

# 5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status



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Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



**Moderate to major flooding is ongoing or forecast along the MS River.**

- **Osceola, AR will continue in major flood stage through the end of the week with mostly agricultural impacts.**
- **Near Baton Rouge, LA a crest is expected late this week in major flood, similar to the crest in March of 2018. Shipping and industrial activities are significantly affected.**

**The Atchafalaya River at Morgan City will hover around moderate flood throughout this week. Some flooding impacts to buildings possible.**

**The Trinity River at Liberty is at moderate flood stage, with roads leading to subdivisions possibly flooding.**



Purple	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Very Rare – Once Every 5-10 Years</b></p> <p>Safety: Property Damage Unavoidable, Immediate Action to Save Life will be Needed Impact Potential: Typically Results in Long-Lived Widespread Major Disruption to Daily Life</p>	<p>Severe: High Risk from SPC Flooding: Major flooding expected over a widespread area (including urban locations) Tropical: A Major Hurricane (Cat3 or greater) expected to move towards or near any coastline Fire: Large area of critical conditions for 2 or more days, Warnings for 3 or more days, Long term (months) of severe to extreme drought</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A Category 4 hurricane is headed towards the SE LA; major storm surge, flooding and damaging winds anticipated to begin tomorrow</li> <li>Widespread severe storms expected, tornado outbreak probable with long-lived, very widespread and particularly intense storms</li> </ul>
