STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On January 25, Governor Greg Abbott today amended the state's [disaster declaration](#) for the ongoing winter storm to include 85 additional counties facing impacts from winter weather.

On January 22, Governor Greg Abbott issued a [disaster declaration](#) for 134 counties due to severe winter weather. Governor Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to increase the readiness level of the Texas State Operations Center to Level II (Escalated Response).

On January 20, Governor Abbott announced that he [directed](#) TDEM to activate state emergency response resources ahead of potential winter weather impacts expected across the state beginning Thursday.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.
3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 1 (Includes DDs 1, 2, and 7)

DD 1 – Amarillo (Includes Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler Counties): Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 1 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 2 – Lubbock (Includes Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum Counties): DDEOC 2 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 7 – Abilene (Includes Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Haskell, Jones, Kent, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall, Throckmorton, and Taylor Counties): DDEOC 7 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 4 – Dallas/Ft. Worth (Includes Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, Erath, Hood, Hunt, Johnson, Kaufman, Navarro, Palo Pinto, Parker, Rockwall, Somervell, Tarrant, and Wise Counties): DDEOC 4 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

Region 3 (Includes DDs 5, 6, 14, and 15)

DD 14 – Lufkin (Includes Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler Counties): DDEOC 14 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 15 – Beaumont (Includes Hardin, Jefferson, and Orange Counties): DDEOC 15 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

Region 4 (Includes DD 16)

DD16 – Houston (Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties): [DDEOC 16 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 24.](#)

DD 8 – El Paso (Includes Brewster, Culberson, El Paso, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, and Presidio Counties): DDEOC 8 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 9:00 AM, January 23.

DD 9 – Midland/Ft. Stockton (Includes Andrews, Borden, Crane, Dawson, Ector, Gaines, Glasscock, Howard, Loving, Martin, Midland, Pecos, Reeves, Terrell, Upton, Ward, and Winkler Counties): DDEOC 9 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 10 -San Angelo (Includes Coke, Concho, Crockett, Edwards, Irion, Kimble, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sterling, Sutton, and Tom Green Counties): DDEOC 10 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 11 – Waco (Includes Bosque, Falls, Freestone, Hill, Limestone, and McLennan Counties): DDEOC 11 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 5:00 PM, January 22.

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties): DDEOC 12 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 5:00 PM, January 22.

DD 23 – Killeen (Includes Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, and San Saba Counties): DDEOC 23 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 5:00 PM, January 22.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):

TDEM is maintaining contact with their public university system partners. As of January 23, the Texas A&M University College of Dentistry in Dallas is scheduled for closure on Monday, January 26. Approximately 90 school districts impacted as of 7:00 AM today.

Communications Coordination Group (CCG):

CCG partners are monitoring the situation and continue to prepare resources to respond if necessary. Our partners across the public, private and volunteer sectors are assessing and adjusting their resources in accordance with the situation.

CCG partners have been notified and are assessing resource availability and deployment plans. Cellular Carriers have begun topping off generators in the event power is lost to cell sites and other telecommunications facilities.

[Amateur Radio and emergency communications nets are activated. No outages have been reported by Cellular Carriers/Infrastructure, Public Safety Answering Points \(PSAP\), or Land Mobile Radio \(LMR\) providers.](#)

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

TDEM ISTF ESF 5 & 6. The Local Shelter and Seasonal Relief Center Map is being updated continuously as local jurisdictions report site activations, openings, and readiness posture for the coming days.

Mass Care:

Mass Care is coordinating resources for [526](#) shelter sites, [389](#) warming centers, and [137](#) Emergency/General Population Shelters.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas AgriLife (AgriLife):

Two AgriLife SOC liaisons are monitoring weather conditions. SOC liaisons are overseeing livestock and pet sheltering questions and issues as they arise. Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) Agents and County Extension Strike Team members are on standby. AgriLife Marketing and Communications has distributed preparedness information and educational resources to support county agents, specialists, and agency communications channels in preparation for the Winter Weather. AgriLife has provided updated information through the agency's social media channels as well as our county agent network to support local governments and constituents with preparedness education and resources.

DAR Public Information Officer (PIO) from the State Communications Council is providing updates on messaging, social media outreach, and other communications needs. Slide sets have been pushed out to State, Regional and District Extension Administration for situational awareness and 20 AgriLife Extension Service DDEOC representatives continue to monitor DDEOC activations across the state virtually.

[DAR Specialists continue to receive reports of collapsed roofs on agricultural structures in North and Northeast Texas. DAR Specialists will follow-up to provide recover resources to address needs.](#)

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Public Works Response Team (PWRT):

PWRT continues to support and coordinate operations from the SOC and DDEOC's serving as ESF-3, monitoring requests for service through WebEOC.

Objectives include life safety briefings to teams in the field on PPE and when and how to use. And heat awareness.

PWRT is staffing the SOC with two liaisons. One liaison is staffing DDEOC-5 in Mount Pleasant, and one liaison is staffing DDEOC-13 at RELLIS. A STAR (State of Texas Assistance Request) request was submitted for generators at FEMA generator sites in Fort Worth and RELLIS. There are six personnel on site to work on the generators, three in Fort Worth and three in RELLIS.

PWRT continues with staffing the SOC with three (3) liaisons. One (1) member is staffing DDEOC-5 in Mount Pleasant, and one (1) member is staffing DDEOC-13 at RELLIS, (1) supplying warehouse support at RELLIS. (5) personnel continue on-site assistance with the FEMA generator sites in Ft. Worth (2) and in RELLIS (3). (6) team personnel leads have begun to monitor and lead the generator operations at Rellis (3) and Ft. Worth (3). (1) Water Professional Personnel was dispatched to Avery, TX to provide temporary restoration of potable water services. An additional 4 team leads will be en route for operations to start 1/26 (2 Rellis, 2 Ft. Worth), and 1 additional Ft. Worth GSA operator is also enroute for 1/26.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

TAMFS continues to support search, rescue, and recovery efforts in the affected regions. TAMFS deployed nine Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All-Hazard Strike Teams to assist with winter weather. A Saw Team has been identified for each region. In total, 263 personnel are currently committed to this event.

Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC):

TABC has prepared department resources consisting of Enforcement Agents who are ready to support as needed in response to the severe winter weather threats throughout the State. TABC continues to work closely with TDEM and other state/federal partners through the State Operations Center to ensure TABC resources and first responders are available should they be needed. TABC personnel are continuously being advised of the current weather conditions and maintaining a state of readiness.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has placed emergency management staff and emergency response hazmat contractors on heightened readiness for possible deployment to assist with any air/water/waste related issues including drinking water/wastewater issues and/or emergency response activities.

TCEQ sent notifications to Public Drinking Water Systems to provide reminders to operators on regulatory guidance, procedures, and preparedness steps to take in advance of approaching winter weather.

As of 3:00 PM on January 25, TCEQ is tracking six drinking water systems that are on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of 1,541 and two drinking water systems that are non-operational with a population of 750.

Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR):

DIR is monitoring the situation using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. No cyber threats related to this weather event have been identified.

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

The Texas Department of Public Safety issued a waiver allowing commercial truck drivers transporting goods like propane, groceries, and other essential products, to operate outside maximum driving hour requirements, helping to ensure the delivery and availability of critical resources to Texans throughout the state during this weather event. This waiver will be active for five days, and drivers will still be subject to all other commercial vehicle laws and regulations.

DPS is closely monitoring the winter weather event that is expected to impact multiple DPS Regions across the state. All seven Highway Patrol Regions have personnel ready to respond and will adjust their patrol and operational posture accordingly. DPS Regions have been in contact with their respective TDEM Disaster District Emergency Operations Centers and will provide personnel to staff DDEOC's as they increase their readiness level. DPS stands ready to respond to requests for assistance in response to the winter weather conditions. Personnel from the Texas Highway Patrol (THP) Chief's Office and the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement (CVE) from the Austin are providing 24hr staffing at the SOC.

The following DPS Offices in the Northwest Texas Region closed at 12:00PM on January 23: Armstrong, Bailey, Baylor, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Clay, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Floyd, Graham, Gray, Hale, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hockley, Hutchinson, Jack, Lamb, Lipscomb, Montague, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, Terry, Wheeler, Wilbarger, Wichita, and Young counties.

THP personnel are providing staffing support at DDEOCs in Ft. Worth, Mount Pleasant, Tyler as well as the Trans Vista Command center in El Paso at the TxDOT location and at the Safety Operations Center for the North Texas Tollway Authority where Troopers assigned to the toll roads remain deployed.

State-wide. Troopers worked on more than 130 weather-related crashes on January 24-25 and continue to monitor roadway conditions and assess traffic impacts.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

Regional Health and Medical Operations Centers (RHMOCs) and Regional Medical Operations Centers (RMOCs) to continue to monitor weather and healthcare facility conditions.

DSHS Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):

EMTF has [174](#) responders and [93](#) assets assigned to this incident.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):

HHSC began staffing the SOC in support of winter weather on January 22. HHSC staff will remain in the SOC for the duration of the incident. HHSC is actively monitoring the situation. Ice, water, and freight vendors are on standby to respond as needed.

Texas Education Agency (TEA):

TEA had 90 weather related closures for January 23 through January 26. As the weather and weather-related closures change, TEA will report this information to TDEM.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

TMD has six Winter Weather (WW) Mission Ready Packages (MRP), one Battalion Mission Command (BNMC), six Ground Support Units (GSU) HQs, six Ground Transportation Platoons (GTP), two Ground Support Unit Hybrids (GSU-H), and 10 Military District Coordinators (MDC) to assist stranded motorists and conduct welfare checks on selected motorways. The WW MRPs, GSU HQs, GTPs, GSU-Hs, and MDCs are staged in Duncanville, Mt. Pleasant, Kerrville, Sonora, Lubbock, Huntsville, and RELLIS. Additionally, 10 MDCs are in Ft Worth, Mt. Pleasant, Kerrville, San Angelo, Lubbock, Bryan, Tyler, Lufkin, and San Antonio. The SOC Support Team supports the State Operations Center in Austin for the Winter Weather event. TMD has activated [355](#) personnel and [134](#) vehicles in support of 26-0003 20JAN Winter Weather 2026.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

TPWD has prepared department resources consisting of Texas Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers ready to support as needed in response to the severe winter weather threats throughout the State.

TPWD continues to work closely with TDEM and other state/federal partners through the State Operations Center to ensure TPWD resources and first responders are available should they be needed. TPWD personnel are continuously being advised of the current weather conditions and maintaining a state of readiness.

TPWD has assisted motorists, local law enforcement and fire departments in Calhoun, Baylor, Hardeman, Jones, Palo Pinto, Panola, Crocket, Mitchell, Williamson, Ochiltree, Edwards, Sutton, and Tom Green Counties.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

[As of 2:30 AM, there are 4,677 state-maintained road locations impacted by snow and](#)

ice. There are seven closures.

TxDOT is staffing the State Operations Center during 24/7 activation. TxDOT crews in all 25 districts are in winter weather response with pretreating operations. Once winter weather impacts start, crews will begin deicing operations. TxDOT is closely monitoring road conditions and statewide weather threats.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC):

As of January 25, PUC is tracking 82,000 power outages with the bulk of outages in Northeast Texas. Impacted utilities included Oncor, Southwestern Electric Power County (SWEPCO), Deep East Texas Electric Cooperative, Rusk County Electric Cooperative, Cherokee County Electric Cooperative, and Bowie-Cass Electric Cooperative. It is likely that complete restoration, especially these cooperative, will be a multi-day task.

Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)

American Red Cross (ARC):

ARC is receiving requests to open shelters, provide supplies (cots, blankets, snacks), and support warming centers and feeding plans. ARC has rostered shelter worker teams and they are on standby. ARC is supporting multiple EOCs across the state virtually and in-person.

ARC operations across Texas remain steady, with 42 total shelters, including 27 open, 15 on standby, supporting 214 clients statewide. The Gulf Coast Region currently holds the largest sheltering footprint, with higher volume sites. The Central and South Texas Region opened four shelters. The North Texas Region has five open shelters.
