**STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:** On January 27, the State Operations Center (SOC) returned to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions).

On January 25, Governor Greg Abbott today amended the state's disaster declaration for the ongoing winter storm to include 85 additional counties facing impacts from winter weather.

On January 22, Governor Greg Abbott issued a disaster declaration for 134 counties due to severe winter weather. Governor Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to increase the readiness level of the Texas State Operations Center to Level II (Escalated Response).

On January 20, Governor Abbott announced that he directed TDEM to activate state emergency response resources ahead of potential winter weather impacts expected across the state beginning Thursday.

### OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.

3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

### **Region 3 (Includes DDs 5, 6, 14, and 15)**

DD 5 – Mt. Pleasant (Includes Bowie, Cass, Delta, Franklin, Hopkins, Lamar, Morris, Red River, and Titus Counties): DDEOC 5 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions on January 31.

DD 6 – Tyler (Includes Anderson, Camp, Cherokee, Gregg, Harrison, Henderson, Marion, Panola, Rains, Rusk, Smith, Upshur, Van Zandt, and Wood Counties): DDEOC 6 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions on January 30.

DD 14 – Lufkin (Includes Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Trinity, and Tyler Counties): DDEOC 14 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions on January 31.

### **Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)**

DD 11 – Waco (Includes Bosque, Falls, Freestone, Hill, Limestone, and McLennan Counties): DDEOC 11 activated to Level III - Increased Readiness Conditions at 5:00 PM, January 22.

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties): DDEOC 12 returned to Level IV - Normal Conditions on February 2.

## **RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS**

### **Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):**

TDEM is maintaining contact with their public university system partners.

### **Communications Coordination Group (CCG):**

As of January 29, repairs have been completed in Cherokee and Nacogdoches counties and services have been restored. Repairs continue in Leon County. During this event, eight storm-related Integrated Public Alert Warning System (IPAWS) Alerts were broadcast. There are no active IPAWS Alerts in the State. All storm related Amateur

Radio nets have been concluded.

**Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):**

The Local Shelter and Seasonal Relief Center Map is being updated continuously as local jurisdictions report site activations, openings, and readiness posture for the coming days.

**Mass Care:**

Mass Care is coordinating resources for 31 total shelter sites, including 28 warming centers and 3 Emergency and General Population Shelters. A total of 9 residents are being sheltered as of January 30.

**Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas AgriLife (AgriLife):**

Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) staffing continues with 25 Specialists and four Area Chiefs available to support ESF 11 operations.

**Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Public Works Response Team (PWRT):**

As of February 1, one liaison PWRT remains at the SOC. Three team leads continue to monitor and lead the generator operations at RELLIS with three staging personnel at the GSA.

**Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):**

TAMFS deployed nine Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All-Hazard Strike Teams to assist with winter weather. A Saw Team was identified for each region. Three motor graders with operators were activated. TAMFS has personnel staffing [the DDEOC in Mt. Pleasant](#). In total, [63](#) personnel are currently committed to this event.

**Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):**

As of February 1, TCEQ is tracking 32 drinking water systems on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of 35,812. TCEQ has authorized seven temporary debris management sites.

**Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR):**

DIR is monitoring the situation using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. No cyber threats related to this weather event have been identified.

**Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):**

[THP Troopers have returned to their regular duty schedules and will continue to monitor](#)

roadways and respond to calls for assistance.

At this time, THP supervisors are providing staffing support at Fort Worth and Mt. Pleasant DDEOC's.

**Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):**

The State Medical Operations Center remains activated and continues to monitor weather and healthcare facility conditions.

**DSHS Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):**

EMTF demobilized all assets in support of this incident on January 31.

EMTF response totals for this incident were 279 first responders treated, 91 aided, 17 treated, and 16 transported.

**Texas Military Department (TMD):**

TMD has two Winter Weather (WW) Mission Ready Packages (MRP), one Battalion Mission Command (BNMC), two Ground Support Units (GSU) HQs, one Ground Transportation Platoon (GTP), one General Support Unit, and five Military District Coordinators (MDC) to assist stranded motorists and conduct welfare checks on selected motorways.

The WW MRPs, GSU HQs, GTP, and MDCs are staged in Mt. Pleasant, Duncanville, Gainesville, Joaquin, and Tyler. Military District Coordinators are located in Ft Worth, Mt Pleasant, Kingwood, and Tyler. The SOC Support Team supports the State Operations Center in Austin for the Winter Weather event. TMD has activated 154 personnel and 53 vehicles in support of winter weather.

**Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):**

TPWD has assisted motorists, local law enforcement and fire departments in Baylor, Calhoun, Crockett, Edwards, Hardeman, Henderson, Jones, Limestone, Mitchell, Ochiltree, Palo Pinto, Panola, Sutton, Tom Green, and Williamson Counties.

**Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):**

TxDOT works to maintain safe roadways for the traveling public during adverse conditions. As of January 30, there were 596 state-maintained roads impacted by snow and ice. No roads are closed due to snow or ice.

**American Red Cross (ARC):**

ARC is supporting multiple EOCs across the state virtually and in-person. ARC

operations across Texas remain steady, with five open shelters supporting 16 clients.
