Low relative humidity values of 10-25% inland with 25-35% along the coast and dry fuels will lead to elevated fire weather conditions this morning through evening. Therefore, a Fire Danger Statement for elevated fire concerns will go into effect this morning through 9 pm this evening. Residents should avoid open flames or sparks. Keep vehicles of dry grass and properly discard cigarettes.



SMALL CRAFT ADVISORY AREA

A Small Craft Advisory is in effect until noon Sunday for Galveston Bay, Matagorda Bay, and our coastal waters out to 60 nautical miles. We are looking at northerly winds of 15-25 knots with gusts reaching 30 knots, along with seas building up to 7 feet near shore and as high as 9 feet further out. These conditions will be hazardous for smaller vessels, so if you're an inexperienced mariner, you'll definitely want to think about staying in port until things calm down later this weekend.


Clear and Cold Tonight




