






## Wind Speeds



- North winds of 20-25 mph with gusts up to 40 mph.
- Minimum afternoon relative humidity as low as 25%.

→ Outdoor burning is strictly prohibited or limited across highlighted counties/parishes.







## Forecast Fire Danger






# Keetch-Byram Drought Index



# Fire Activity (\*Last 24 Hours)

Report of 65 (+7) fires and 1,027 (+195) acres have been burned this year. There are 134 (+10) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 185 (+1) counties with an average over 400.
