Isolated strong to severe thunderstorms are this afternoon into the early evening, with a Level 1 to 2 risk for severe storms for parts of the eastern Hill Country, I-35 Corridor, and Coastal Plains. Primary threats with any isolated severe storm would be large hail and damaging winds.



A Small Craft Advisory is in effect today through 3 PM for the northern waters and midnight for the southern waters. Wind gusts to 30 knots and seas 5-7 feet are expected. Small vessels and inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating during these conditions.



A Flood Watch remains in effect through 3 pm this afternoon across much of North Texas, generally along and north of I-20. Rainfall totals of 1 to 3 inches, with isolated amounts up to 4 inches, could cause flooding in some areas.

- → The greatest risk of strong to severe storms will generally be along and north of the I-10 corridor.



Potential Impacts

- → Localized flooding if high rainfall rates occur for an extended period of time over vulnerable areas.




Fire Danger Forecast








Burn Ban




