

Updated: January 24, 2026

Freezing rain is expected to develop west to east Saturday evening into early Sunday morning and overnight and increasing in coverage and accumulation rates. Significant ice impacts are expected across the Hill Country into portions of I-35 corridor. Travel will be near-impossible. Avoid travel if possible. Ice weighing down tree limbs could cause branches to break in the Ice Storm Warning area. Hard freezes are forecast Saturday night, Sunday Night, and Monday Night, with the Hill Country and some portions of Austin metro forecast to remain freezing through midday Tuesday. Very dangerous wind chill values in the single digits to lower teens are forecast Saturday night through Monday morning.





Winter Storm Warnings and Advisories are in effect through noon today for freezing rain and ice potential. The greatest impacts are likely from Live Oak County to the Victoria Crossroads. Be alert for black ice inland this morning, on bridges and overpasses especially!





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


