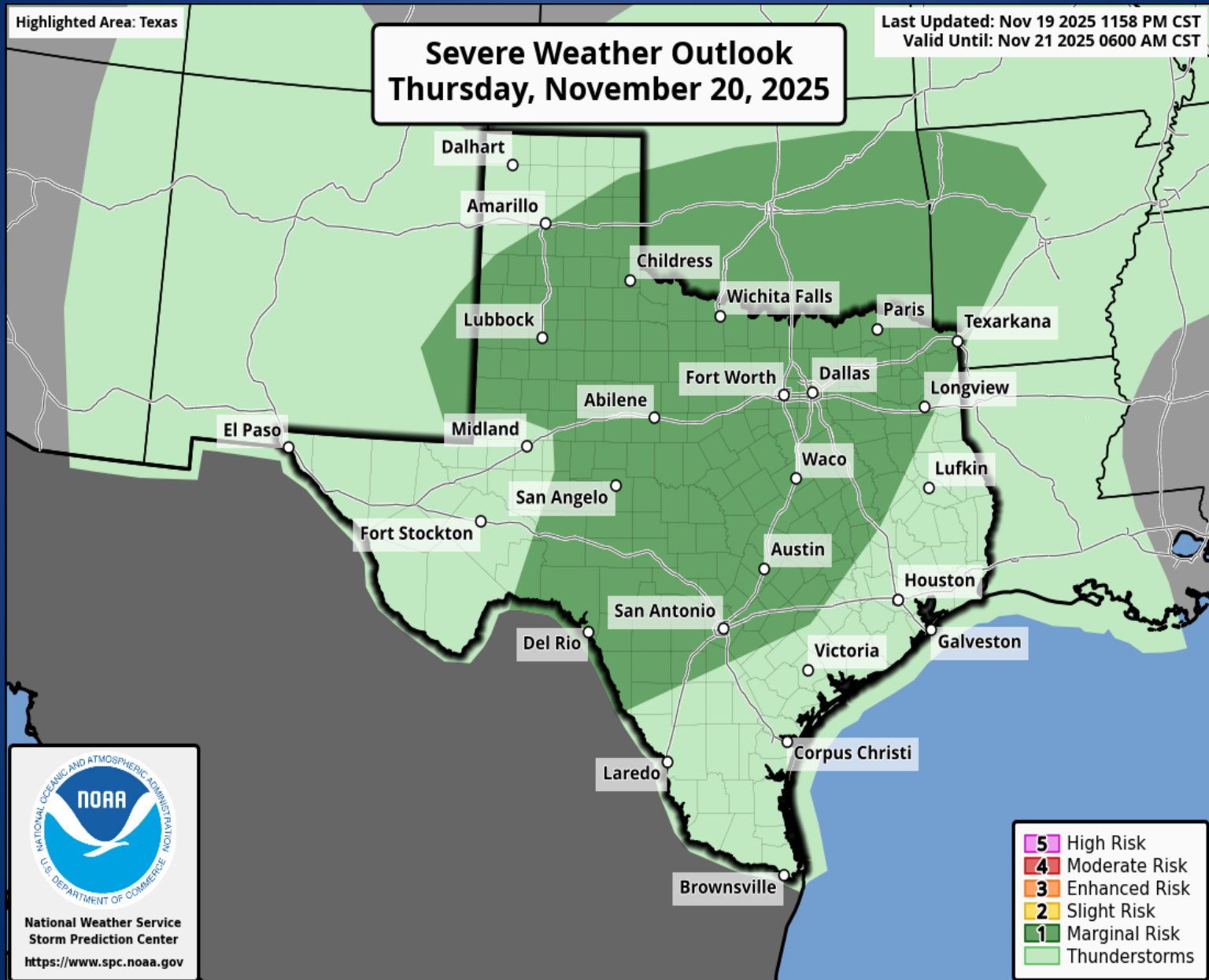

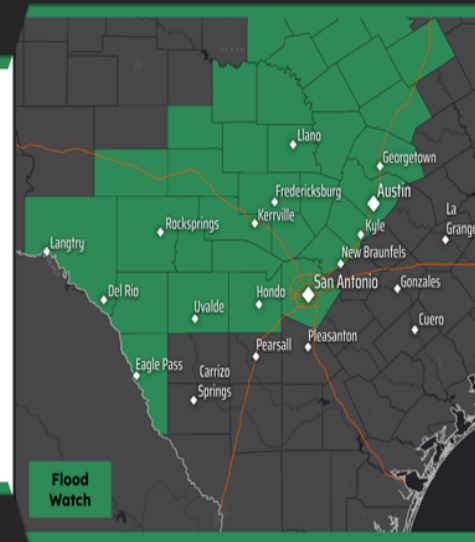


- Rainfall amounts of 1 to 3 inches with isolated totals of 6-8 inches most likely to occur in the western Hill Country/Southern Edwards Plateau

Flood Watch

Updated: November 19, 2025

A storm system will move across the area bringing locally heavy rainfall through early Friday. A Flood Watch is in effect through 6 AM Friday. Rainfall totals of 1 to 3 inches can be expected for most areas in the Flood Watch with isolated totals of 6 to 8 inches across the Southern Edwards Plateau and western Hill Country. Keep up with the forecast and remember to turn around, don't drown!

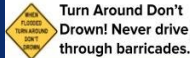

Turn Around Don't Drown! Never drive through barricades.



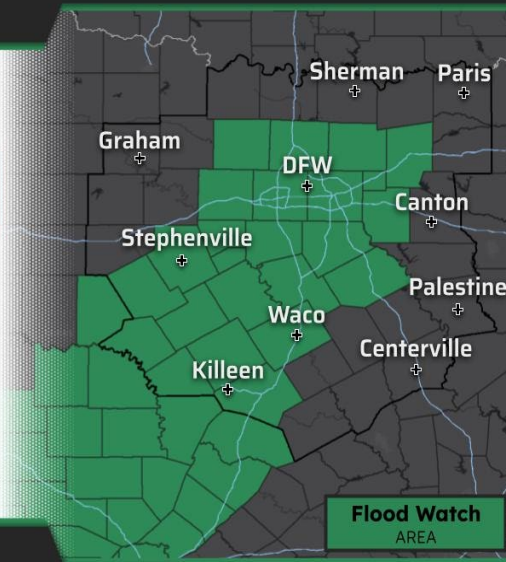

Best chance of rain in the morning and early afternoon; chances diminishing late afternoon and evening.



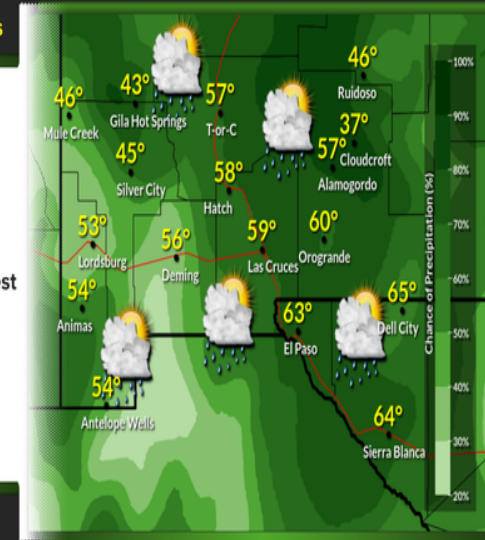

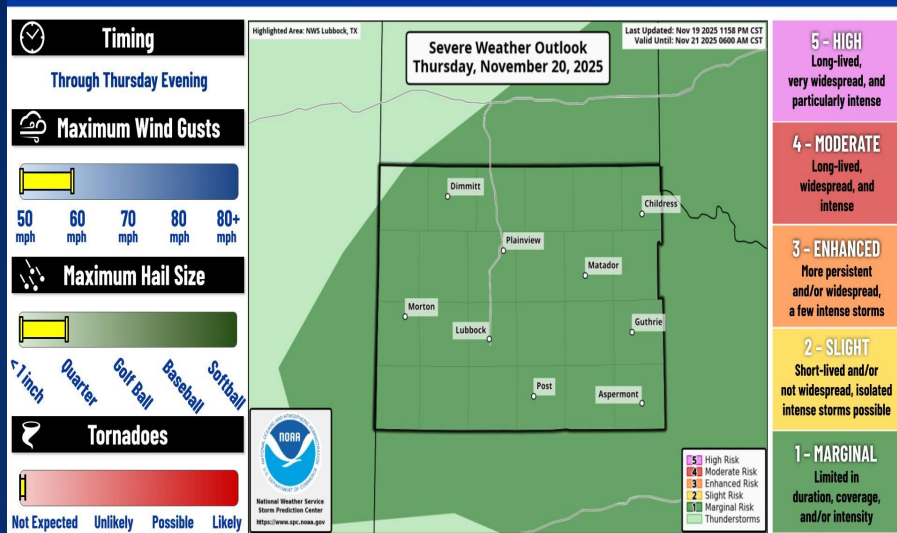
A Flood Watch is in effect for portions of North and Central Texas through 6 am Friday. Multiple rounds of heavy rainfall will result in an increasing threat for flash flooding across the watch area through Thursday night. Most of the area will receive 1 to 2 inches, however, isolated totals up to 4 inches will be possible.

The last of the Pacific trough moves through our area with scattered showers continuing into mid/late afternoon. A thunderstorm or two is also possible.

Severe thunderstorms are possible across portions of Oklahoma and western-north Texas on Thursday. Damaging wind gusts and hail are the two main hazards although a tornado could be possible mainly in southcentral through southeast Oklahoma.

Excessive Rainfall Outlook Tonight and Thursday



There is a risk for heavy rainfall this evening through Thursday, which could lead to flooding and flash flooding. The area more at risk is over southeastern portions of the area. The highest risk is across the area from portions of Sutton and Kimble Counties and southward.

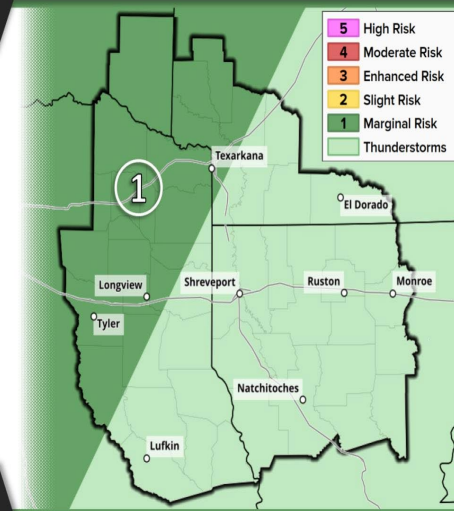


Highest Risk for Severe Storms across Deep East Texas, Southeast Oklahoma and extreme Southwest Arkansas

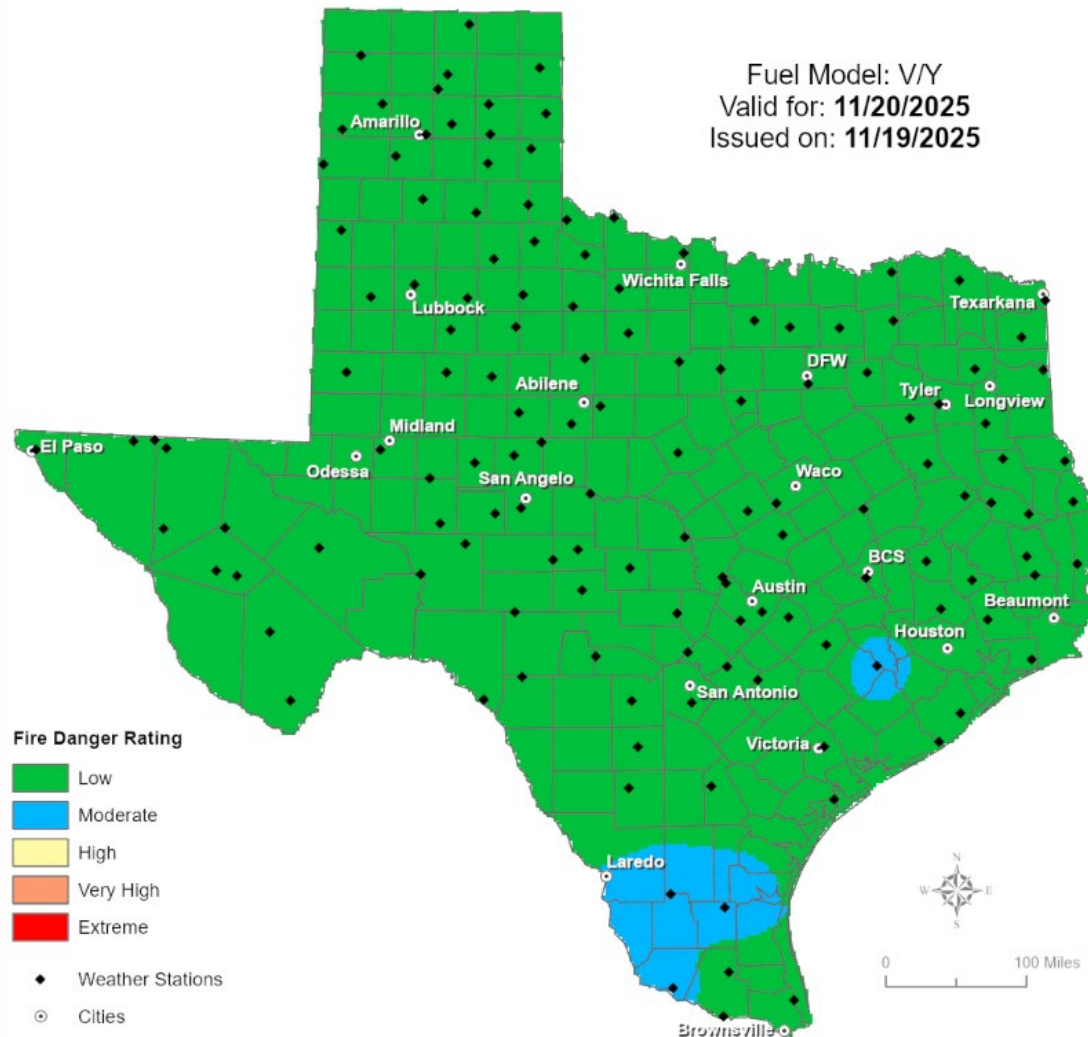

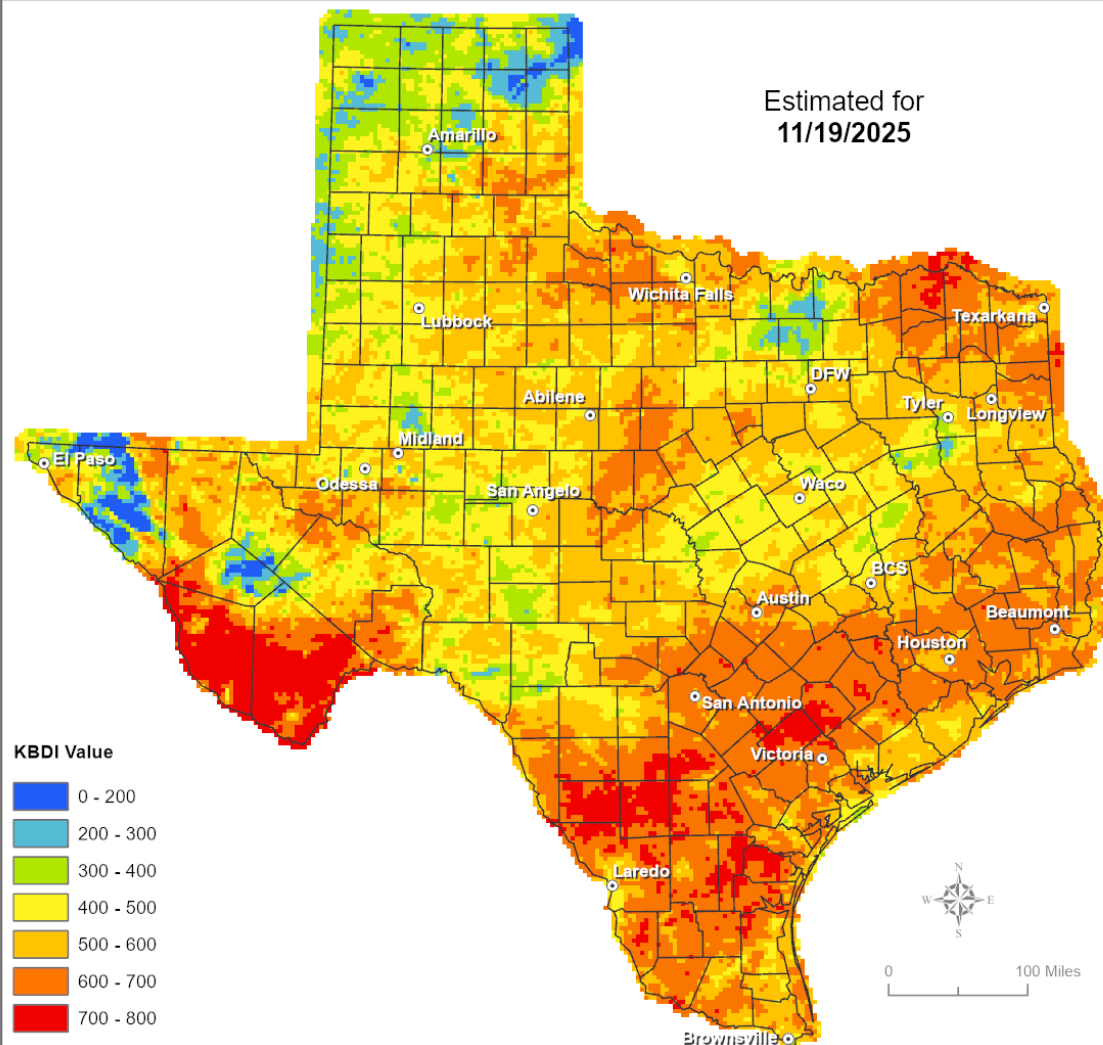

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

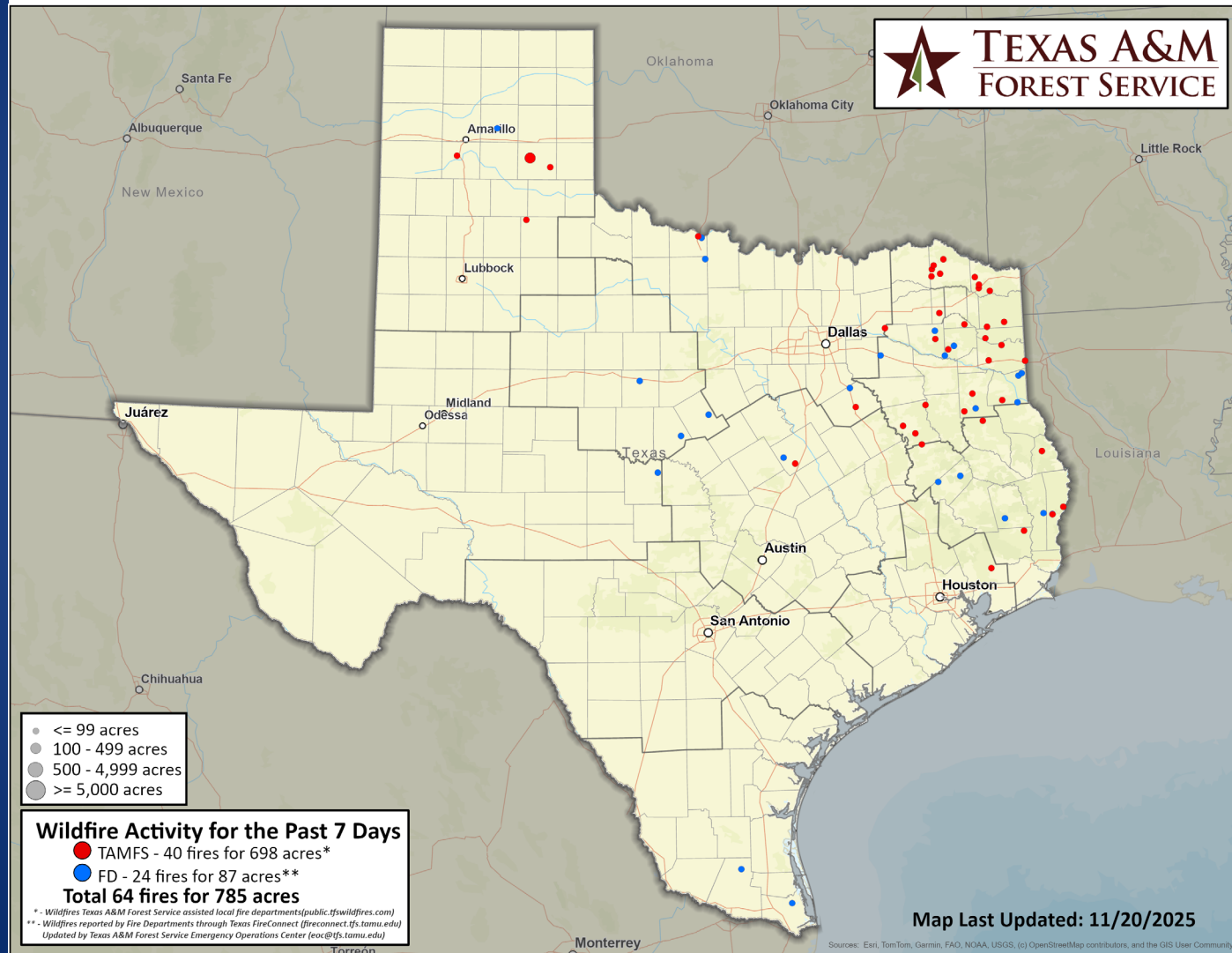
