







Cold Front Brings Severe Weather Potential

Key Messages

- Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop this afternoon and evening ahead of an approaching cold front.
- A few storms will have the potential to become strong/severe.
- **Slight Risk (level 2 of 5)** of severe weather for Piney Woods and Brazos Valley
- **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5)** of severe weather for most areas along and south of I-10.


Potential Impacts

- Strong wind gusts and large hail are the primary threats
- A brief tornado cannot be ruled out
- Locally heavy rainfall will be possible in storms.
- Marine: Elevated winds and seas near thunderstorms

Actions

- Remain weather-aware and prepared!
- Have ways to receive severe weather warnings if they are issued.



Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms will be possible this afternoon and evening ahead of and along a passing cold front. A few storms will have the potential to become strong to severe. Slight Risk (level 2 of 5) of severe weather for Piney Woods and Brazos Valley. A Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) of severe weather for most areas along and south of I-10.

There is a mainly level 1 of 5 risk for isolated severe storms today from late morning through early evening, primarily along and east of the I-35 corridor. Large hail and damaging winds are possible.

Significant snow accumulations greater than 5 inches are expected across the NW Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles through much of the day today, with lighter totals of 1-4 inches favored generally along and north of the Canadian River Valley. There are low chances for localized totals >8", with snowfall rates of 1-2"/hr not out of the question either.









Keetch-Byram Drought Index


