#### Low Chance of Severe Thunderstorms Today Thu Nov 20, 2025 1:17 AM




Multiple rounds of showers and thunderstorms are anticipated starting this morning, and continuing throughout the day today. Within the chances of rain, we could see a strong to severe thunderstorm, especially for portions of the southern and eastern TX Panhandle. Large hail up to half dollar size will be the main threat. Could also see some strong wind gusts at times as well. Check back for the latest updates to the forecast.


A storm system will move across the area bringing locally heavy rainfall through early Friday. A Flood Watch is in effect through 6 AM Friday. Rainfall totals of 1 to 3 inches can be expected for most areas in the Flood Watch with isolated totals of 6 to 8 inches across the Southern Edwards Plateau and western Hill Country. Keep up with the forecast and remember to turn around, don't drown!



A Flood Watch is in effect for portions of North and Central Texas through 6 am Friday. Multiple rounds of heavy rainfall will result in an increasing threat for flash flooding across the watch area through Thursday night. Most of the area will receive 1 to 2 inches, however, isolated totals up to 4 inches will be possible.

The last of the Pacific trough moves through our area showers continuing into mid/late scattered afternoon. A thunderstorm or two is also possible.



Storm chances will persist through Thursday evening with some storms becoming strong-to-severe.




Hazardous winds are expected to occur across the Guadalupe Mountains of west Texas and southeast New Mexico early this afternoon through early evening. Be sure to secure any loose objects and travel will be difficult especially for high profile vehicles!



Severe thunderstorms are possible across portions of Oklahoma and western-north Texas on Thursday. Damaging wind gusts and hail are the two main hazards although a tornado could be possible mainly in southcentral through southeast Oklahoma.

#### **Excessive Rainfall Outlook Tonight and Thursday**



There is a risk for heavy rainfall this evening through Thursday, which could lead to flooding and flash flooding. The area more at risk is over southeastern portions of the area. The highest risk is across the area from portions of Sutton and Kimble Counties and southward.



There will be the potential for Excessive, Heavy Rainfall along with a severe storm or two today across the northwestern zones of the region. Gusty wind and large hail, along with frequent lightning are the primary hazards outside the chance for flooding. A tornado or two can't be ruled.






### **Fire Danger Forecast**



#### **Burn Ban**




## **Keetch-Byram Drought Index**
