STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On May 16, Governor Greg Abbott announced that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has approved a request from the State of Texas for a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Hunggate Fire in Randall County, which has threatened and damaged homes and infrastructure in the Texas Panhandle and forced local evacuations.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.
3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 1 (Includes DDs 1, 2, and 7)

DD 1 – Amarillo (Includes Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler Counties): Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 1 activated to Level II – Escalated Response Conditions on May 15.

Randall County: The Hunggate Fire has burned approximately [34,131 acres](#) and is 95% contained with seven structures lost. There have been approximately 310 evacuations. A temporary shelter has been established at the Cole Community Center in Canyon. The Chocolate Chip Fire has been merged with the Hunggate Fire.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife):

[On May 18, AgriLife personnel worked with United States Department of Agriculture \(USDA\) Farm Services Agency \(FSA\) and Natural Resources Conservation Service \(NRCS\) to distribute surveys to affected landowners to determine fence line, hay, and other agricultural losses in the burn scar of the Hunggate Fire. Aerial imagery will be used to better estimate fence line losses on larger properties not accessible by vehicles. No livestock losses were reported.](#)

Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) agents and County Extension Strike Team (ST) members remain on standby to support animal response operations, as well as other fire response and recovery efforts, as requested. As of May 16, 24 DAR Specialists and three Area Chiefs are on standby to support wildfire response efforts. An AgriLife representative at DDEOC 1 in Amarillo, along with a DAR Specialist, is supporting the Incident Management Team (IMT) in Amarillo. As of May 16, there have been two requests for damage assessments.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

The Texas A&M Forest Service has pre-positioned heavy equipment, engines, and aircraft across regions impacted by elevated fire weather conditions. Out-of-State personnel and equipment are integrated with TAMFS in aviation support, field operations and other support roles to augment State resources for a safe and effective response. In total, TAMFS has 20 personnel committed to the Hunggate FMAG Wildfire.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

On May 15, TxDOT reported temporary road closures on Interstate Highway (IH) 27 and United States Highway (US) 87 in Randall County. As of May 16, there were no state-maintained roadways closed due to wildfires. TxDOT continues their mission of maintaining safe roadways for the traveling public during adverse conditions such as wildfires. TxDOT Amarillo is providing fuel support on the Hunggate Fire. TxDOT Emergency Management continues to support the State Operations Center (SOC).

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS): Texas Emergency Medical

Task Force (EMTF):

On May 15, DSHS was notified that the Hunggate Fire had met the criteria for a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG). DSHS demobilized Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF) resources from the 26-0001 Wildfire Incident and reassigned them to support the Hunggate Fire. The DSHS State Medical Operations Center (SMOC) remains at limited activation and continues to support response operations.

On May 15, the EMTF State Coordinating Office (SCO) and Medical Incident Support Team (MIST) were assigned to provide remote support to the State Operations Center (SOC). On May 17, Wildland Fire Support (WLFS) Teams 13 and 15, along with the Rapid Extraction Module (REM), were released from the Hunggate Fire in Randall County. WLFS Team 18 has been activated to the Hunggate Fire in Randall County.
