

Morning Fog → Another Front Later Today

-  Patchy freezing fog is possible this morning, mainly near and east of I-35.
 -  Afternoon highs will reach the upper 40s and 50s ahead of a dry cold front. Wind gusts to near 20-25 mph behind the front.
 -  Much cooler temps are expected this evening and tonight with lows in the 20s to lower 30s.

Patchy freezing fog is possible through the morning hours mainly for areas along and east of I-35. Make sure to slow down and be careful of slick spots with ice, especially on bridges and overpasses. The "warmest" day of the week is expected today with temperatures rising into the upper 40s to upper 50s ahead of an approaching cold front. The breezy northerly winds behind the front will bring another round of cooler weather to the region this evening and tonight. The overnight lows will drop to the 20s and lower 30s.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


