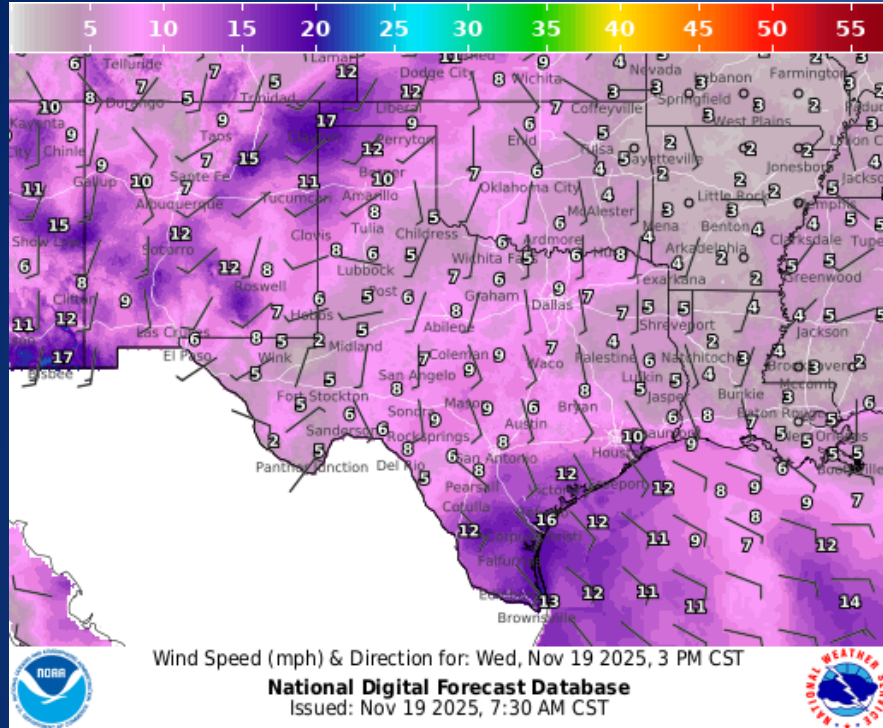

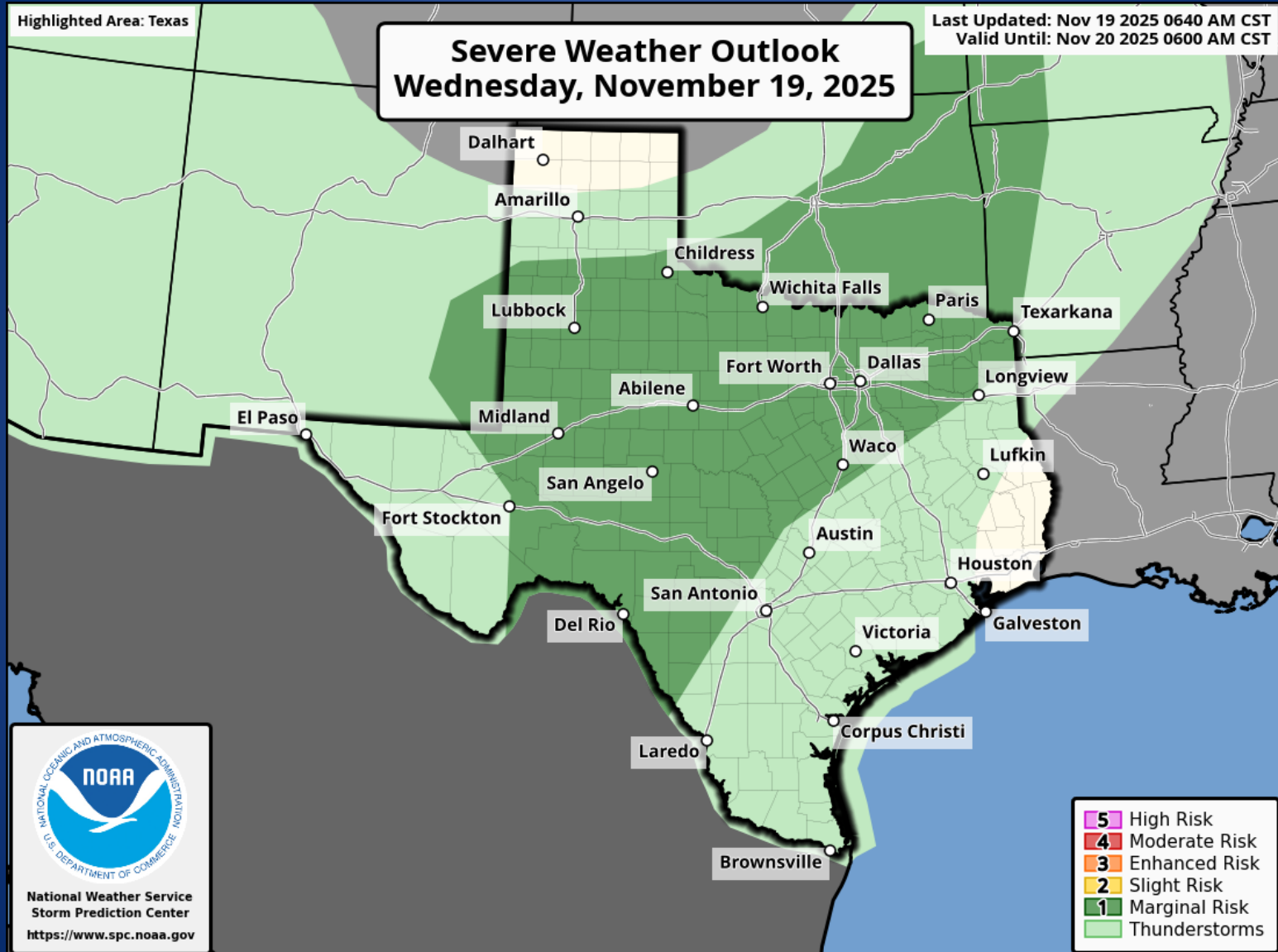

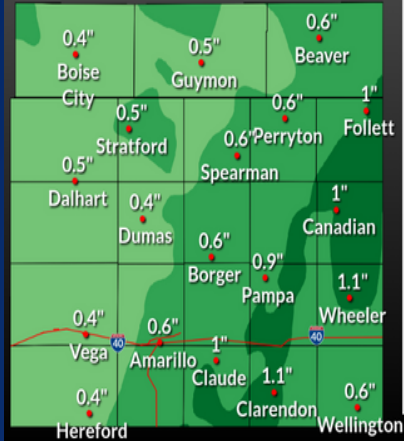

Updated: November 19, 2025

Multiple rounds of showers and thunderstorms are anticipated starting Wednesday and lasting through Friday morning, but the heaviest rainfall is expected to occur on Thursday. There is a very low chance for localized flooding which is mostly focused on the eastern and central Texas Panhandle... especially for flood prone locations such as urban areas. There is still some uncertainty about the track of the weather system which could cause some of the details in these graphics to change slightly over the next 24-36 hours. Stay tuned!

A storm system will move across the area bringing locally heavy rainfall late Wednesday night though early Friday. A Flood Watch is in effect from 12 AM Thursday through 6 AM Friday. Rainfall totals of 1 to 3 inches can be expected with isolated totals up to 6 inches are possible within the Watch area. Keep up with the forecast and remember to turn around, don't drown!

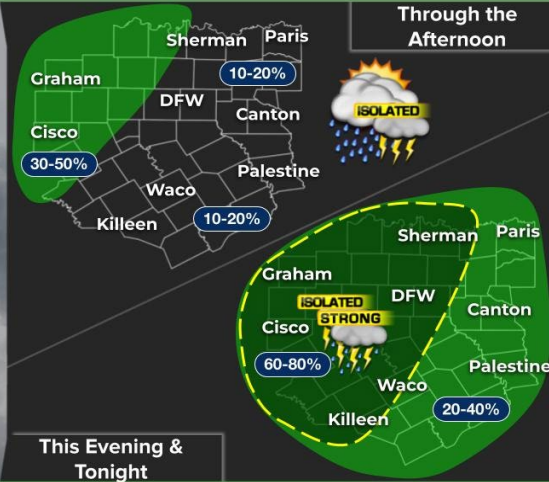
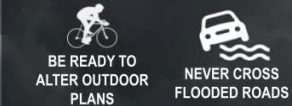
A few showers and an isolated storm or two may develop through the afternoon.

More widespread showers and storms develop late evening and overnight, with a low threat for large hail.

Storm Hazards:

Storms will increase in coverage from west to east in the early evening, with a threat for **isolated large hail**.

Heading into the evening, more widespread coverage will increase the threat for **locally heavy rain**.

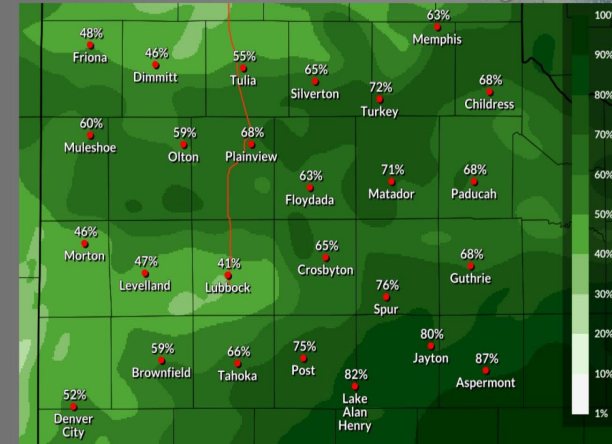

A precipitation-free morning will give way to increasing rain chances by the afternoon. Storms will become widespread this evening and persist through the night, especially west of I-35. A few strong storms cannot be ruled out with gusty winds and isolated large hail possible. Additionally, locally heavy rain may lead to minor flooding. Remember, never cross flooded roads!

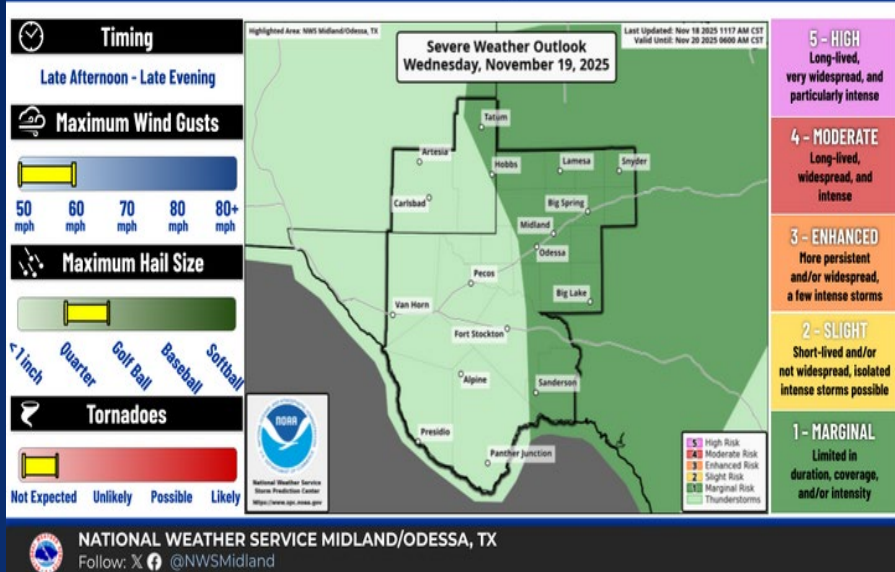

A marginal risk (1/5) of severe weather is in store across portions of the Permian Basin extending into the Stockton Plateau tomorrow afternoon and evening. The main threats for the strongest storms will be large hail and heavy rainfall.

Flood Watch

Flood Watch for the area southeast of a Brownwood to Brady to Menard to Sonora line.

Wednesday Evening through Thursday Night.

Expect rainfall totals of 2 to 4 inches for most of the Flood Watch area. Locally higher amounts over 6 inches are possible in some locations. Heavy rain may cause flash flooding across the Heartland, Hill Country, and Edwards Plateau.



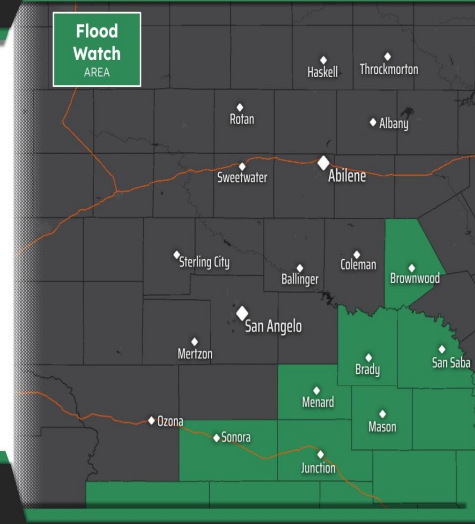

Heavy rainfall is possible across the Northwest Hill Country, Heartland, and Edwards Plateau is expected Wednesday evening through Thursday Night.

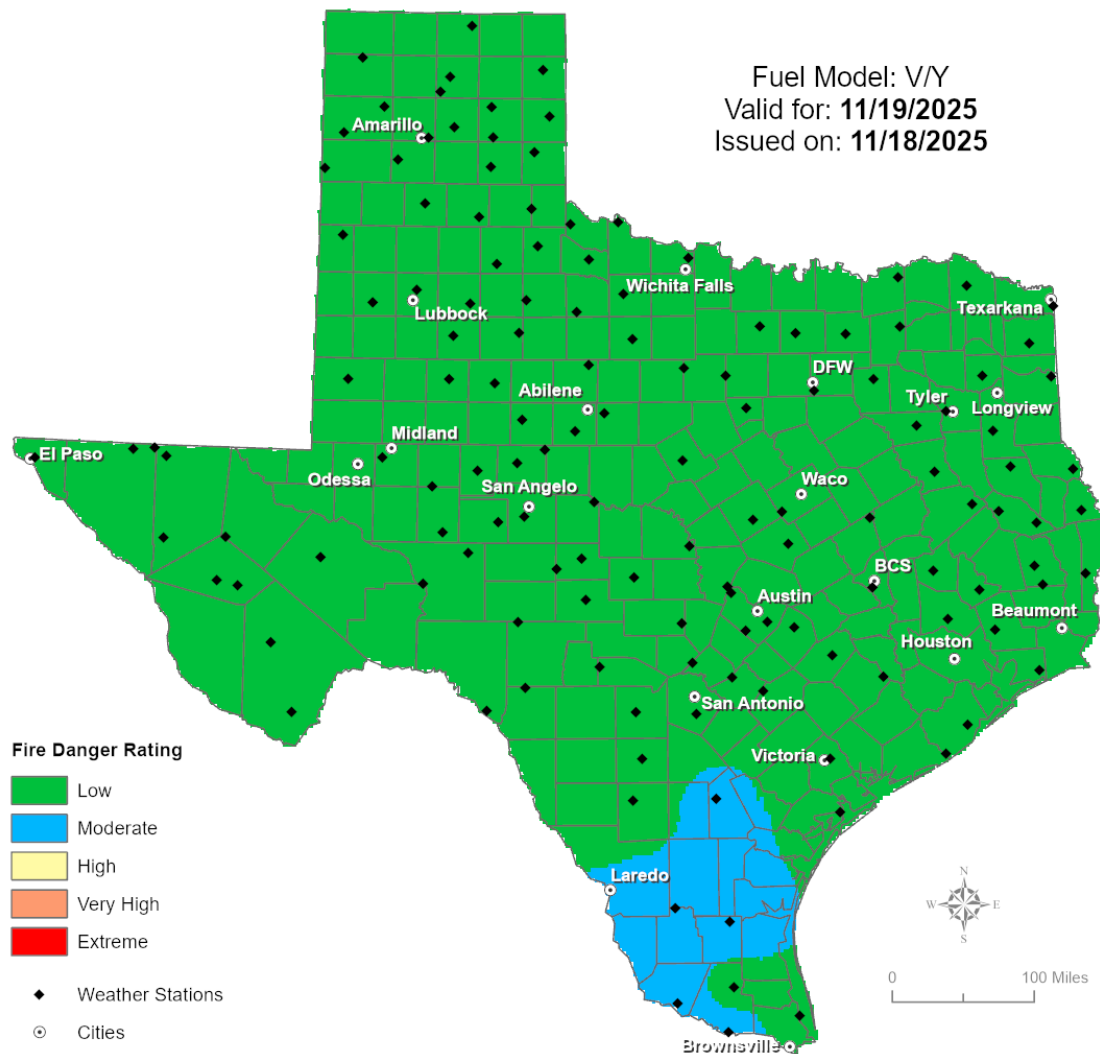

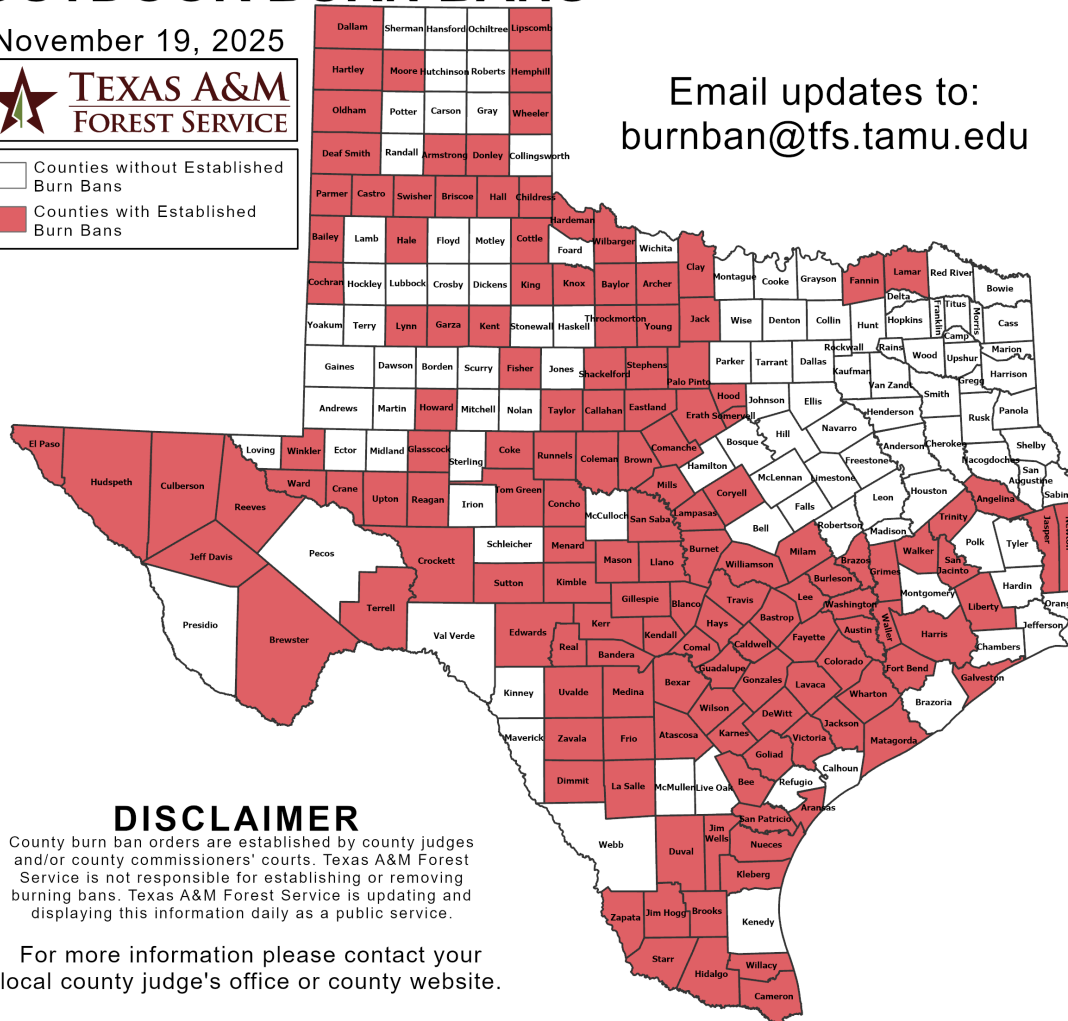

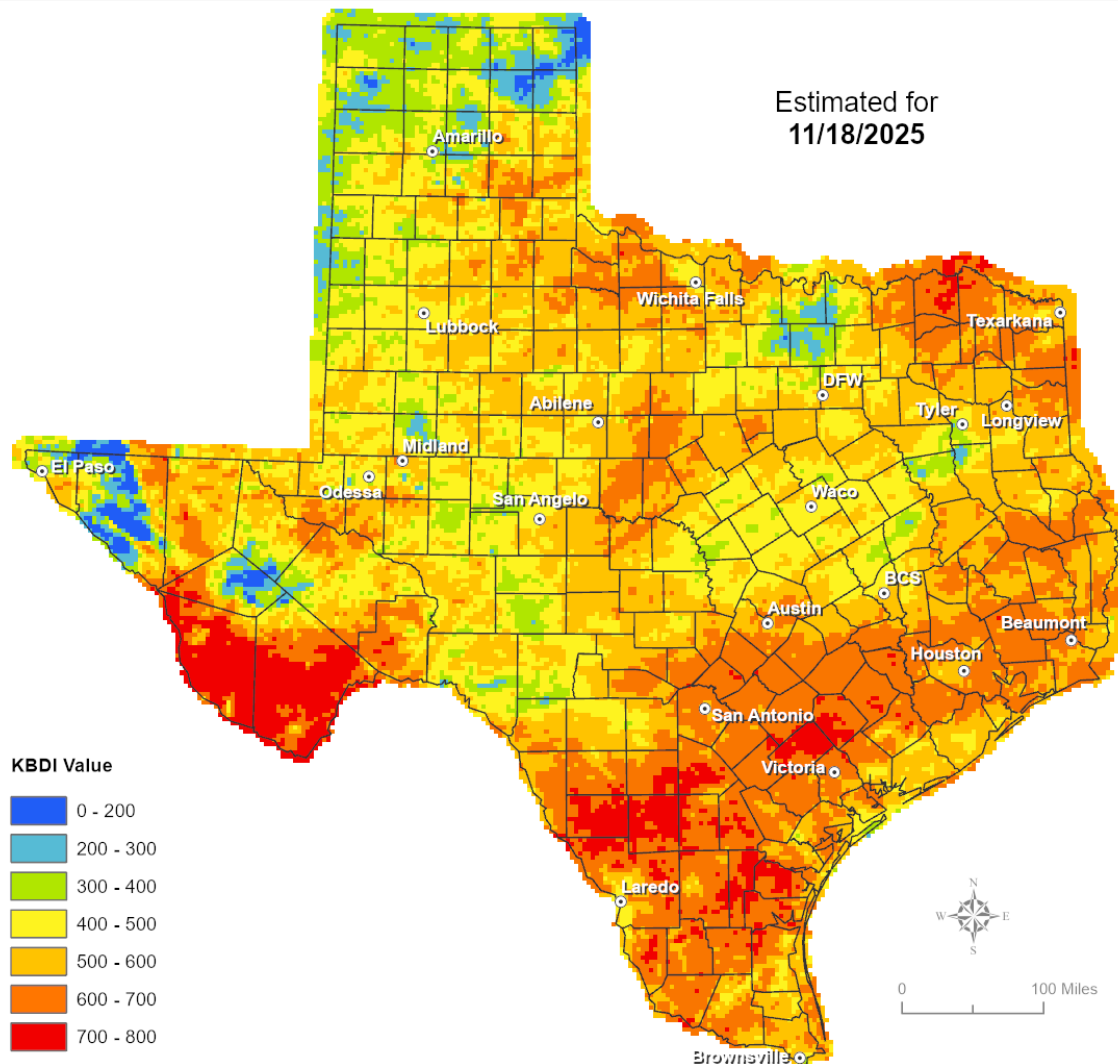

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

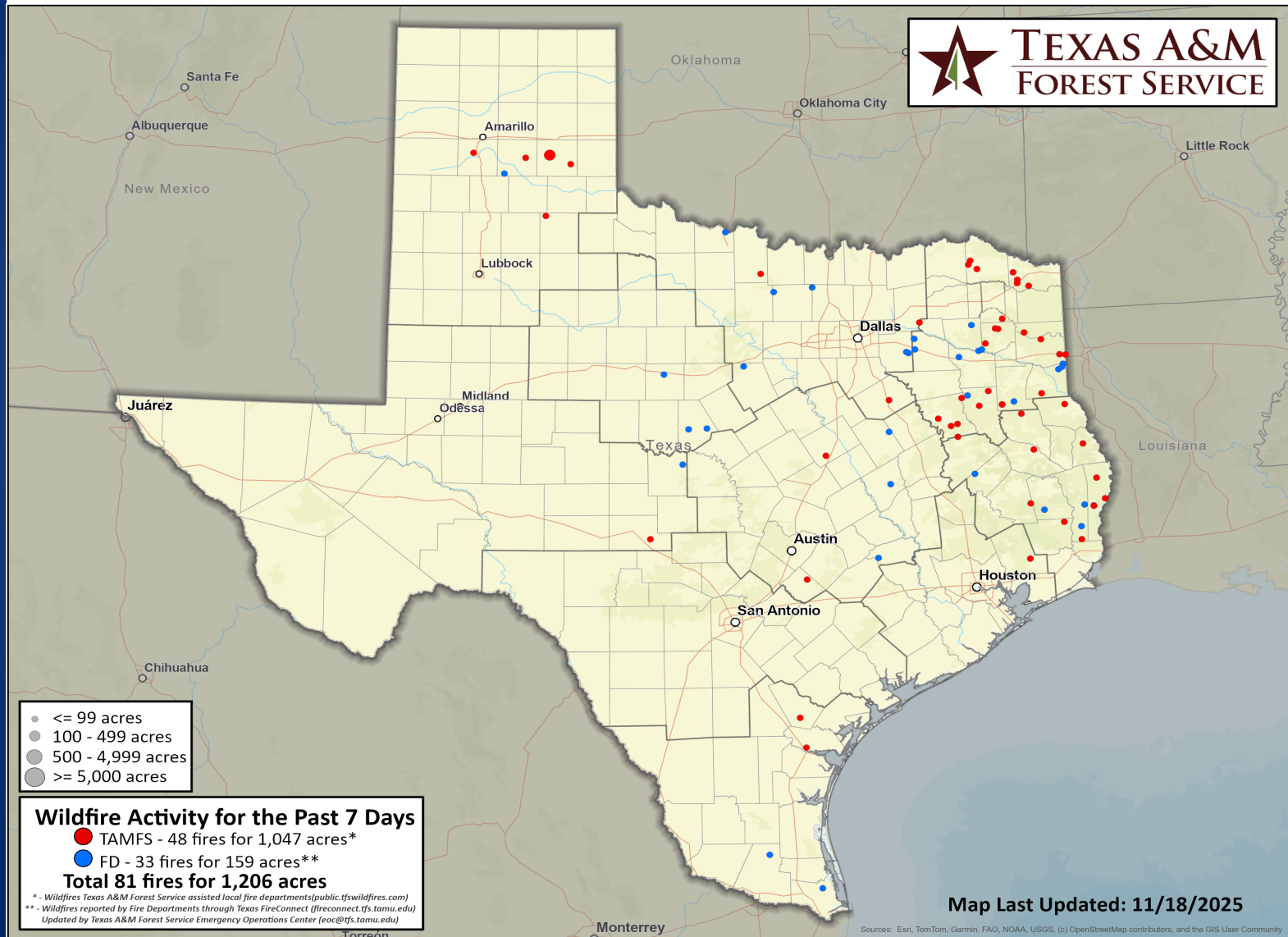
