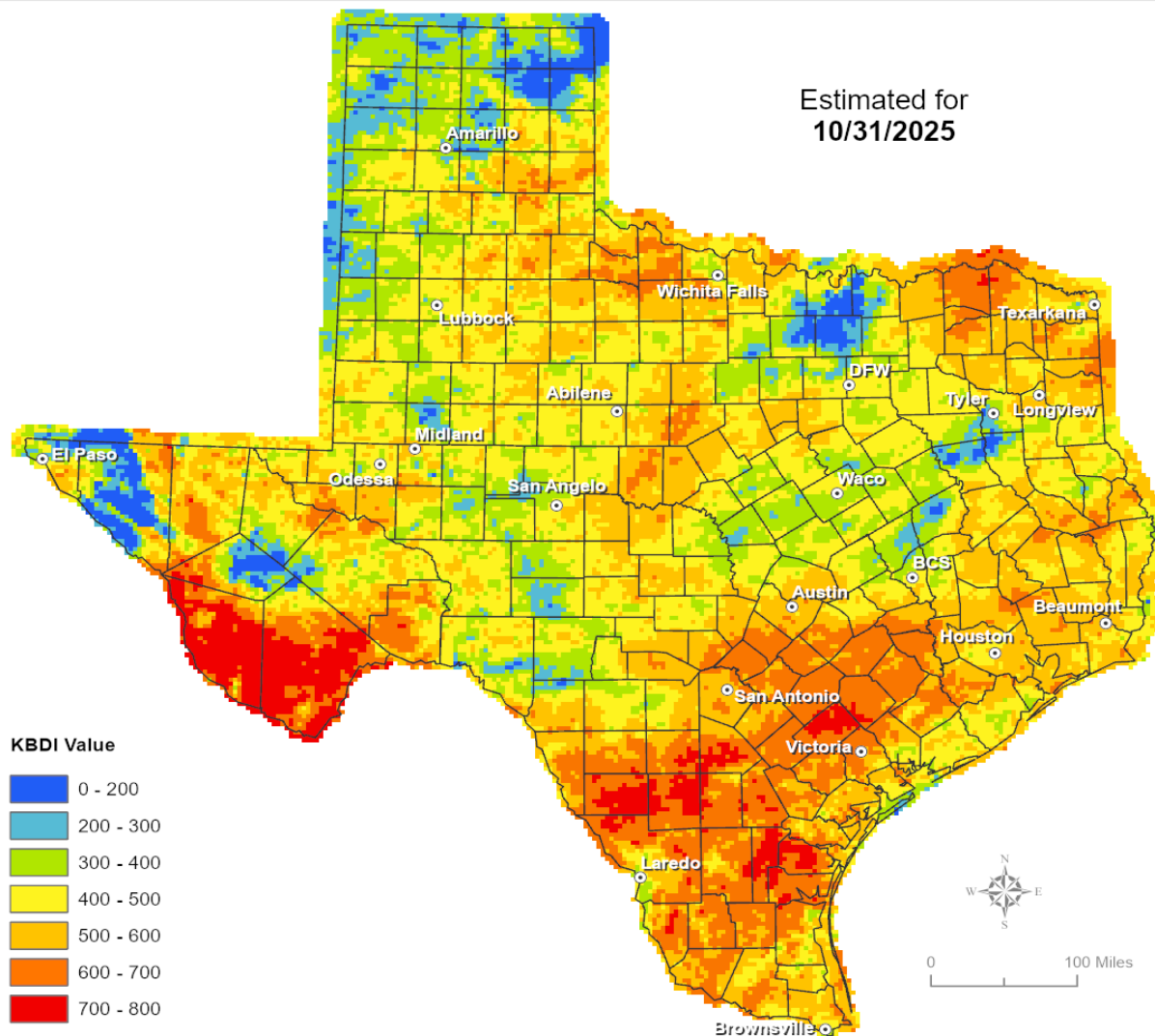

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

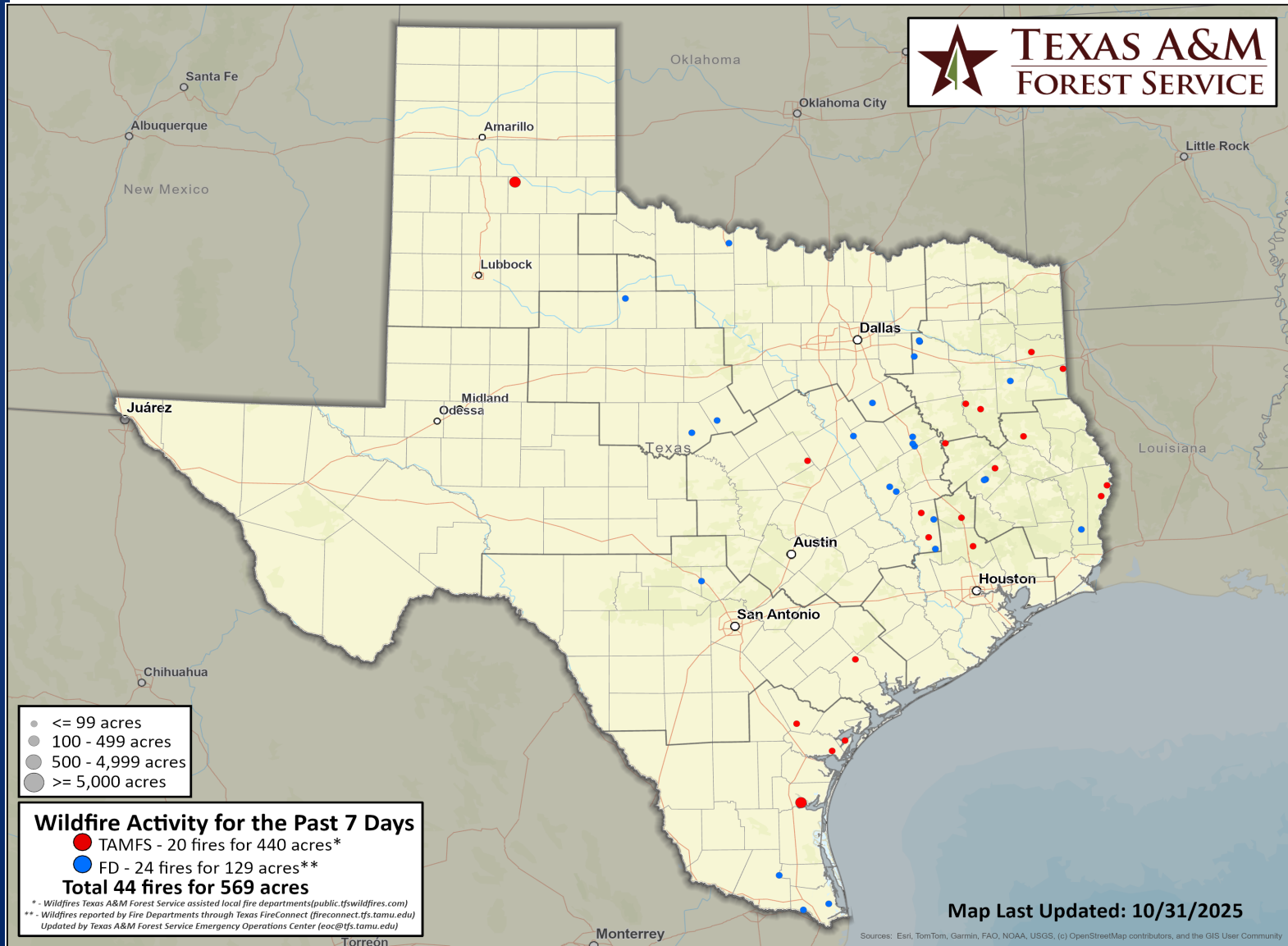

Report of 671 (+17) fires and 98,386 (+303) acres have been burned this year. There are 136 (-5) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 206 (+3) counties with an average over 400.
