





Winds will be breezy out of the west to southwest across most of the Panhandles. Strongest winds and low RH values will occur in the southwest Panhandles and that will lead to the potential for Critical Fire Weather conditions.



Dry and gusty weather on Friday will lead to nearcritical fire weather. Additional fire weather potential exists on Saturday, particularly across southwestern Oklahoma and western-north Texas.




Strong south winds of 20 to 30 mph with gusts up to 40 mph are expected by late morning and into late afternoon.





Fire danger will be highest over northwestern portions of the region where a Red Flag Warning is in effect from 10 AM until 6 PM today. Elsewhere, a Fire Danger Statement is in effect. Elevated fire weather conditions are expected this afternoon across the area. South winds will increase and become gusty by midday and continue through the afternoon. Temperatures will warm up quickly and will be above normal this afternoon. Relative humidity values will drop to 18 to 22 percent this afternoon.






