

5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status



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Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



Moderate to major flooding is ongoing or forecast along the MS River.

- **Osceola, AR will continue in major flood stage through tomorrow w/ mostly agricultural impacts.**
- **Near Baton Rouge, LA a crest is expected late this week in major flood. Shipping and industrial activities significantly affected.**
- **The Bonnet Carré Floodway continues to operate and reduce flow at New Orleans, LA cresting at the 17.0ft flood stage tomorrow and staying near this level for the next 1 ½ weeks. Impacts to navigation. A 20 ft project levee protects the city.**

The Atchafalaya River at Morgan City, LA will maintain moderate flood stage this week. Some flooding of buildings possible.

The Trinity River at Liberty, TX will maintain moderate flood stage this week, with roads leading to subdivisions possibly flooding.




Isolated severe storms and heavy rain/flash flooding possible in SE AR/NE LA.





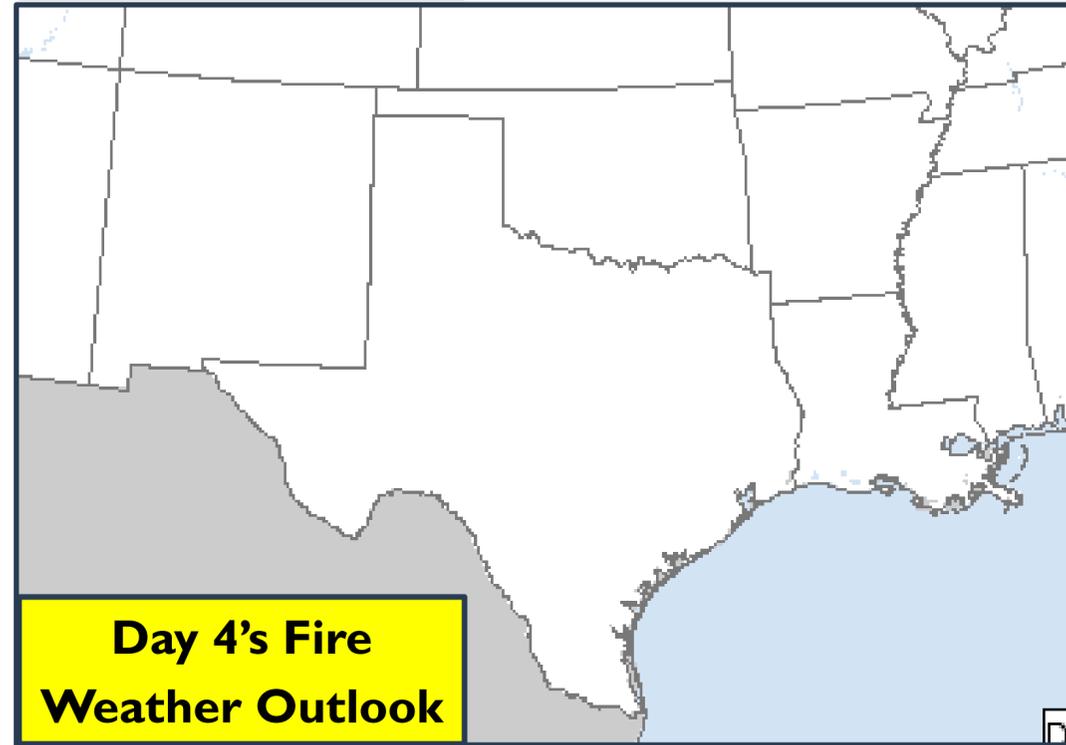




Excessive Rainfall Outlook



Fire Weather Outlooks



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








