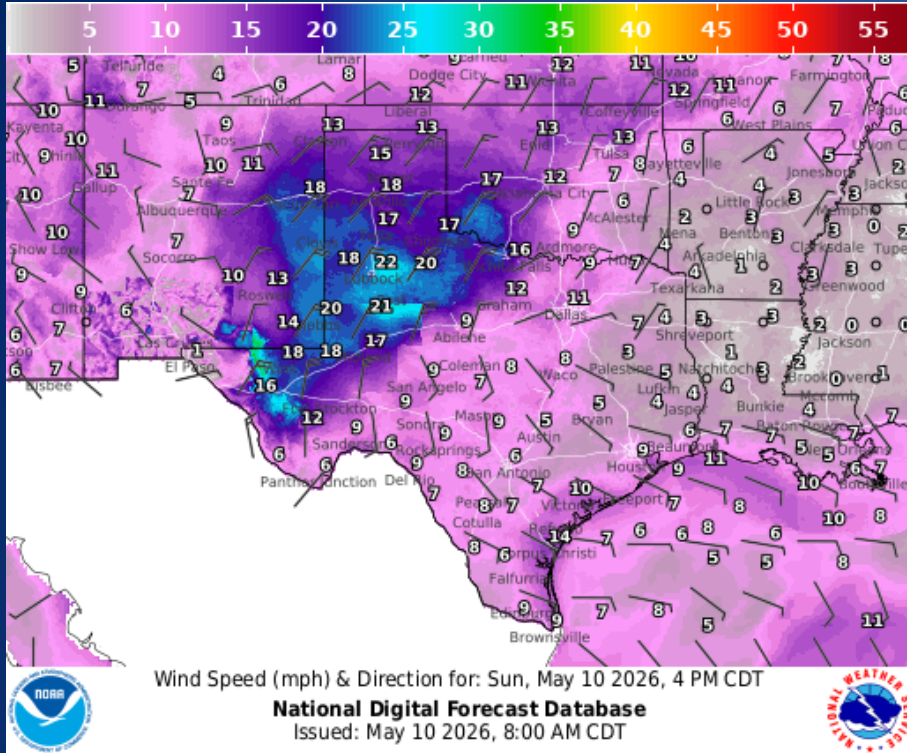

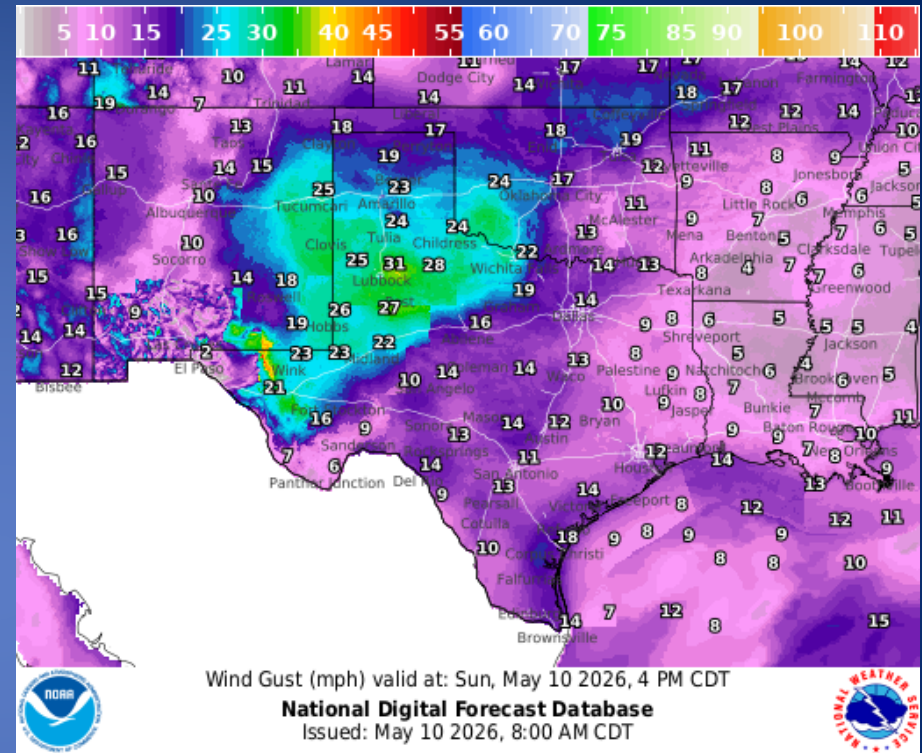

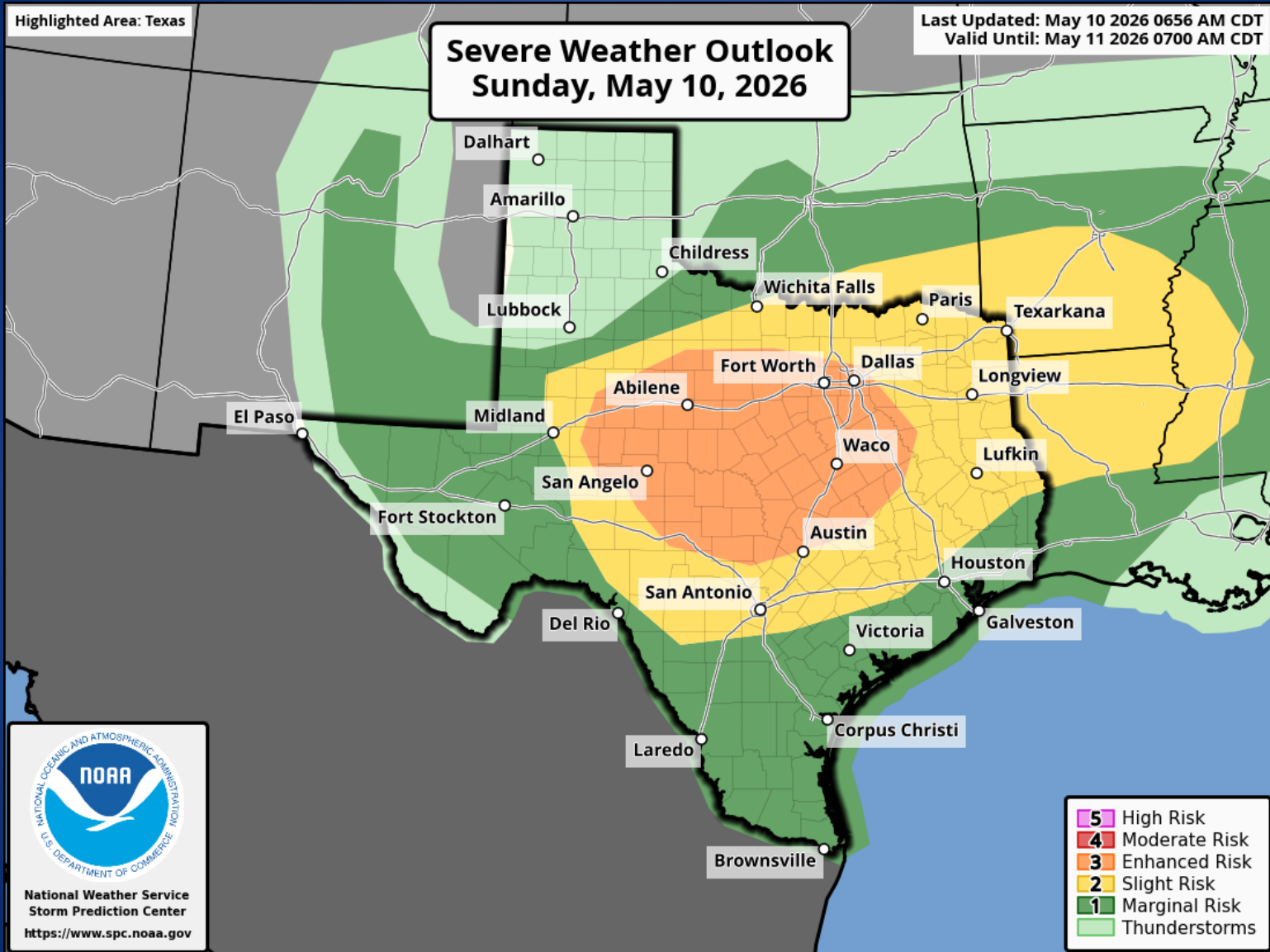


Wind Speed

Severe thunderstorm potential develops this evening into early Monday morning. The northern Hill Country and northern I-35 corridor (including Georgetown and Burnet) are under an Enhanced (Level 3 of 5) risk. Cities like Austin and San Antonio are in the Slight (Level 2 of 5) risk zone. Expect the main threats of damaging wind gusts, large hail and heavy rainfall through Monday morning as a line of storms moves across the area.

There is a Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) for Severe Thunderstorms Tonight through Monday morning for all of Deep South Texas and the Rio Grande Valley.



Thunderstorms are expected to move across the area tonight, with isolated strong to severe storms expected. SPC has included us in a Marginal Risk of severe storms. Please monitor your weather and have multiple ways to receive warnings. The greatest threats will be large hail and damaging winds.

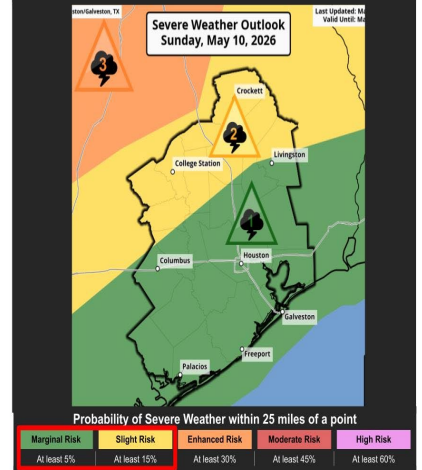

Severe Weather Outlook: Sun Evening - Mon Morning

Scattered to numerous storms are expected to develop today as a cold front pushes through the region. The threat for severe weather will increase during the afternoon and evening with large hail and damaging winds as the main threats. Locally heavy rain will also be a concern where slower moving or training storms may lead to locally higher amounts of up to 2-4". Plan ahead for interruptions to outdoor activities!

Showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop across Southeast TX ahead of and along a cold front late Sunday into early Monday. This cold front should move through the area Sunday evening into early Monday morning. A few storms may become strong to severe, especially along the front itself. Slight Risk (level 2 of 5) of severe weather for the Brazos Valley and Piney Woods region. Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) of severe weather for the remainder of Southeast Texas.

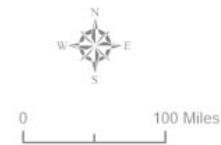

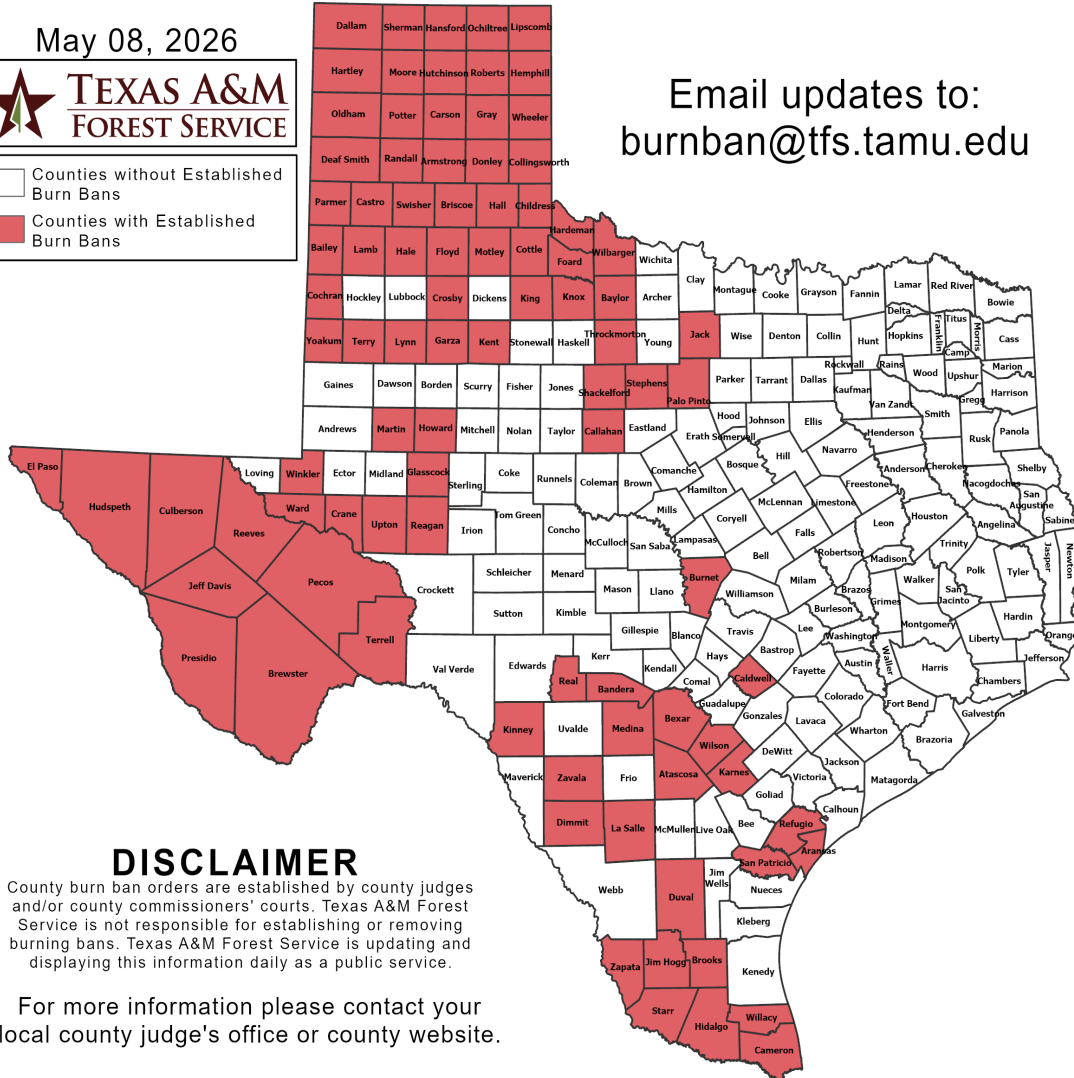

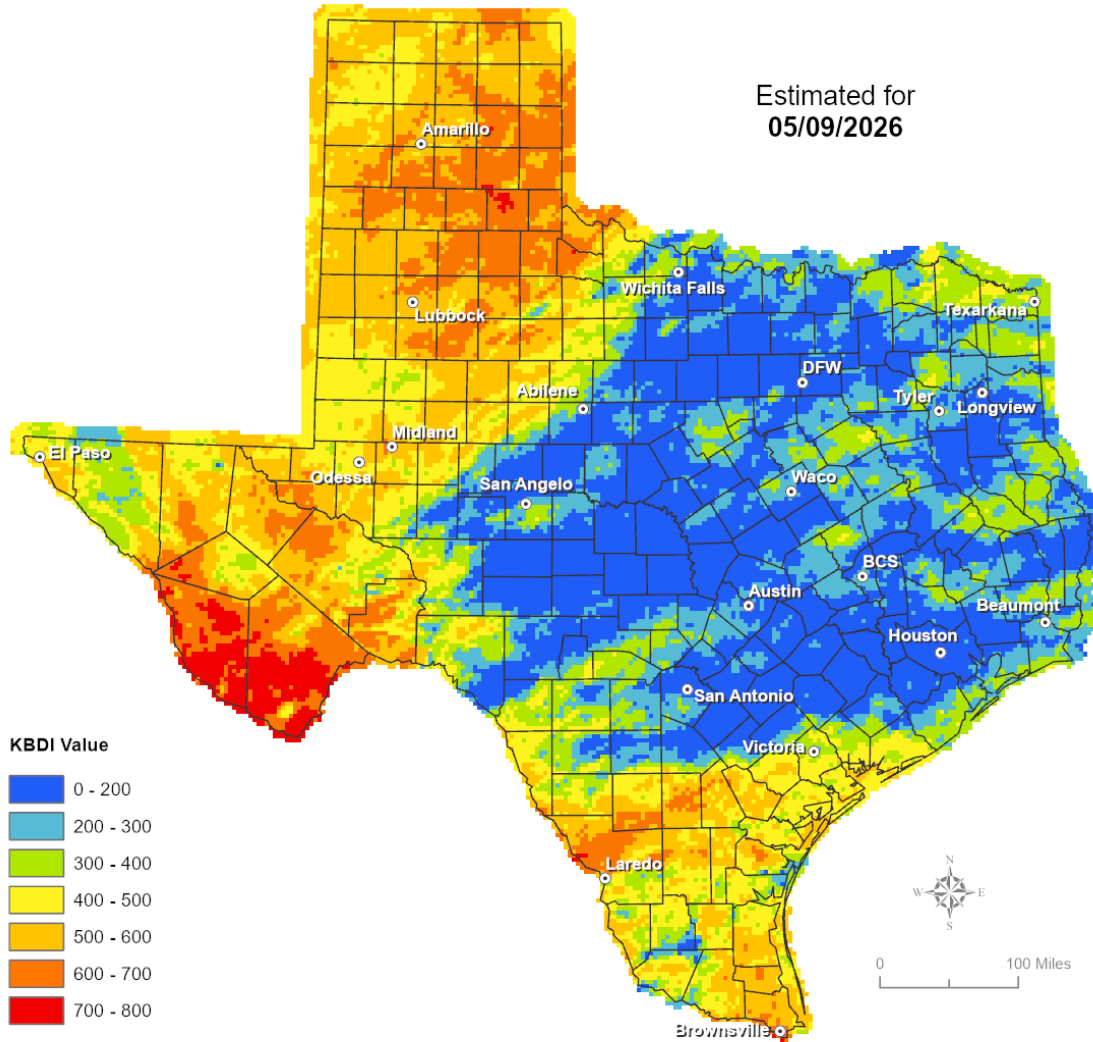

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

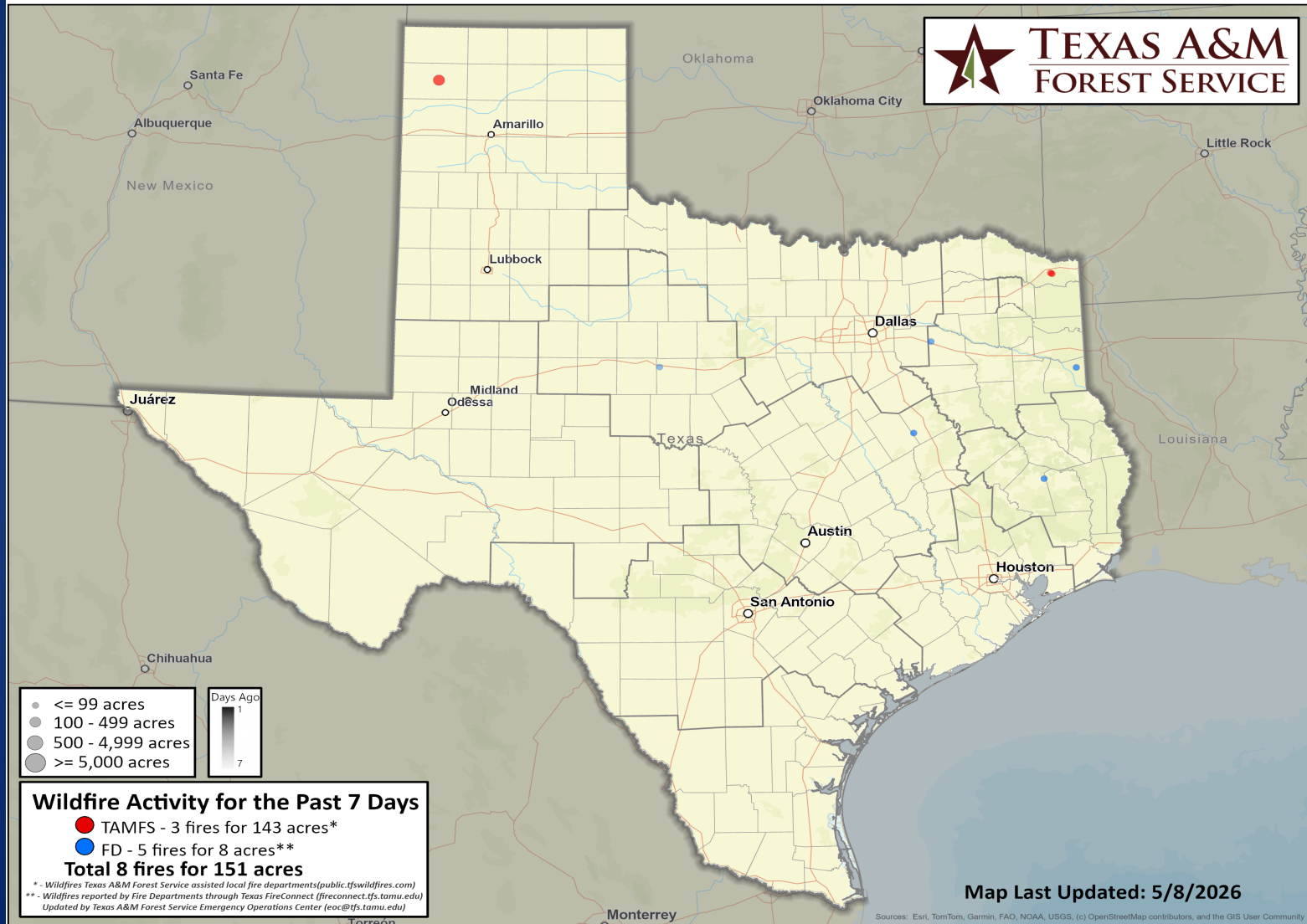
