STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On January 27, the State Operations Center (SOC) returned to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions).

On January 25, Governor Greg Abbott today amended the state’s disaster declaration for the ongoing winter storm to include 85 additional counties facing impacts from winter weather.

On January 22, Governor Greg Abbott issued a disaster declaration for 134 counties due to severe winter weather. Governor Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to increase the readiness level of the Texas State Operations Center to Level II (Escalated Response).

On January 20, Governor Abbott announced that he directed TDEM to activate state emergency response resources ahead of potential winter weather impacts expected across the state beginning Thursday.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.

3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 1 (Includes DDs 1, 2, and 7)

DD 1 – Amarillo (Includes Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler Counties): Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 1 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions at 12:00 PM, January 27.

DD 2 – Lubbock (Includes Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum Counties): [DDEOC 2 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions at noon, January 28.](#)

DD 7 – Abilene (Includes Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Haskell, Jones, Kent, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall, Throckmorton, and Taylor Counties): DDEOC 7 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions at noon, January 27.

Region 2 (Includes DDs 3, 4, and 22)

DD 3 – Wichita Falls (Includes Archer, Baylor, Clay, Cottle, Foard, Hardeman, Jack, Wichita, Wilbarger, and Young Counties): DDEOC 3 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 4 – Dallas/Ft. Worth (Includes Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, Erath, Hood, Hunt, Johnson, Kaufman, Navarro, Palo Pinto, Parker, Rockwall, Somervell, Tarrant, and Wise Counties): DDEOC 4 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

Region 3 (Includes DDs 5, 6, 14, and 15)

DD 5 – Mt. Pleasant (Includes Bowie, Cass, Delta, Franklin, Hopkins, Lamar, Morris, Red River, and Titus Counties): DDEOC 5 activated to Level II - Escalated Response Conditions on January 23.

DD 6 – Tyler (Includes Anderson, Camp, Cherokee, Gregg, Harrison, Henderson,

Marion, Panola, Rains, Rusk, Smith, Upshur, Van Zandt, and Wood Counties): DDEOC 6 activated to Level II - Escalated Response Conditions on January 22.

DD 14 – Lufkin (Includes Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler Counties): DDEOC 14 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 23.

DD 15 – Beaumont (Includes Hardin, Jefferson, and Orange Counties): DDEOC 15 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions on January 27.

Region 4 (Includes DD 16)

DD 16 – Houston (Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties): DDEOC 16 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions at 1:00 PM, January 27.

Region 5 (Includes DD 19, 20, and 21)

DD 20– Corpus Christi (Aransas, Bee, Brooks, Duval, Jim Wells, Kenedy, Kleberg, Live Oak, Nueces, Refugio, and San Patricio Counties): DDEOC 20 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions on January 27.

Region 6 (Includes DDs 17, 18, and 24)

DD 17 – Victoria (Includes Calhoun, DeWitt, Goliad, Gonzales, Lavaca, Jackson, and Victoria Counties) DDEOC 17 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions on January 26.

DD 18 – San Antonio (Includes Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson Counties): DDEOC 18 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions at 4:30 PM, January 28.

DD 24 – Del Rio (Includes Dimmit, Edwards, Kinney, La Salle, Maverick, Real, Uvalde, Val Verde, and Zavala Counties): DDEOC 24 returned to Level IV – Normal Conditions on January 26.

Region 7 (Includes DDs 8, 9, and 10)

DD 8 – El Paso (Includes Brewster, Culberson, El Paso, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, and Presidio Counties): DDEOC 8 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions at 9:00 AM, January 28.

DD 9 – Midland/Ft. Stockton (Includes Andrews, Borden, Crane, Dawson, Ector, Gaines, Glasscock, Howard, Loving, Martin, Midland, Pecos, Reeves, Terrell, Upton, Ward, and Winkler Counties): DDEOC 9 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 28.

DD 10 -San Angelo (Includes Coke, Concho, Crockett, Edwards, Irion, Kimble, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sterling, Sutton, and Tom Green Counties): DDEOC 10 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions at 8:00 AM, January 28.

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 11 – Waco (Includes Bosque, Falls, Freestone, Hill, Limestone, and McLennan Counties): DDEOC 11 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 5:00 PM, January 22.

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties): [DDEOC 12 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions on January 28.](#)

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):

TDEM is maintaining contact with their public university system partners. As of January 23, the Texas A&M University College of Dentistry in Dallas is scheduled for closure on Monday, January 26. Approximately 90 school districts impacted as of 7:00 AM today.

Communications Coordination Group (CCG):

CCG partners are monitoring the situation and continue to prepare resources to respond if necessary. Our partners across the public, private and volunteer sectors are assessing and adjusting their resources in accordance with the situation.

CCG partners have been notified and are assessing resource availability and deployment plans. Cellular Carriers have begun topping off generators in the event power is lost to cell sites and other telecommunications facilities.

Amateur Radio and emergency communications nets have been activated. There have been no reports of outages by Cellular Carriers, Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP), or Land Mobile Radio (LMR) providers.

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

TDEM ISTF ESF 5 & 6. The Local Shelter and Seasonal Relief Center Map is being updated continuously as local jurisdictions report site activations, openings, and readiness posture for the coming days.

Mass Care:

Mass Care is coordinating resources for 297 shelter sites, 262 warming centers, and 35 Emergency and General Population Shelters. A total of 496 residents has been sheltered.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas AgriLife (AgriLife):

Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) staffing continues with 25 Specialists and four Area Chiefs available to support ESF 11 operations. Situation updates and weather briefings continue to be shared with leadership to maintain statewide situational awareness and preparedness.

Eight DDEOCs previously operating at Level III have transitioned to Level IV activation. Eight AgriLife Extension DDEOCs remain at Level III, maintaining virtual and in-person monitoring, and all DDEOC representatives are included in daily briefings. A DAR Specialist is currently assigned to the Kerrville Incident Management Team (IMT) to support on-site damage assessment activities until Friday, January 30. ESF 11 has transitioned out of active status and continues to monitor and address needs as they are identified.

DAR Specialists continue to receive reports of collapsed roofs on agricultural structures in North and Northeast Texas. DAR Specialists continue to follow up on reported agricultural structure damage.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Public Works Response Team (PWRT):

As of January 28, PWRT continues to staff the SOC with two liaisons. DDEOC 5 and 13 representatives have been released.

Personnel continue on-site assistance with the FEMA generator sites in Ft. Worth and at RELLIS. Three personnel and four team personnel leads are providing on-site assistance in Ft. Worth, and three personnel and five team leads are providing are providing on-site assistance at RELLIS.

One Water/Wastewater operator was deployed to Zavalla, TX to help with a wastewater treatment plant for the city.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

TAMFS continues to support search, rescue, and recovery efforts in the affected regions. TAMFS deployed nine Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All-Hazard Strike Teams to assist with winter weather. A Saw Team has been identified for each region. Three motor graders with operators have been activated. In total, 251 personnel are currently committed to this event. TAMFS has personnel staffing DDEOCs in seven districts.

Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC):

TABC has prepared departmental resources and personnel for the severe winter weather.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has placed emergency management staff and emergency response hazmat contractors on heightened readiness for possible deployment to assist with any air/water/waste related issues including drinking water/wastewater issues and/or emergency response activities.

TCEQ sent notifications to Public Drinking Water Systems to provide reminders to operators on regulatory guidance, procedures, and preparedness steps to take in advance of approaching winter weather.

As of January 28, TCEQ is tracking 78 drinking water systems on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of 69,563 and five drinking water systems are non-operational with a population of 3,807.

Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR):

DIR is monitoring the situation using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds.

No cyber threats related to this weather event have been identified.

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

DPS is closely monitoring the winter weather event that is expected to impact multiple DPS Regions across the state. All seven Highway Patrol Regions have personnel ready to respond and will adjust their patrol and operational posture accordingly. DPS Regions have been in contact with their respective TDEM Disaster District Emergency Operations Centers and will provide personnel to staff DDEOC's as they increase their readiness level. DPS stands ready to respond to requests for assistance in response to the winter weather conditions.

Statewide, Troopers worked on more than 130 weather-related crashes on January 24-25 and continue to monitor roadway conditions and assess traffic impacts. The number of vehicle accidents has decreased since January 24. THP troopers have assisted TxDOT with de-icing and many of the THP districts have returned to normal operations. [As of January 28, THP Troopers have returned to their regular duty schedules and will continue to monitor roadways and respond to calls for assistance.](#)

[THP supervisors are providing staffing support at Fort Worth and Mt. Pleasant DDEOCs, as well as staffing support at the State Operations Center in the ESF-13 position.](#)

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

[The State Medical Operations Center and Piney Woods Regional Medical Operations Center remain activated and continue to monitor weather and healthcare facility conditions.](#)

DSHS Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):

EMTF has [147](#) personnel and [83](#) assets assigned to this incident.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):

HHSC began staffing the SOC in support of winter weather on January 22. HHSC staff will remain in the SOC for the duration of the incident. HHSC is actively monitoring impacts to long-term care facilities from the weather. Ice, water, and freight vendors are on standby to respond as needed.

Texas Education Agency (TEA):

TEA had 90 weather related closures for January 23 through January 26. As the weather and weather-related closures change, TEA will report this information to TDEM.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

TMD has two Winter Weather (WW) Mission Ready Packages (MRP), one Battalion Mission Command (BNMC), two Ground Support Units (GSU) HQs, one Ground Transportation Platoon (GTP), one Ground Support Unit Hybrid (GSU-H), one General Support Unit, and five Military District Coordinators (MDC) to assist stranded motorists and conduct welfare checks on selected motorways.

The WW MRPs, GSU HQs, GTP, GSU-H, and MDCs are staged in Mt. Pleasant, Dallas, Joaquin, Tyler, Lufkin, and Nacogdoches. The SOC Support Team supports the State Operations Center in Austin for the Winter Weather event.

TMD has activated 396 personnel and 143 vehicles in support of winter weather.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

TPWD has prepared department resources consisting of Texas Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers ready to support as needed in response to the severe winter weather threats throughout the State.

TPWD continues to work closely with TDEM and other state/federal partners through the State Operations Center to ensure TPWD resources and first responders are available should they be needed. TPWD personnel are continuously being advised of the current weather conditions and maintaining a state of readiness.

TPWD has assisted motorists, local law enforcement and fire departments in Baylor, Calhoun, Crockett, Edwards, Hardeman, Henderson, Jones, Limestone, Mitchell, Ochiltree, Palo Pinto, Panola, Sutton, Tom Green, and Williamson Counties.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

TxDOT works to maintain safe roadways for the traveling public during adverse conditions. As of January 28, there are 1,955 state-maintained roads impacted by snow and ice. No roads are closed due to snow or ice.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC):

As of January 28, 17,000 power outages statewide, with approximately 11,000-12,000 of these remaining from the winter storm. Deep East Texas Electric Cooperative (EC) (7,300 outages) and Rusk County EC (3,500 outages) continue to work restorations, though final restoration is still expected to run into the weekend.

Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)

American Red Cross (ARC):

ARC is supporting multiple EOCs across the state virtually and in-person. [ARC operations across Texas remain steady, with eight open shelters supporting 49 clients and four pets statewide and three shelters on standby to open.](#)

FINAL COMMENTS: The State Operations Center (SOC) is at Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions). The Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) continues to monitor the situation and will provide additional situation reports as needed.

The four levels of SOC activation are:

- Level I (Emergency Conditions)
- Level II (Escalated Response Conditions)
- Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions)
- Level IV (Normal Conditions)
