Updated: January 24, 2026

An Extreme Cold Warning remains in effect area-wide through 9 AM Tuesday. Wind chills will be as cold as -10 degrees at times, with forecast low temperatures ranging from 0 to 14 degrees both this morning and Tuesday morning.

Dangerously cold wind chills are expected this weekend into early this week due to an Arctic front that pushed off the coast and ushered in the coldest temperatures of the season so far. With an Extreme Cold Warning in effect from Saturday evening through early next week, wind chills are forecast to drop into single digits below zero to 10 above zero. Remember to protect people, pets, plants, and pipes from the extreme cold.

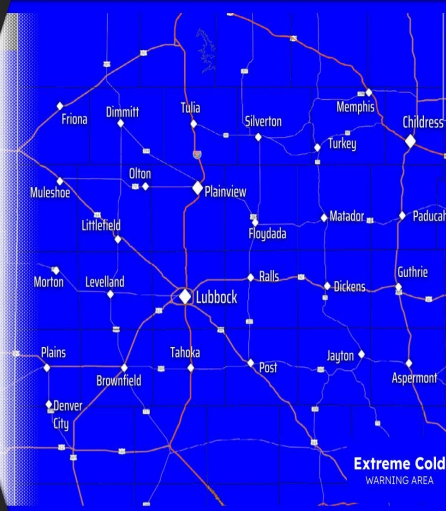

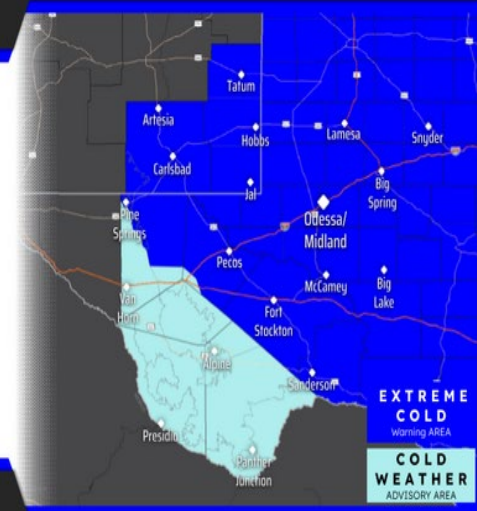

An **Extreme Cold Warning** is in effect for the entire area through noon today. Wind chill values as low as 15 to 20 degrees below zero are expected tonight into Monday morning. Reduce time outdoors, and take the proper precautions to avoid frostbite and hypothermia if you do need to be outside.

An **Extreme Cold Warning** and **Cold Weather Advisory** is in effect tonight through Monday morning. Areas in the **Extreme Cold Warning** should expect wind chills as low as 5 to 10 below zero, with some spots reaching colder wind chills. Areas in the **Cold Weather Advisory** should expect wind chills as low as 0 to 10 degrees. Temperatures in many locations across our area may not rise above freezing until at least Tuesday afternoon.

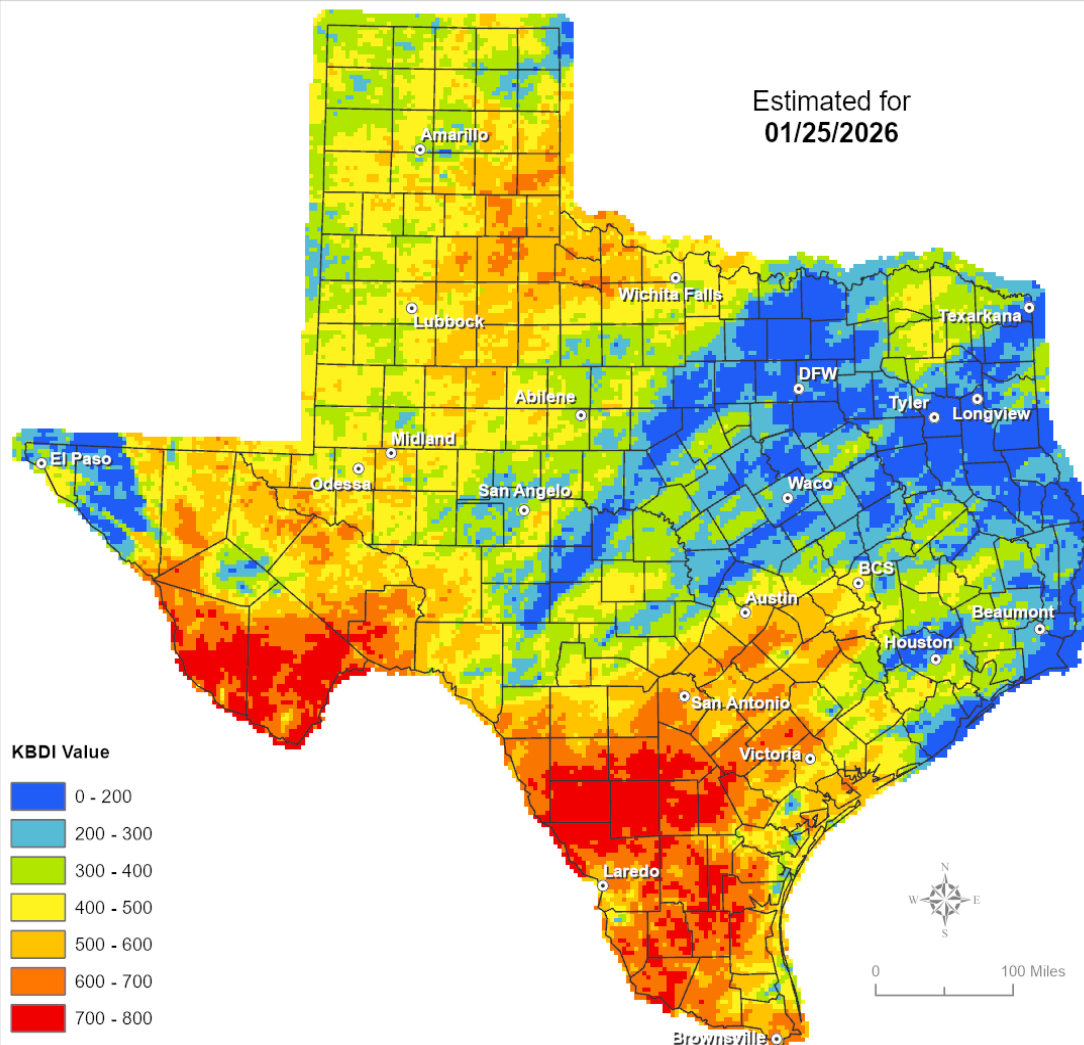

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

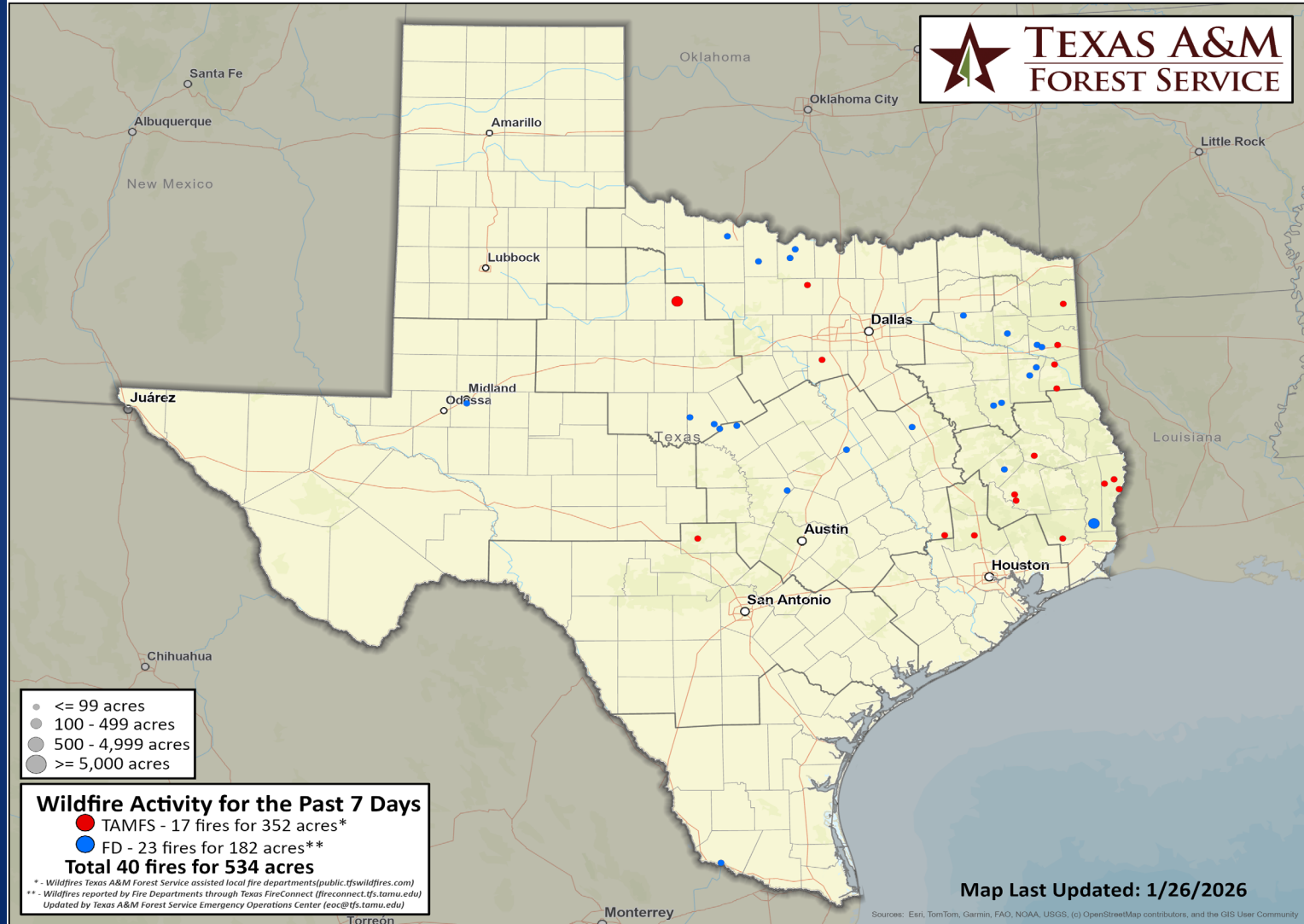
