What We Know

- Scattered showers and thunderstorms (occasionally heavy) are expected to continue this morning, especially along and south/east of I-44.
- A corridor of 2+ inches of additional rainfall will be possible along and south of a Wichita Falls-to-Ada line through midday.

Impacts

→ Flooding possible in some locations, especially in low-lying and poorly drained areas.


Higher elevations of Sacramento Mtns

Our next Pacific storm system...an inbound upper trough...will arrive tomorrow morning, with precipitation out west, spreading east across the Borderland through the day. Precipitation should be generally light, and snow levels will remain quite high. Thus, impacts are expected to remain low.

• Storms will linger Saturday night after the main round moves through.





Widespread showers and thunderstorms will move west to east throughout the day. Scattered showers and storms will linger Saturday night, exiting east early Sunday AM. Most likely rainfall totals will range from 0.5"-1.5" with localized 2-2.5". A few storms may become strong or marginally severe with hail and gusty winds. There is also a threat for a quick spin-up mainly across the Brazos Valley during the afternoon and evening hours.





Key Messages


- Showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop ahead of a cold front Saturday, progged to enter College Station/Columbus late Saturday afternoon and exit into Louisiana around midnight.
- A few storms may become strong to severe, especially along the front.
- **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5)** of severe weather mainly for counties southwest of a line extending from Colorado County to Matagorda County.
- **Slight Risk (level 2 of 5)** of severe weather mainly for counties northeast of a line extending from Colorado County to Matagorda County.

Potential Impacts

- Damaging wind gusts
- Locally heavy rainfall
- Brief isolated tornado cannot be ruled out
- Monitoring the potential for training storms, which could lead to localized minor street flooding.

Actions

- Remain weather-aware!
- Be sure you can receive alerts of dangerous storms!



Showers and thunderstorms are expected on Saturday afternoon/evening ahead of and along the boundary of a cold front as it pushes through Southeast Texas. A few storms may become strong to severe. Monitoring the potential for training storms, which could lead to localized minor street flooding. Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) of severe weather for counties around Matagorda Bay and a Slight Risk (level 2 of 5) elsewhere, including the Houston Metro.

Strong winds are forecast for the coastal counties today in advance of the late-weekend passage of a cold front.



Keetch-Byram Drought Index


