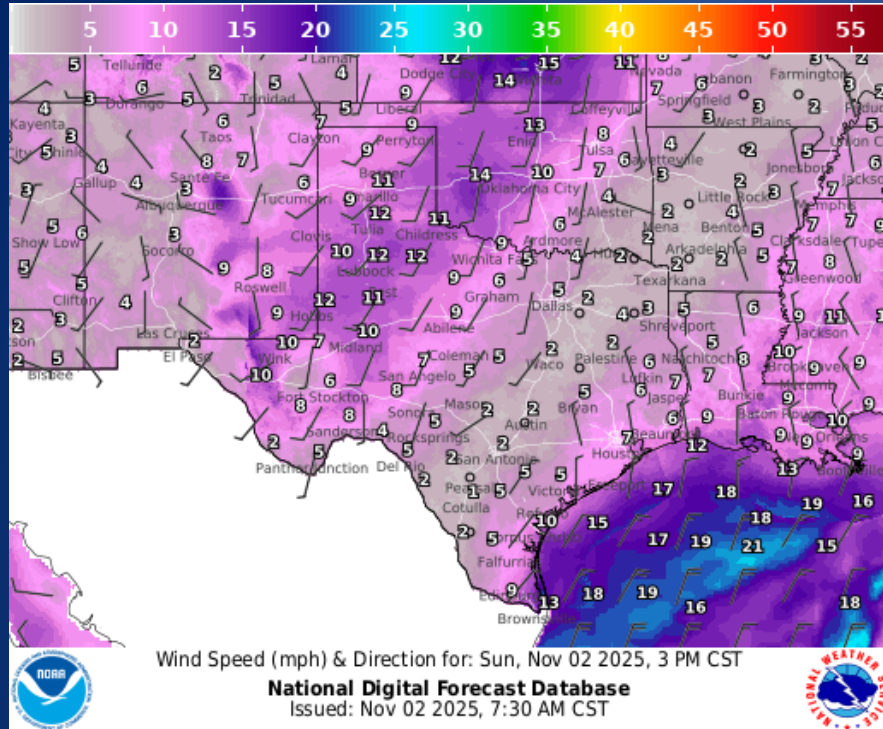

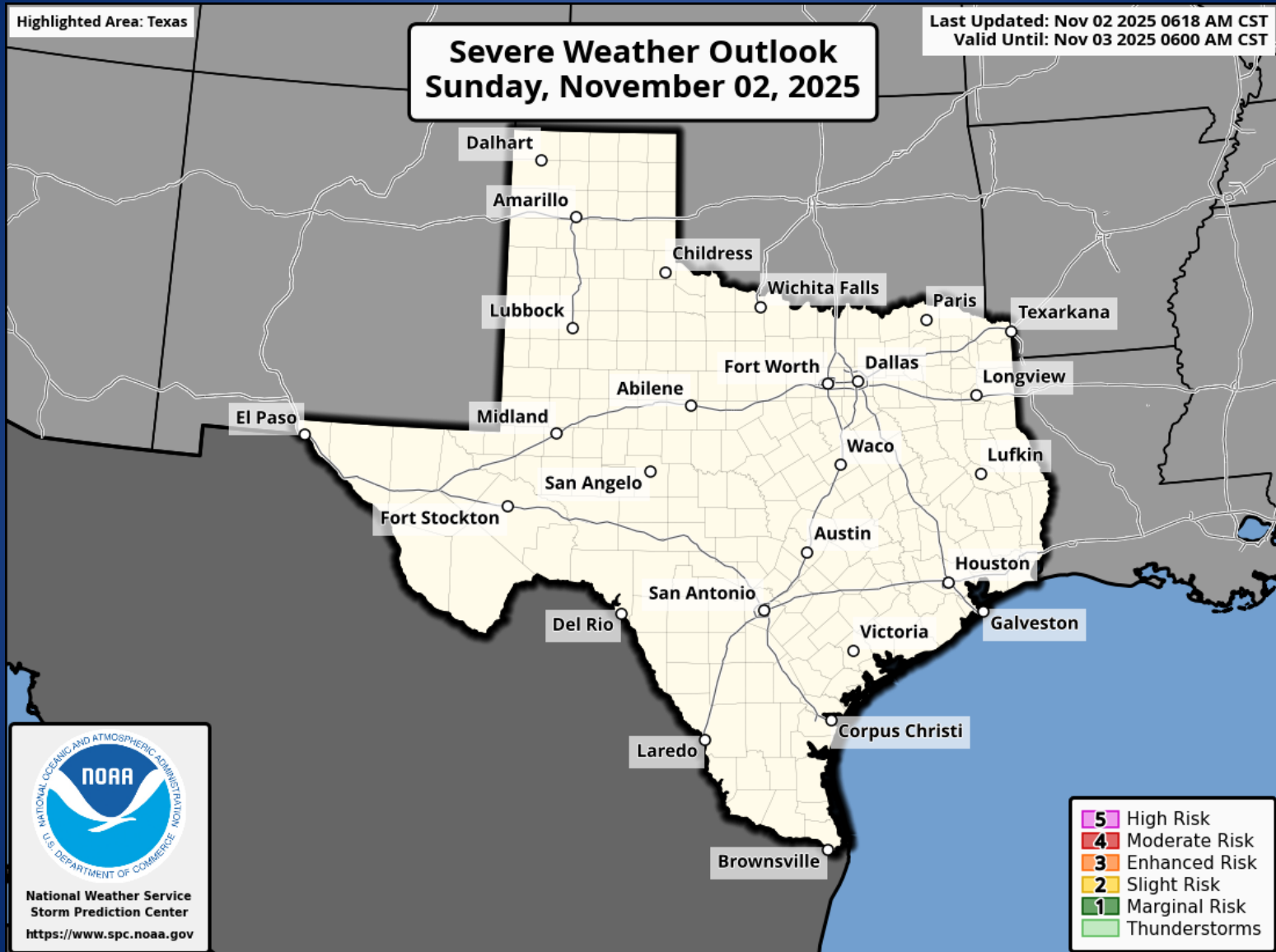


Wind Speeds

- NE 15-25 knots, with gusts up to 30 knots



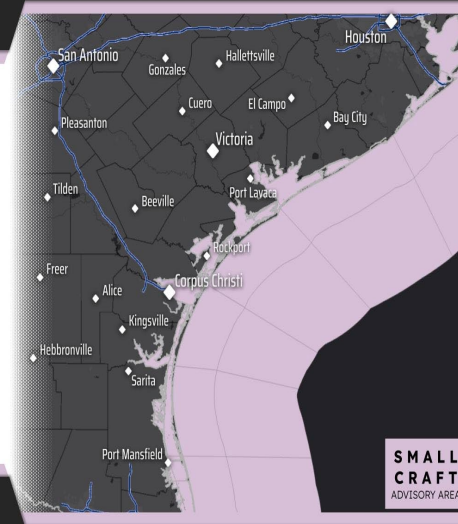

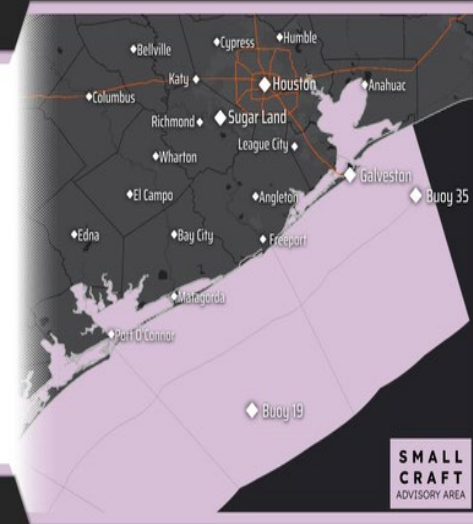

The National Weather Service Houston/Galveston has issued this Small Craft Advisory beginning at 7pm due to strong Northeast winds (15-25 knots with gusts to 30 knots) and high seas (4-7 feet) from High Island down to the Matagorda Ship Channel. Inexperienced mariners, especially those operating smaller vessels, should avoid navigating in these conditions until the advisory expires this evening. Always check the latest marine forecast before heading out on the water.

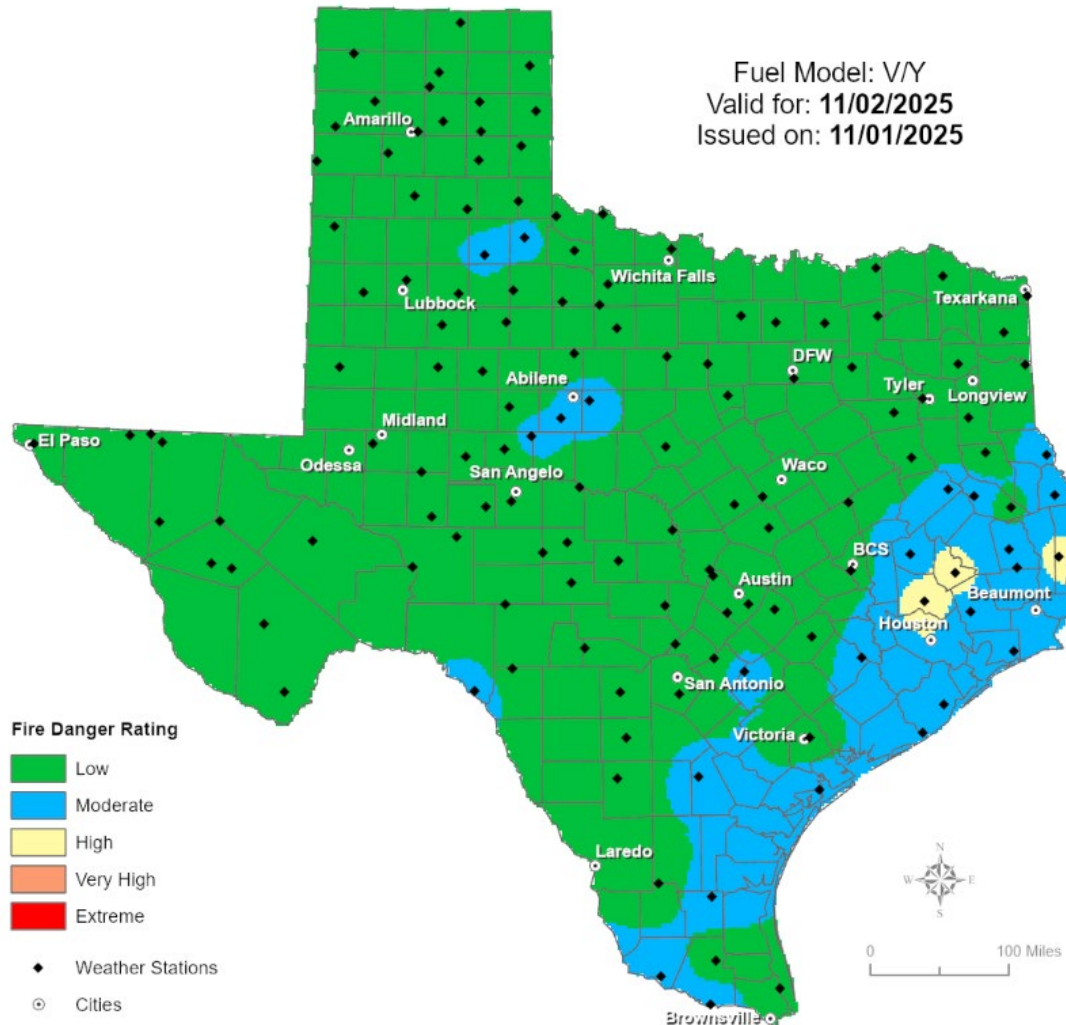

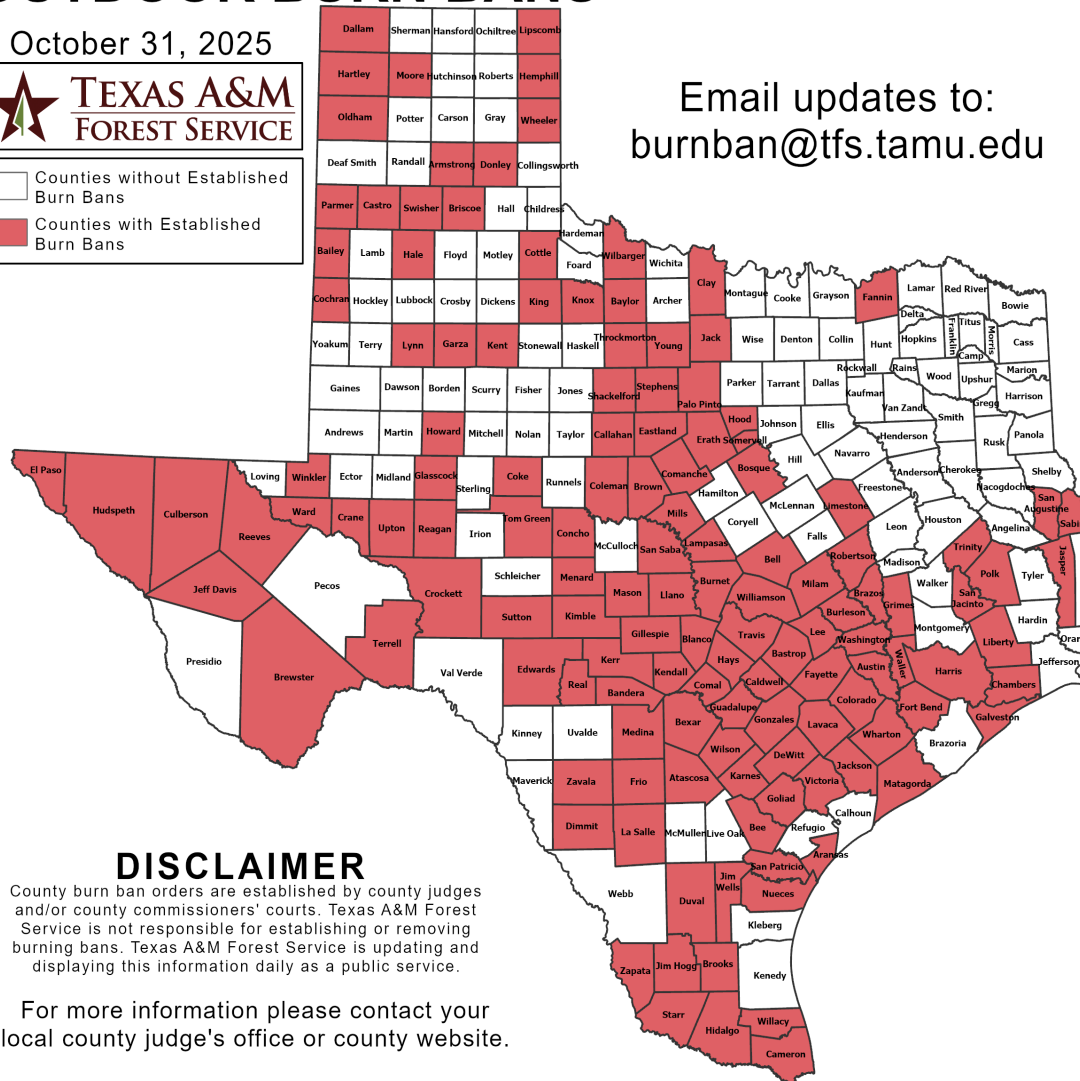

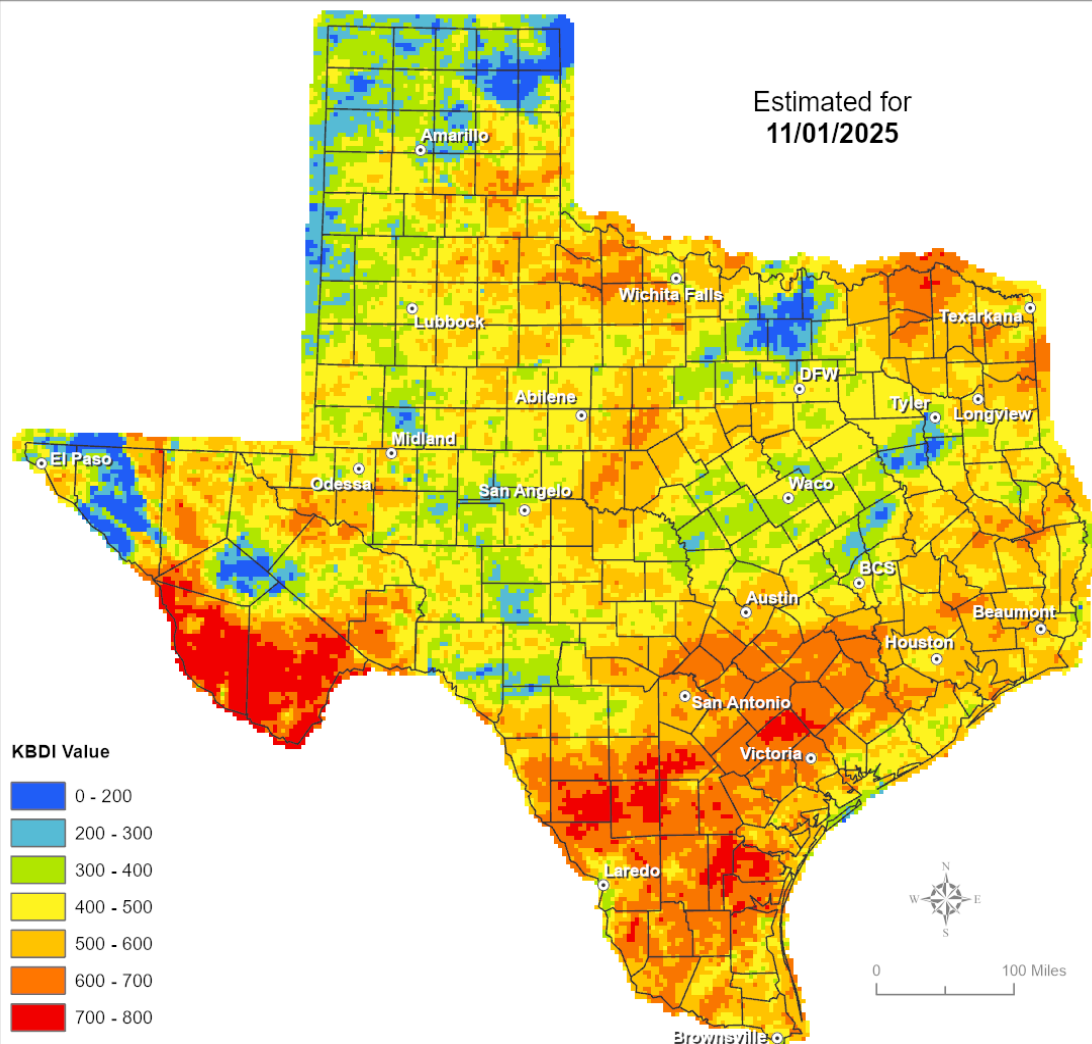

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

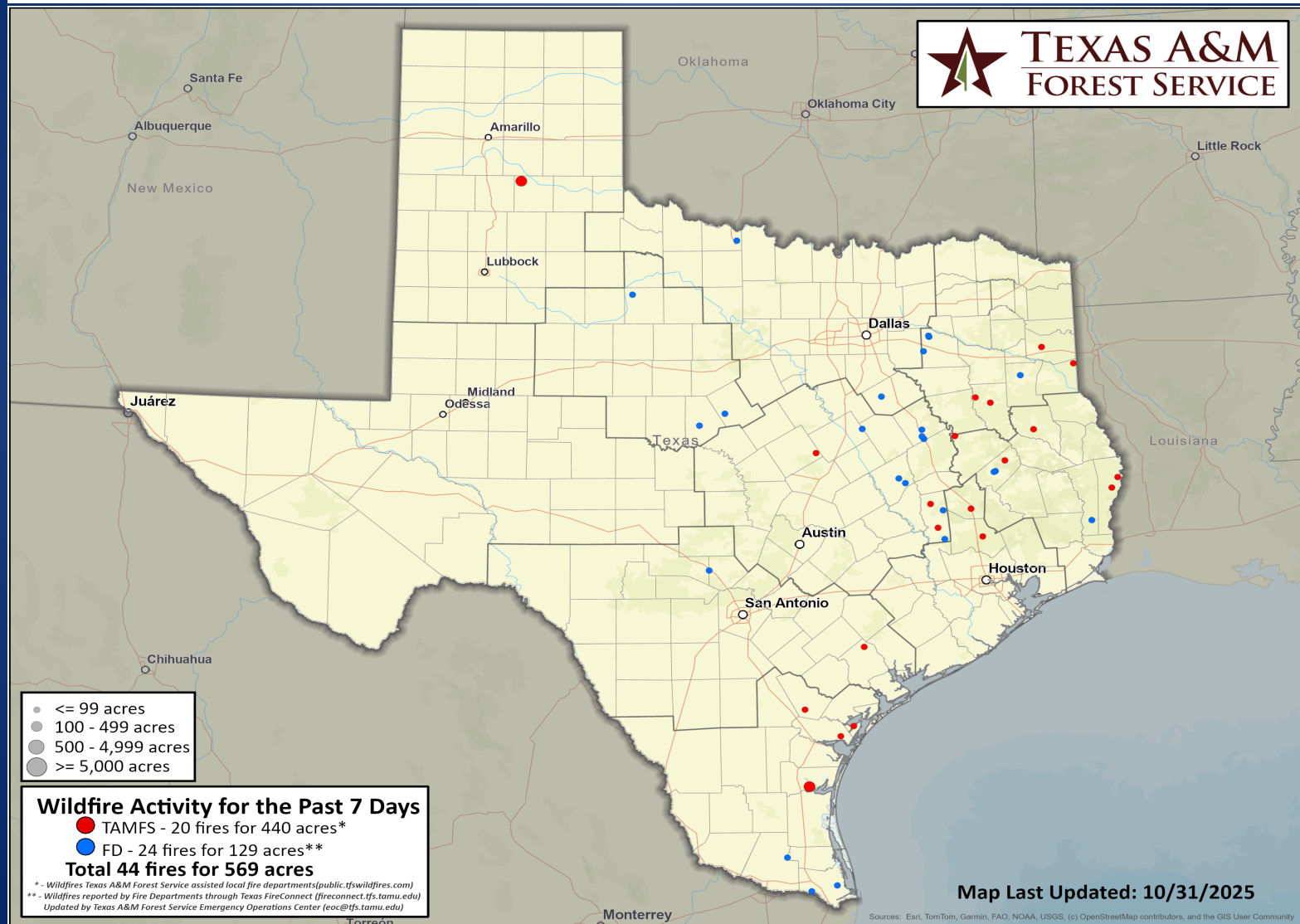

Report of 671 (No change) fires and 98,386 (No change) acres have been burned this year. There are 136 (No change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 207 (+1) counties with an average over 400.
