## Low Chance for Light Snow This Morning



Chances have slightly increased for some flurries or light snow to occur this morning across much of the area. Any area that does see an accumulation of snow will likely see totals stay below 0.5", but there is a 10% chance for an isolated area or two to see around 0.5"

Expect a cold and cloudy day today for much of the region with a few sprinkles possible in North Texas. An isolated snow flurry cannot be ruled out along and north of I-20 this morning into early this afternoon. In Central Texas, there will be an elevated fire threat given low relative humidity and stronger winds. Make sure to take precautions to avoid starting wildfires!



## Increased Risk of Fire Today

Updated: Sat Jan 17, 2026 6:36 AM

Very dry weather and gusty winds will increase the risk of fire through Saturday evening

**Only you can prevent wildfires! Here's how:**  
 AVOID any activities that could spark a wildfire, as fires could spread rapidly

Do NOT leave a fire unattended or burn unnecessarily.

Secure tow chains to avoid dragging and sparking. NEVER park or drive over tall grass.

Contact law enforcement or the fire department if you smell smoke or see fire!

NEVER toss lit cigarettes on the ground!

Very dry and windy weather will contribute to elevated fire weather concerns, particularly this afternoon when relative humidity values drop into the 15-20% range for most of the area. Winds this afternoon will be gusting to 20-25 mph. Avoid any activities that could spark wildfires. A Red Flag Warning is in effect along and west of the Brazos River.

A Red Flag Warning is in effect for all of South-Central Texas today from 10 AM until 8 PM. Winds will become gusty and relative humidity will drop to as low as 12%, resulting in critical fire weather conditions across the area through this evening.

Breezy and very dry conditions will overspread South Texas Saturday in the wake of a cold front. Relative humidity values will dip to 10 to 25 percent along with wind gusts 15 to 25 mph will result in a Critical Fire Danger Saturday. Thus, a Red Flag Warning has been issued from 9am to 8pm.

A Freeze Watch is in effect from 4-9 AM Sunday across Zapata, Jim Hogg, Brooks, and Inland Kenedy counties for sub-freezing lows near daybreak Sunday morning. A Freeze Warning may be needed.






# Keetch-Byram Drought Index


