




## Temperatures Very Cold Again Tonight




Temperatures very cold again tonight with lows in the teens to around 20.

Temperatures will be cold again tonight, but not quite as cold as in the past couple of nights. Lows will be in the teens to around 20. Patchy freezing fog is expected overnight, across northern and central parts of the area. This may create slick spots mainly on bridges and elevated roadways. Any leftover meltwater will re-freeze and create icy patches on roads.

Areas of dense freezing fog are expected this Wednesday morning across portions of North and Central Texas. Light ice accumulations on surfaces may occur, including roads, so be sure to take extra caution if driving! In addition to the reduced visibilities, slick spots from patches of ice will be difficult or impossible to see while driving! Leave plenty of distance between you and other vehicles, and allow for extra time to reach your destination.







## Keetch-Byram Drought Index


