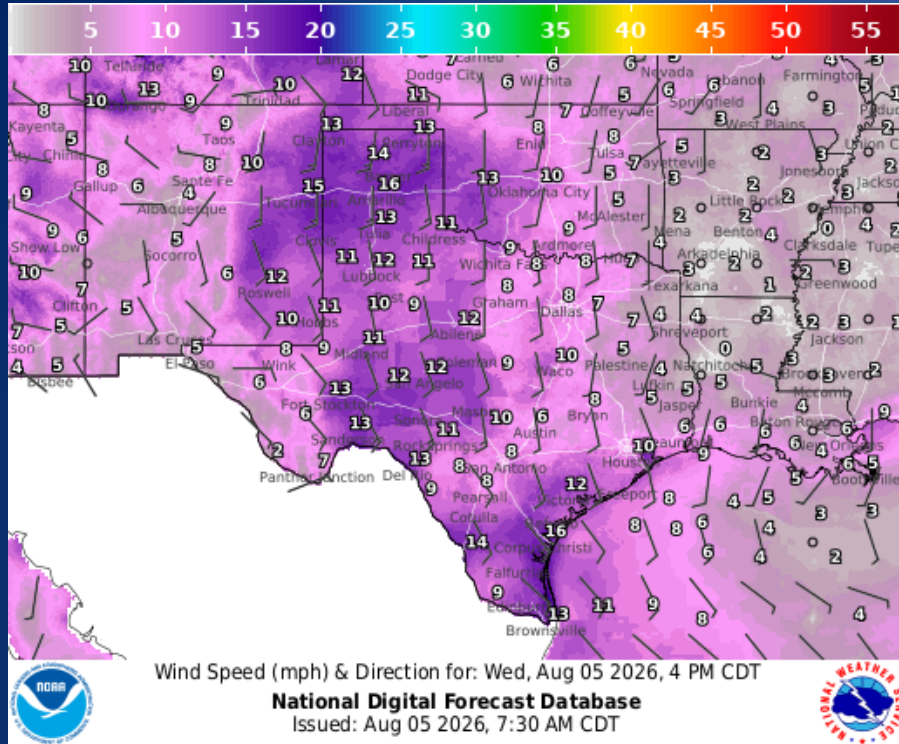

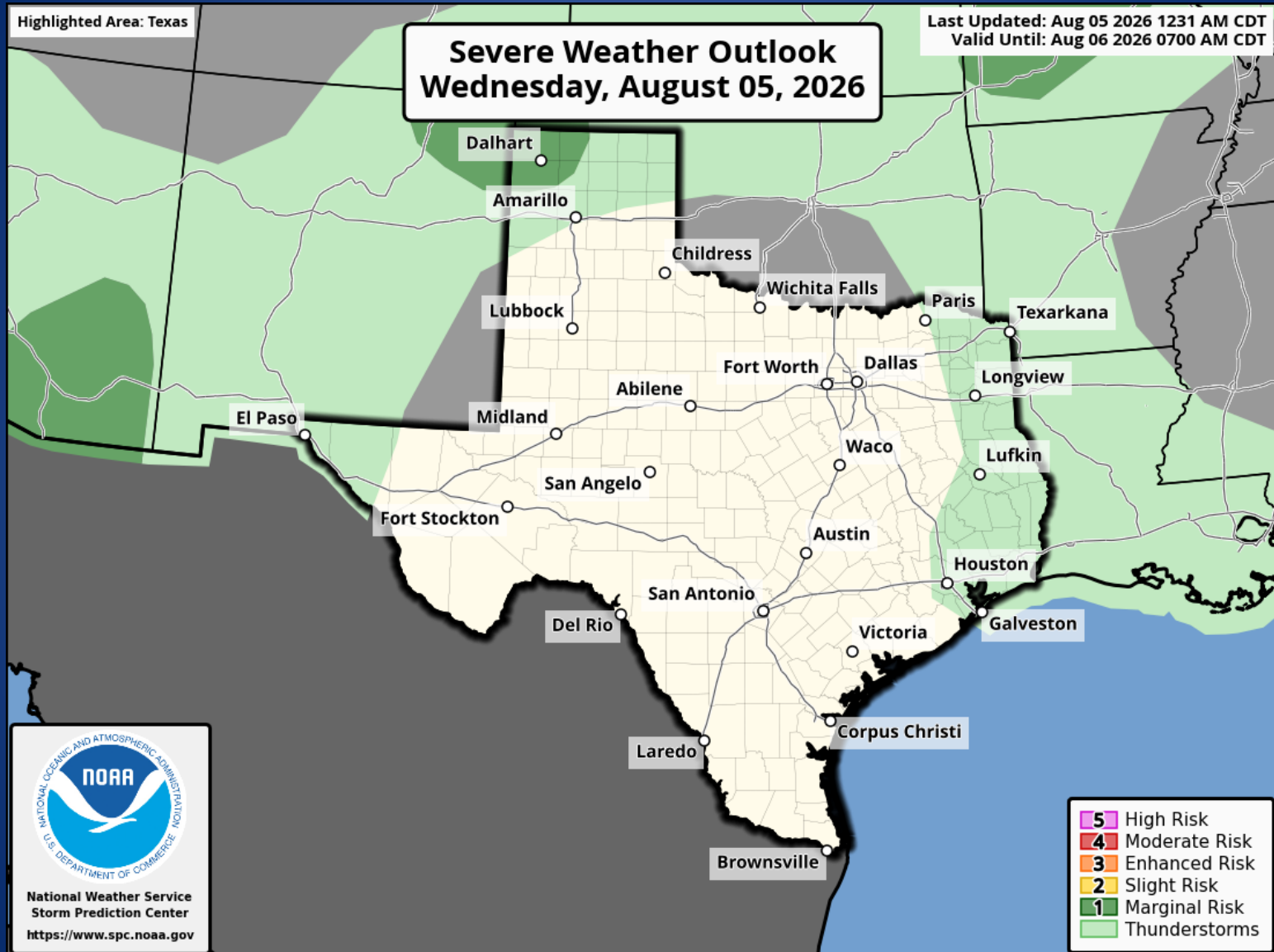

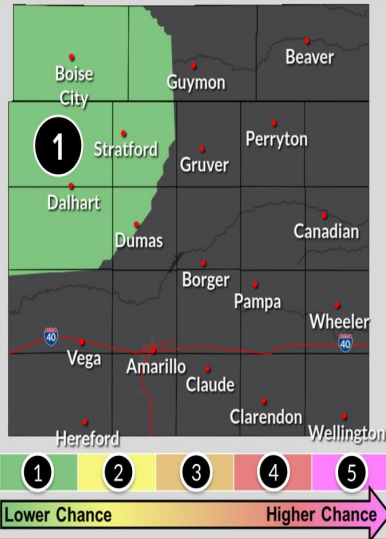

Today: Moderate to Major Heat Risk

Practice Heat Safety to Prevent Heat-Related Illnesses



Key Messages

- High temperatures ranging from 95-104°F this afternoon
- Peak heat indices ranging from 106-113°F
- **Moderate** (level 2 of 4) Heat Risk to **Major** (level 3 of 4) Heat Risk

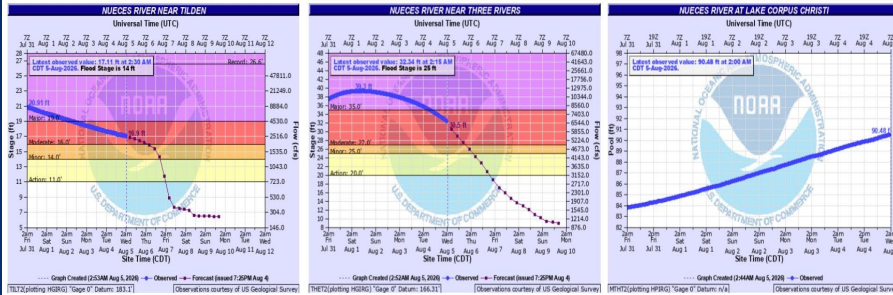

Storms out west of the Continental Divide



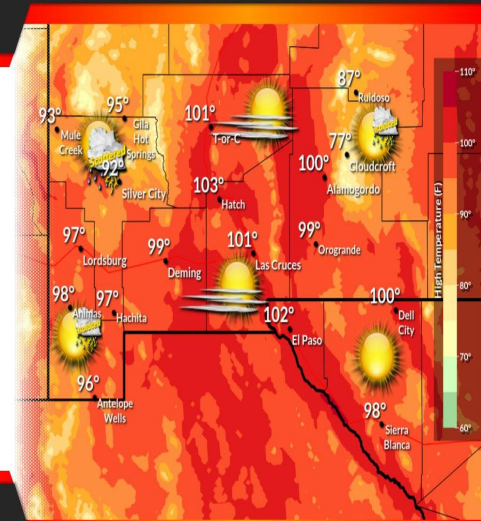
Lowland temperatures range from 97-105°F

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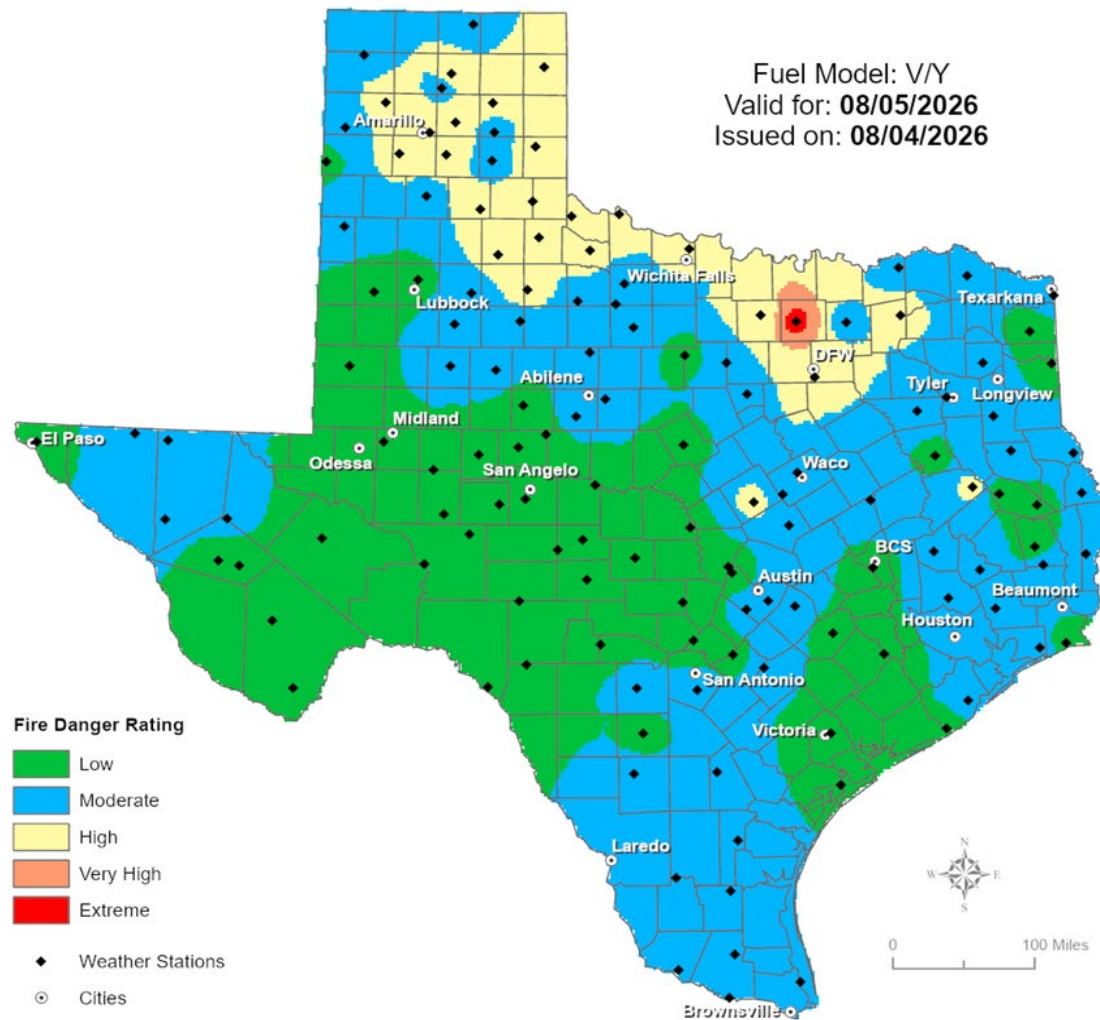

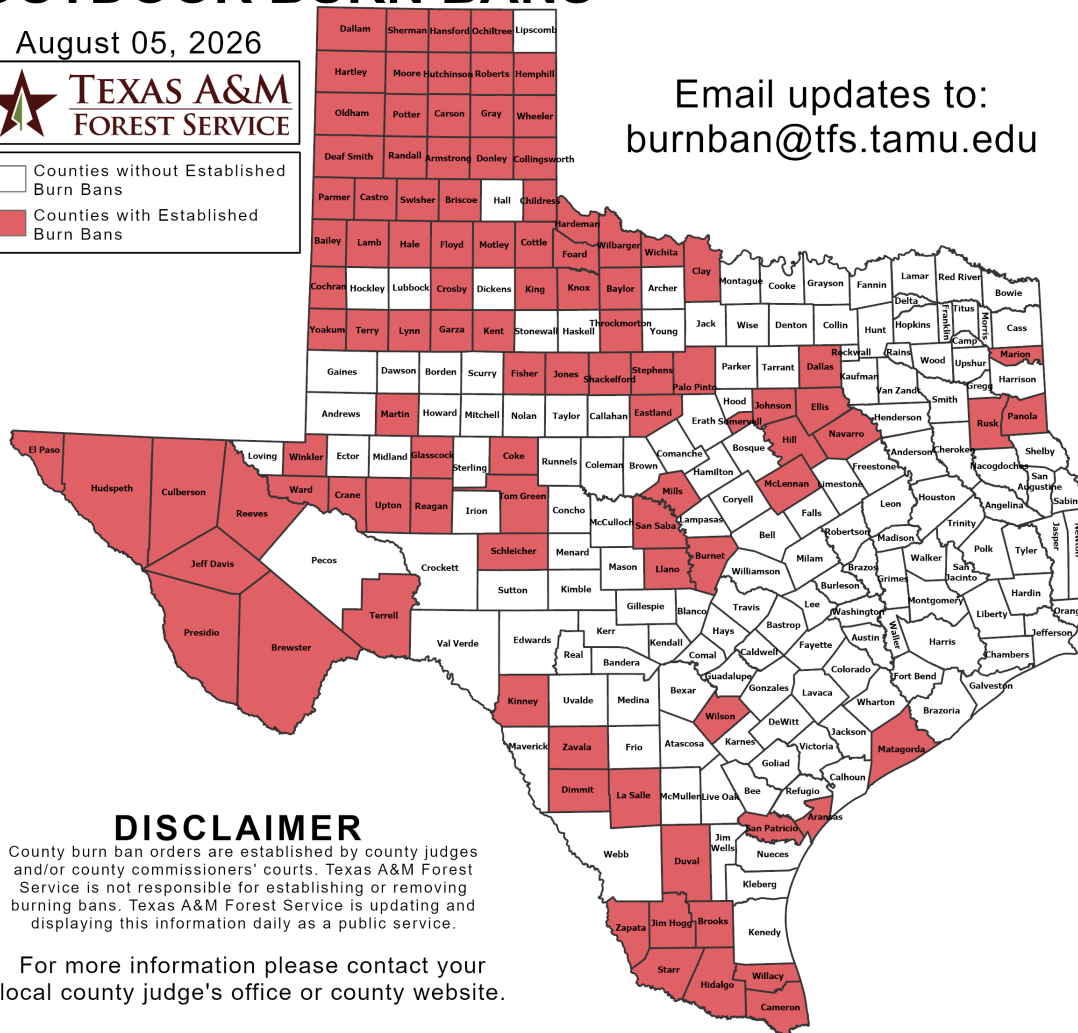

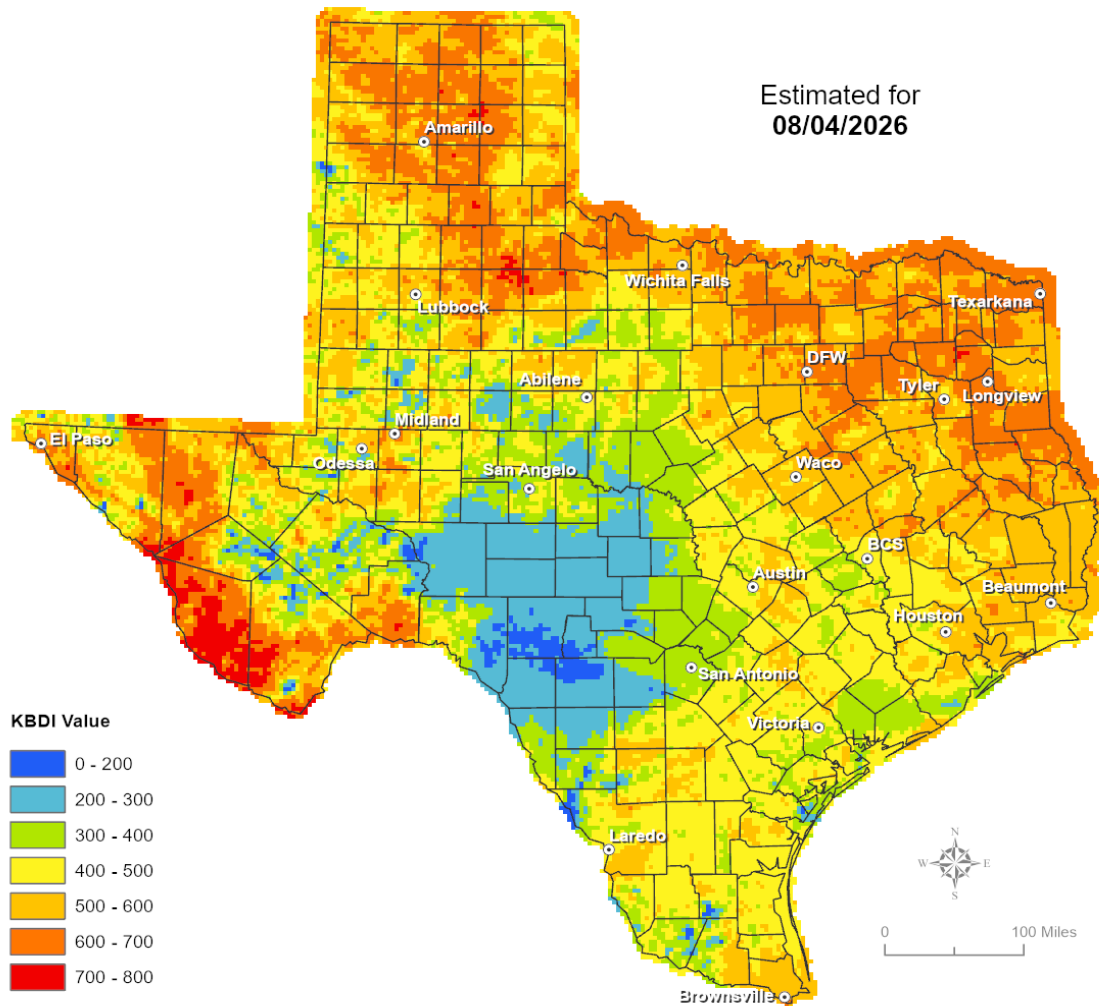

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

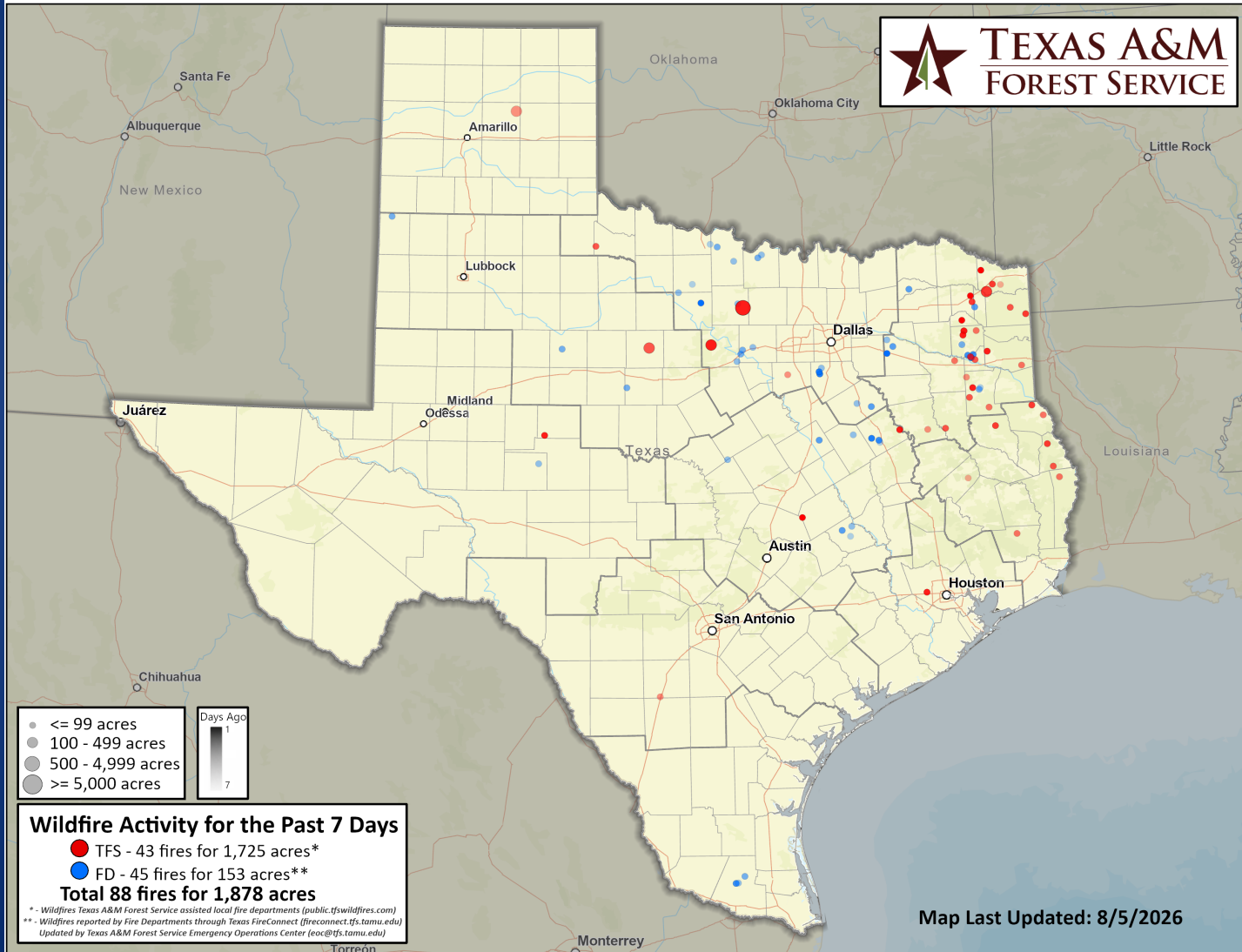

Report of 800 fires (+8) and 109,373 (+562) acres have been burned this year. There are 100 (+7) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 206 (+4) counties with an average over 400.
