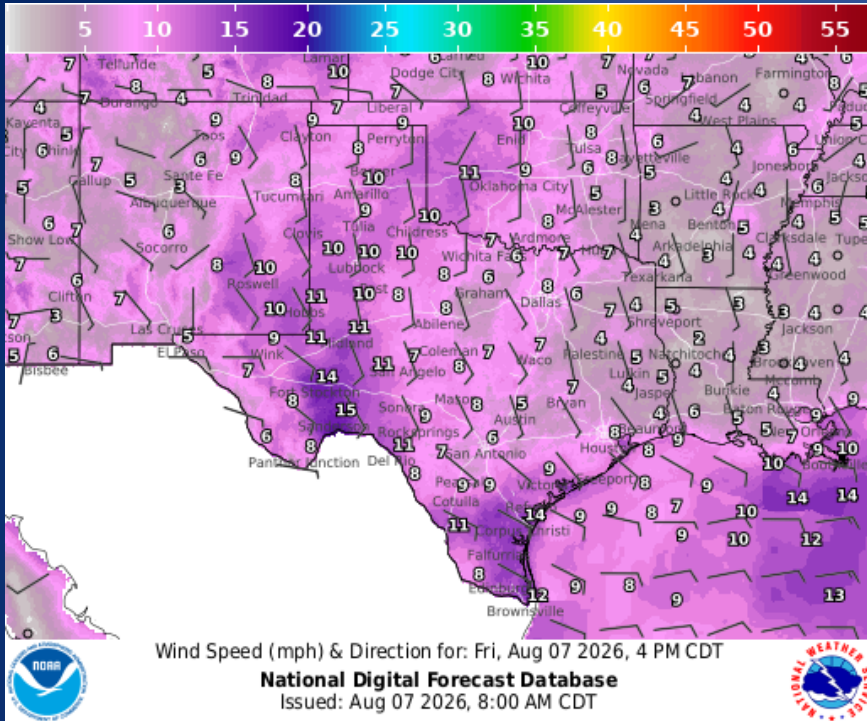

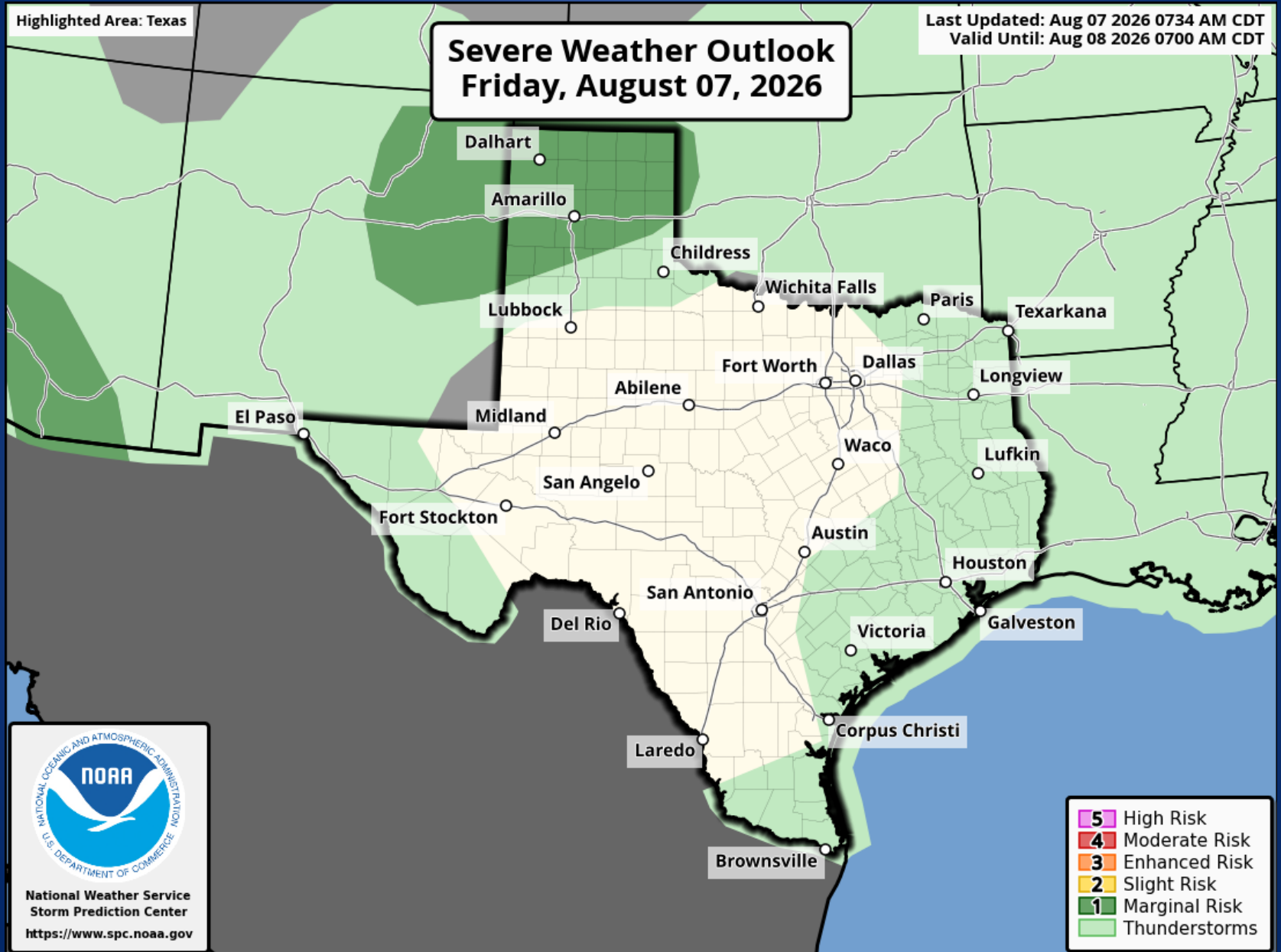


Wind Speeds

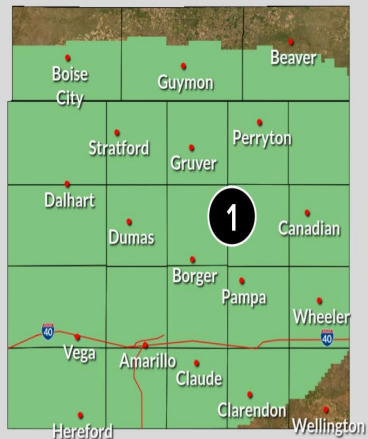

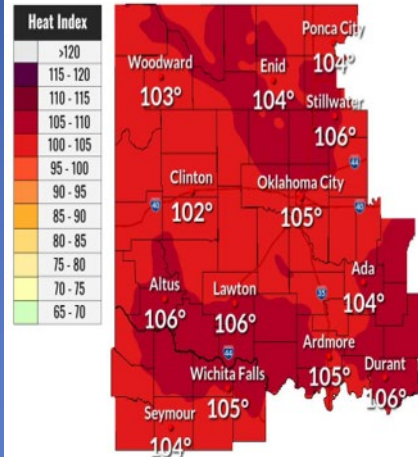

- High temperatures ranging from 95-105°F this afternoon
- Peak heat indices ranging from 105-111°F
- **Moderate** (level 2 of 4) Heat Risk

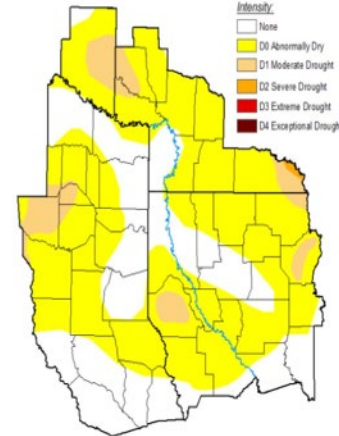

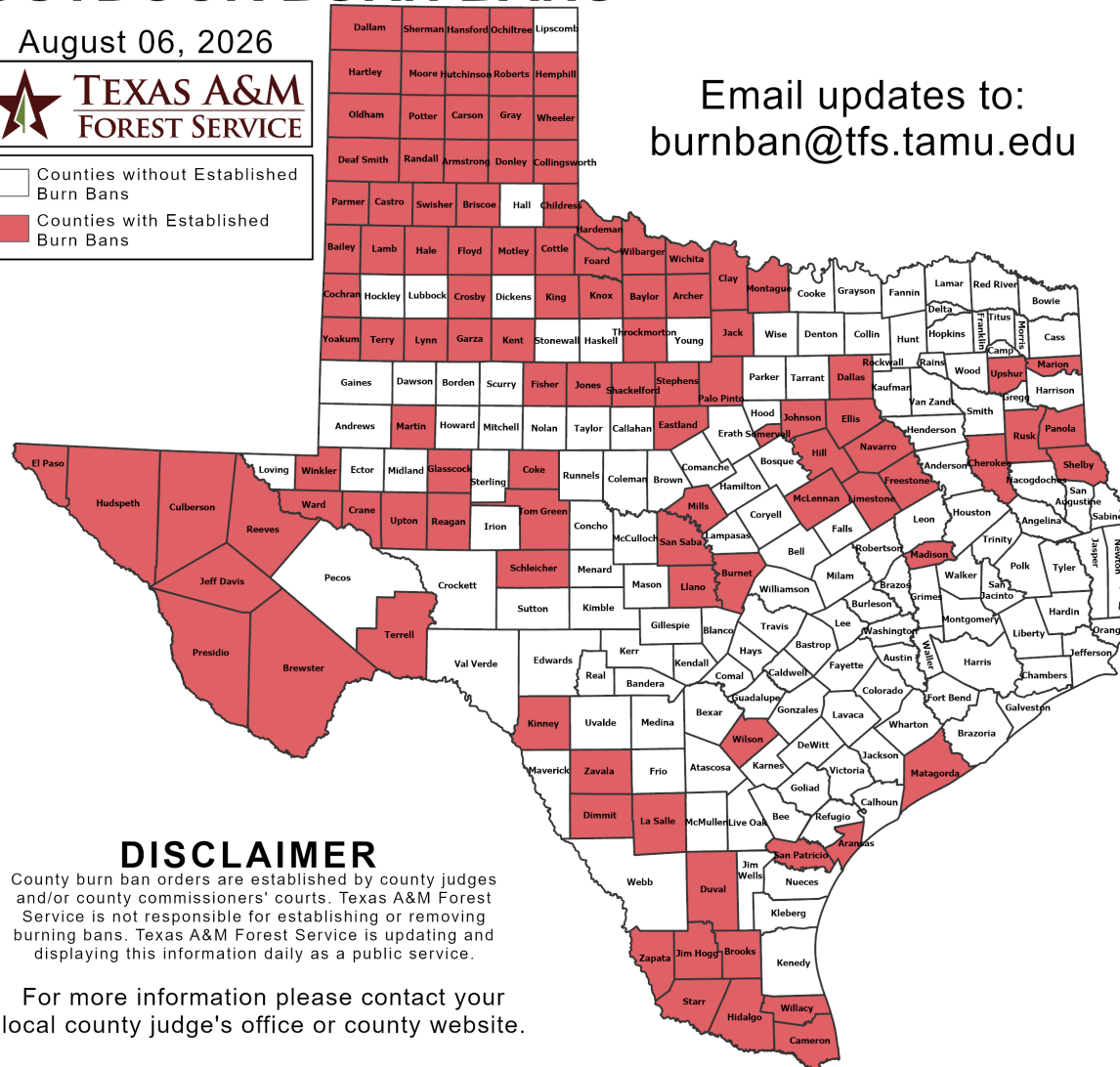

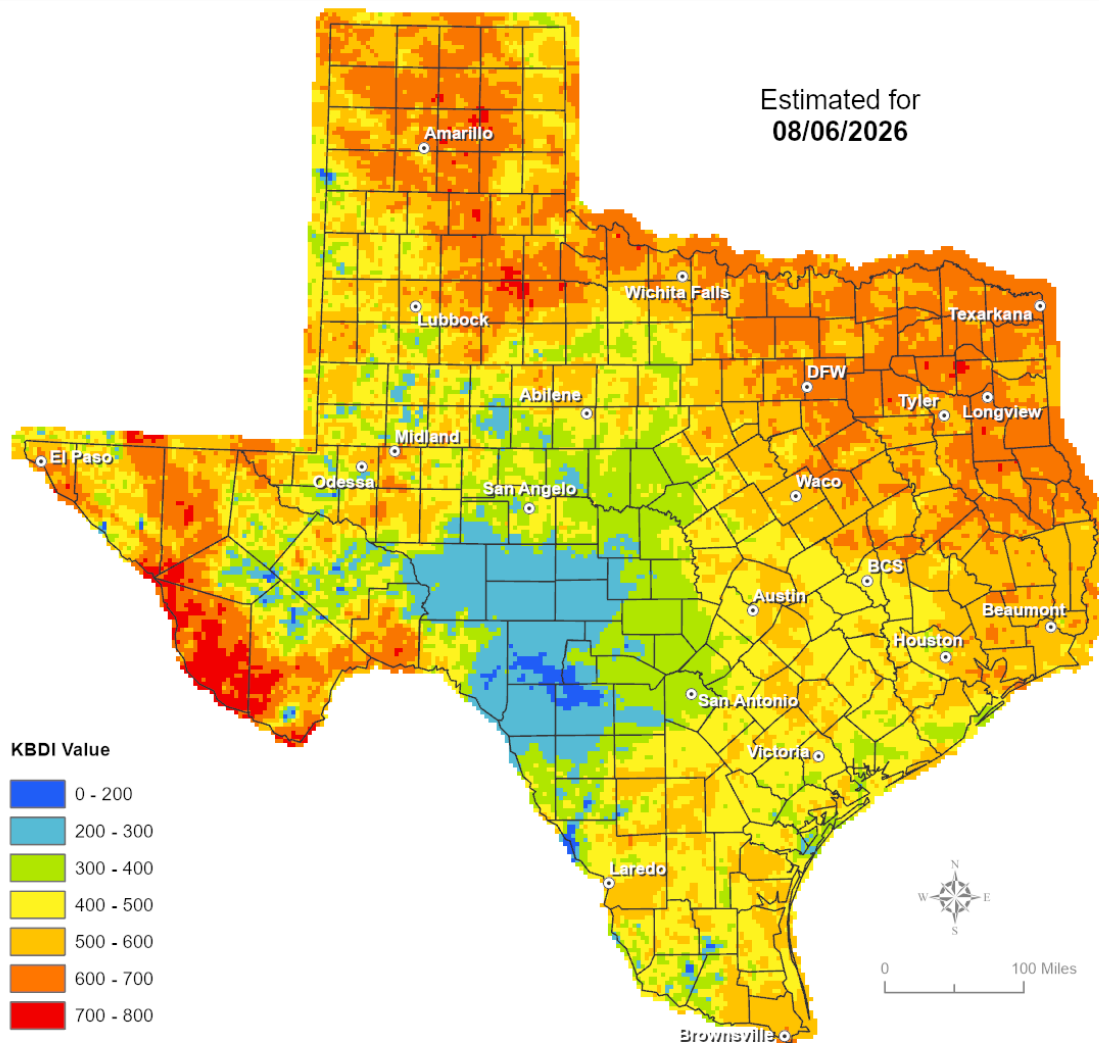

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

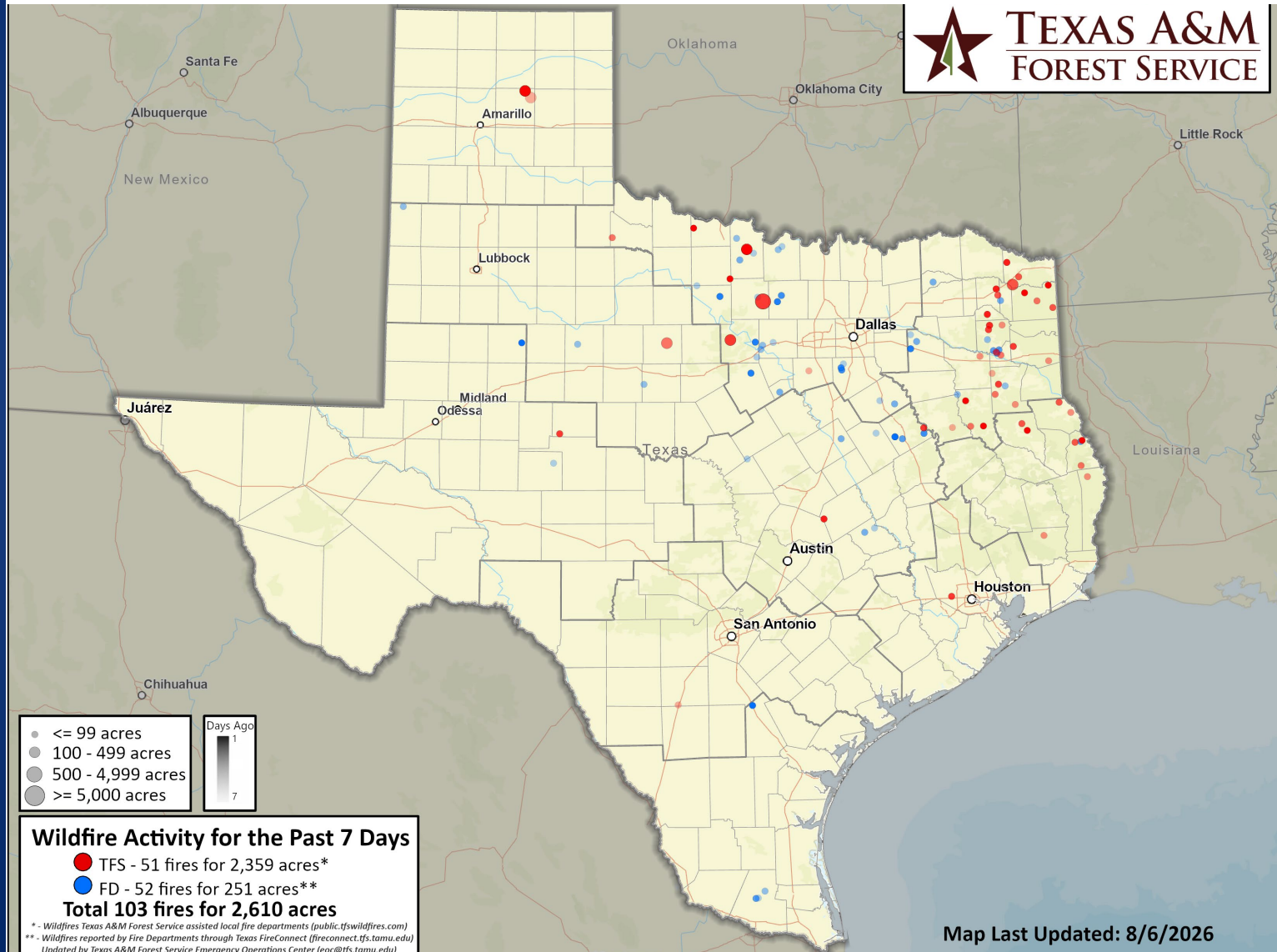

Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Report of 818 fires (+10) and 110,201 (+156) acres have been burned this year. There are 109 (+4) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 217 (+6) counties with an average over 400.
